IT took a radio singer to finally make a face at the famous claque of the Metropolitan Opera House. It was none other than the fair Helen Jepson, who made her debut there a few days ago. She chose to ride into the Metropolitan on her own laurels, so the group of gentlemen who applaud at so much a volley of thunderous hand-clapping were not on this payroll.

But Paul Whiteman and his band showed up and cheered themselves hoarse for the young soprano, who drew remarkable notices despite her failure to hire the professional praisers for her debut.

Mention of the opera claque of handclappers brings to the spotlight the increasing evil of the radio claque. Although not always paid, it nevertheless wields a sinister influence in the sponsored field. One program is reputed to maintain a paid claque, just to make sure that laughs are forthcoming. This group of people, placed up front near the microphone, guffaw with remarkable celerity at every joke, stupid though it may be. That starts the audience off properly. Then there is the sponsor who asks his audience to take part in the program by laughing at the proper time. Applause cards have thus come into being, although most of the producers have abandoned the practice.

Many sponsors are getting away from the large studio audiences because they believe that the noisy applause is offensive to the listeners for whom the program is intended.

The Vallee, Whiteman, Penner, and other programs which once boasted large audiences at the studios have purposely moved into smaller quarters so that the audiences is subordinated to its proper place. Lawrence Tibbett, accustomed to singing to an audience, has banned studio audiences because he says he wants to sing for the big audience out in the country. Frank Black, playing on "the pause that refreshes on the air," limits applause to the middle and end of the program. No applause is allowed on the Sigmund Romberg program, and Phil Spitalny's "Hour of Charm" permits applause only at the conclusion of the show.

Too many of the comics have been labeled "fun in the studio" and have been mugging and cutting up for those present, with no regard for the folks who see nothing and only hear rounds of applause for something they cannot understand.

IN the movies, when the star is supposed to jump off the cliff, often a double takes the leap. In the theatre the nocturne that the heroine plays for the man she loves often issues from an instrument played by a professional pianist backstage.

Radio also has its production complications—and its doubles. A single role is frequently played by two persons.

On Maxwell House's Showboat hour, one of National Broadcasting Company's most popular programs, Mary Lou, the lush heroine, is Muriel Wilson when she sings, Rosaline Greene when she speaks.

When Palmolive presented an air version of George Gershwin's "Girl Crazy," Peggy Allenby did all the talking for the star, Gladys Swarthout, soprano.

Most radio doubles substitute in the spoken lines for singers, who are the stars. In the Palmolive show the situation is reversed. John Barclay, the actor hero of the program, handles the dramatics but leaves the singing to a double—Theodore Webb, a baritone.

Radio men give four reasons for the use of doubles. 1. Many operatic singers are foreign and speak English with accents. 2. Most singers are not accustomed to speaking parts. 3. Singers are grouped with the orchestra and have microphones set at singing levels, while actors are grouped around another microphone, some distance away. If the singer spoke his lines he would have to run from one "mike" to another. 4. It saves rehearsal time.

The added expense for doubles is not a serious problem. In a show that costs from \$5,000 to \$10,000 the fee to the singing star ranges from \$1,000 to \$5,000 a broadcast. The actor-double receives from \$35 to \$50.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP



• • • Recently we told you about a saxophone player of Rudy Vallee's who is a "spitting image" of Fred Waring. Well, believe it or not, Rudy last week used a fellow who looked for all the world like a "faminized Alec Woolcott," in the words of Tom Howard. The gentleman who caused Tom to polish up his specs is Art Evans, who has worked as arranger for Vallee for years but is now working into the band publicly as Rudy's assistant conductor.

• • • They're never too old to write fan mail. The KFRC librarian discovered this the other day when a letter, mailed in Oakland and written in virtually illegible pencil scrawling, arrived from an 83-year-old radio fan. His favorite artist, so far as could be determined, is Haywire Mac, and his favorite song, "Little Gray Home in the West." The aged dial spinner also apologizes for the writing and explains that he is 83 years old, never attended school, never used tooth powder or paste, has taken a bath in a tub only once, never wore glasses, and has practically all his teeth.

• • • Lizbeth Baird, who recently started a series of programs over KGGC, looms as one of the most promising air finds of this year. Although a soprano, she possesses a rare quality of voice that is certainly attracting the attention of the most hardened radio listener. She is accompanied on her programs by a large orchestra and chorus through the medium of the new "blend" system, recently developed by KGGC.

• • • Ray Lewis, KQW sportscaster, who describes all of the home games on Stanford's basketball schedule, at one time was a swimming instructor at the University of California. He also did considerable little theatre work at the university.

• • • KGB, the Don Lee outlet in San Diego, scooped the Pacific Coast on the important story of Ford's decision to come into the California-Pacific-International Exposition when Elwood Bailey, Public Relations Chief of the Exposition, was interviewed by Announcer Art Linkletter on the popular "To the Ladies" program Friday morning. Mr. Bailey made the official announcement that Henry Ford would spend \$2,000,000 here, during the interview which took place several hours before the afternoon papers carried banner lines to the same effect.

• • • Jane Williams of the "Hollywood Hotel" program has lost thirty pounds by following a strict diet.

• • • Leon Krupp, crooner and program arranger, has resigned from the staff of KFOX to take a position with a station in Fort Worth, Texas, to which he was attached in a similar capacity before coming to California.

• • • Arnold Maguire, chief comedy writer for KFRC, has perhaps the most pretentious humor library of any writer on the Pacific Coast. Filed away in the archives of his fun collection are more than ten thousand gags, jokes, anecdotes and stories, all classified as to subject. The library is the result of many years of tedious work in collecting and classifying bits of humor from every conceivable source. One of his listeners, a traveling salesman, makes it a point to send Maguire a weekly list of gags at random during his trips around the country. The sender is anonymous, but every week from a different city on the Pacific Coast, comes the envelopes with the stories enclosed. It is always addressed to Adhesive Pontoon, KFRC's funny man, San Francisco.

• • • Edwin C. Hill is the hardest working man in radio. . . . He makes seven regular appearances per week before CBS mikes, writes a daily syndicated column, voices daily for Metrotone News, and writes articles for periodicals. . . . He hopes to retire to the Maine woods, find an isolated mountain stream and carry on indefinitely and undisturbed as a disciple of Isaac Walton.

• • • The reporters can't baffle Gracie Allen. Gracie is now broadcasting before studio audiences in Los Angeles. Following a recent program, a reporter approached her.

"Miss Allen," quoth he, "I understand you started your career singing in movie houses after school: then went into vaudeville as an Irish colleen; then did dancing acts and a series of dramatic sketches. Next you met George Burns and did a vaudeville act together. Then you went into movie shorts, then radio, and afterwards made feature pictures. Now you are broadcasting in front of an audience. Well, what have you got to say?"

To which Gracie, with a nonchalant flick of her hand, gave answer: "Well, I can't understand you either. I do the best I can and I don't know why I can't hold a job. Don't you think so?"

• • • Russ Johnston, heard as night-time announcer at KGFJ these days, is penning the Stratosphere Murder Mystery for a series of thirteen fifteen-minute transcriptions in Hollywood for Transco.

• • • A lady telephoned station WABC during the recent heavy snowstorm, and, in accents peremptory, demanded: "I want you people to broadcast at regular periods while this snow is on the ground that we shouldn't forget to throw food out to the wild birds."

• • • William Gleason has been named sales manager of the Oakland studios of KTAB. He has long been associated with radio activities on the Pacific Coast, having been manager of a number of important stations in the West.

• • • Marshall Sohl, KHJ tenor, who sang the part of "Faust" on one of the "Raymond Paige Presents" programs broadcast over KHJ each Sunday night, first sang the rôle when he was with the Seattle Civic Opera Company several years ago.

• • • When a page entered Columbia's No. 1 studio during a rehearsal the other day and announced "A young lady wishes to see Mr. Pearson in the reception room," Bill Pearson, control operator, Ted Pearson, announcer, and Walt Pearson, sound effects director, all rushed out. . . . The young lady told them she was working her way through college by selling magazine subscriptions, and took three orders.

• • • Bob Trout, for many years CBS presidential announcer in Washington, has joined the announcers staff of WABC. He was brought to New York because of his excellent work as "presidential announcer" in Washington at WJSV.

• • • KNX's famed In-Laws skit, on the air five nights a week, is being disked at Freeman Lang's so it can be syndicated to eastern stations by the sponsors.

• • • That word "chorus," which meets every singer as he reads music at the microphone, always carries Frank Parker, the tenor, back to the poverty-stricken days when he was an obscure chorus boy in the "Greenwich Village Follies." Parker hadn't been hired as a singer but when both the leading man and the understudy took sick, he was hustled into the breach by the leading woman who happened to know the youngster really had a voice!

• • • Every now and then a confused fan wonders in writing to the Columbia network whether baritone Jerry Cooper is film star Gary Cooper masquerading as a radio troubadour. No relation at all, but it's odd to note that both are the same height, have hair of identical coloring and are expert horsemen.

• • • Johnny O'Brien and Manuel Tapia, NBC stars, say that the best photographs they ever had are those which the San Quentin photographer made of them New Year's Day when they entertained the prisoners.

• • • According to a recent survey made by a nationally known advertising agency, the Al. Pearce Gang had 65 per cent of the afternoon listening audience on the coast.

• • • Bill Kuser, popular KFRC announcer, has been hospital-harbored for the past few days after a delicate operation on his nose. Bill says it was done to improve his speaking voice, although his fans wonder how this is possible. His studio fans are also wondering, but mostly on how he found the time to get away from his new car, which, incidentally, is his thirty-ninth.

• • • Dr. Henry Kei Lui, who conducts KECA's Chinese lessons, reports that his own astonishment, Americans have a great facility for the Oriental language. His radio class of something like five hundred persons in all walks of life, mostly business men who hope to tap China's markets, now knows at least one hundred Mandarin words and their written symbols, and it takes only four hundred, says Dr. Lui, to get along beautifully in the language of Confucius.

• • • Snow is no novelty now to Don Mario, Spanish tenor of the NBC Penthouse Serenade, but he'll never forget the day soon after his arrival in the United States when he first saw snow fall. He was scrimmaging in football at Hebron Academy in Maine when the flakes began coming down. He became so excited he dropped the ball and shouted, "Look, it's raining white!" He says he never lived down that "white rain" phrase there.

• • • Jerry Cooper, young CBS baritone, blushed when a lady wrote that she'd like to hug him. But investigation revealed that the letter addressed to "J. Cooper," was intended instead for Jackie Cooper, child star of the silver screen.

NEWS *and* COMMENT

One Man's Family, popular radio dramatic classic of everyday life in a typical American family, will come to listeners from coast to coast under the sponsorship of the makers of Chase and Sanborn Tender Leaf Tea, beginning April 3.

Now on the air as a sustaining feature of the National Broadcasting Company and a favorite with listeners for nearly three years, One Man's Family will be heard over a nation-wide NBC network for half an hour each Wednesday night at 5 p. m., under the new sponsorship.

Written by Carlton E. Morse, talented young radio dramatist, and presented by a cast of veteran microphone performers, including Anthony J. Smythe, Minetta Ellen, Kathleen Wilson, Michael Raffetto, Bernice Berwin, Page Gilman and Winifred Wolfe, One Man's Family tells the whimsical, human story of the Barbours and their children.

The broadcasts originated on the Pacific Coast nearly three years ago and attracted an immediate following. A year and a half ago the series was extended to eastern networks, where its western success was repeated.

Pending the inauguration of the sponsored series, One Man's Family is now being heard over an NBC transcontinental network each Sunday at 7:30 p. m., Pacific standard time, until March 31, as an NBC sustaining program.

Mary Pickford is not renewing her contract for further radio broadcasts because she is writing a novel for immediate publication, in addition to the preparing of a play for possible fall production. This statement was issued from Hollywood by the star, following the announcement that she is off the air at the close of her current agreement sponsored by Royal Desserts. Although approached for a continuation of her contract through the summer months, Miss Pickford refused because of the press of other work.

"My radio contract originally called for thirteen broadcasts," the star explained, "and I consented to undertake thirteen more, which keeps me on the air until April. I cannot consider further extensions, however, because of prior literary contracts, and I will not be available for further radio work before fall."

KJBS has been granted a license for extension of time, effective immediately, which permits the station to come on the air nightly at 10 o'clock and continuing throughout the following day until sundown. With this additional period at its disposal, KJBS has billed the two-hour spot, from 10 p. m. to midnight, as the Nightcap Revue.

The former schedule was from midnight

until the following sunset. During the summer months, sunset will be later than now, allowing the transmitter about twenty-two hours of broadcasting per day.

Charley Hamp, radio's original "one-man show" and one of the air's most popular entertainers, is billed to open a 39-week engagement over KNX, the "Voice of Hollywood," beginning in February.

Hamp's program, according to Van Newkirk, program manager of KNX, will be a morning show running fifteen minutes on Tuesdays and Thursdays, with Fels Naphtha as his sponsor.

One of radio's most versatile entertainers, Hamp also is one of the oldest on the air, in point of microphone service. His act consists of cheery songs, light patter, and a running undercurrent of characteristic piano music that is a definite contrast to the conventional type of radio program.

Anson Weeks and his orchestra, who were recently brought to the Embassy Room of the Hotel St. Francis for a limited engagement, have done some tall traveling since the beginning of their tour. They have played engagements in Galveston, Texas; in Chicago, Boston, Cleveland, and in New York City the Waldorf-Astoria.

Interesting items concerning Anson Weeks' orchestra are listed herewith:

Anson has only four men in the band who have not been with him four years or more.

The two men in the orchestra are Neely Plumb, age twenty-two, first saxophone, graduate of Georgia Tech; the band's only southerner. Al Burton, age twenty-four, first violin, graduate of De Paux University, Chicago; one of the finest dance violinists in the country; even if he does wear a moustache.

Abbey Brown (drums), Earl Morgan (saxophone), and Peter Fyelling (trumpet and assistant leader) have been with Anson for ten years.

Anson's two new vocalists, Kay St. Germain and Big Ben Gage, are creating a sensation wherever they appear. Their double numbers are cinch show stoppers.

Frankie Saputo, the "Man on the Flying Trapeze," contends to be as clever as ever, and tremendously popular.

Fred Williams' tenor voice receives plenty of splendid response.

The trio, Earl Morgan, Pete Fyelling and Frank Hubbell, is still there to gather its share of the applause and round out an orchestra with plenty of vocal entertainments.

In the last six months Anson has made over twenty-three records for the Brunswick record corporation.

Where most bands have one or two arrangers, Anson is fortunate in having five, making the band fuller and more versatile. Anson and Pete Fyelling (trumpet) and Neely Plumb (saxophone) make the "hot" and "swing" tunes, while Frank Hubbell (trumpet) and Billy O'Bryant (piano) go in for the sweet and exotic numbers. Anson's and Pete's arrangements established the style for the band, which has prevailed throughout their career.

Tom Coakley, of the Palace Hotel Coakleys, heard over NBC, has uncovered a young composer in his orchestra who is well on his way toward making a bid for top honors with the sensational Pinkie Tomlin, composer of "The Object of My Affections." Coakley's discovery is Dudley Nix, vocalist, with this popular radio dance band and the writer of both the music and lyrics of a new hit tune, "So Lovely and Sweet."

With the song still on the press, music stores have placed advance orders for thousands of copies of this tune that has been so enthusiastically received by all who have heard it since it was recently introduced by Tom Coakley and his orchestra.

This is Nix's first published song, and it is predicted in music circles that the sensational success of this one number will bring him national recognition as a composer. However, Nix is hard at work on more compositions, and already has two more numbers to follow "So Lovely and So Sweet."

After a month as the first woman staff announcer at the National Broadcasting Company, Elsie Janis is glad to report that she still hasn't "pressed the wrong button that might turn the networks into a nut works."

Anyway, that's what the famous war-time entertainer said in a broadcast from the Radio City studios in which she commented on "topics of interest." Besides discussing her own status, Miss Janis had a thing or two to say about some other well-known folk.

"I see Will Rogers has been to Washington again," she said. "Every time Will gets a little shy on jokes he goes to Washington and listens to the Senators talking seriously."

As to Fred Allen, the Town Hall comedian, she remembers when "he followed me on a vaudeville bill, and I introduced him at every performance when I made my speech. . . . He's got that old microphone under control as well as Amelia Earhart has anything with two wings and a motor."

Cole Porter? Why, Elsie remembers him in Paris in 1918, when he "played some songs for me which I thought were grand, but he had a sort of De Bussy finish on them. . . . He hasn't changed a mite in twenty years. I think he's really Peter Pan. At least he's been putting a lot of the pan in tin pan alley."

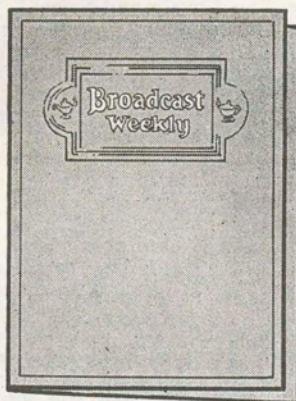

Confining themselves to classical and semi-classical music, these accomplished young ladies have offered a daily respite from the usual run of current music.

Their broadcasts are from the lobby of the conservative HOTEL BELLEVUE in San Francisco, where they are heard in a daily recital in addition to the broadcasts. The studios of station KROW are located in the lower lobby of the same hotel, which facilitates the handling of the broadcasts of this commendable musical offering.

GRACE HEROLD, pianist, leader of the trio, has had several years of vaudeville experience, playing on both the Pantages and Orpheum circuits, and in addition has played in several of the higher-class cafes in the Middle West and at the Athens and Broadmoor hotels in Colorado Springs. She is also remembered for her pianist abilities at the famed El Mirador Hotel at Palm Springs.

The other members of the trio are AURORA CRAVERO, cellist, and ALBA CROVERS, violinist. The former was for six years with NBC, playing with both the Arion Trio and the Charles Hart Stringwood Ensemble, while the latter has been heard over station KPO in the past.

WHEN KOL gagsters introduced Harold Bratsberg on a recent Carnival Hour broadcast as "KOL's new vertical antenna," they weren't stretching things much at that, because he does come fairly close to it, towering six feet four inches above the carpet.

Broad-shouldered, well built, KOL's tall evening announcer and news broadcaster is,

physically, certainly one of the biggest men in radio, and his abilities keep step with those size thirteen shoes.

Conscientious and ambitious, Harold has been interested in radio since the night he unceremoniously broke his first high school dance date, back in Minot, N. D., to stay home and listen to the little receiving set he had just finished that afternoon. To this day, Harold says, he gets a bigger thrill out of his radio work every year.

As a youngster he sat in his room night after night, head phones glued to his ears, and as the fascinating make-believe world of radio came feebly in across the prairies from the Twin Cities, Fort Worth, Tex., and Davenport, Ia., and other "distant" points, he vowed that some day he, too, would be a part of that radio industry.

Through four years of business partnership with his father, who owned one of the largest insurance agencies in North Dakota, and four years of business administration schooling at the Minot State Teachers College and the University of Washington, he held to this ambition.

Today his four-year-old log book reveals several national and coastwise broadcasts over both NBC and CBS, as well as countless hours over major local stations, to his credit. Also, Bratsberg is publicity director for the local CBS station, a position which he has held for two years.

Other current KOL assignments which Bratsberg handles include a 7 p. m. to midnight announcing shift each evening, a nightly news broadcast, Press Radio Bureau and local news flashes, at 9:45 each evening, except Tuesday, when it is scheduled at 9:15; and all football and crew broadcasts, as assistant to Ken Stuart, chief sports announcer.

Harold's extra-curricular activities in college included debate, dramatics, public speaking and crew. He was elected to Alpha Kappa Psi, national commerce honorary, and Lambda Chi Alpha, national social fraternity. He won several prizes and awards in forensic work, chief among them being a three thousand mile trip with the Columbia River Historical Expedition as the guest of the Franco-American Good Will Society, the Great Northern Railroad, and the Minot Rotary Club.

While employed by the Seattle branch of the internationally prominent Erwin-Wasey Advertising Agency, he wrote numerous radio program continuities that were broadcast over coastwise networks for a national advertiser.

WHAT an unusual person this Mary Pickford is. . . . With her tiny figure, her gentle demeanor, the soft, wavy hair, which once was the long golden curls of "America's Sweetheart," AND THE FORCEFUL, DETERMINED, SELF-RELIANT AND INDEPENDENT CHARACTER WHICH HER WRITING REVEALS, and which she has demonstrated time and time again, during the course of a brilliant career.

I have the nicest letter from her, and only wish I could show the whole thing in BROADCAST WEEKLY. The writing in general is quite large, with long upper and lower projections, strong pressure which gets even stronger at the ends of words, and a pronounced ascendant base-line. T-bars are, for the most part, strong, and the lower strokes of letters like "y" are long, straight and heavy.

All this combines to show a positive, strong-minded individual, with an indomitable will-power and a never-say-die spirit, which give the courage and fortitude to survive any amount of opposition and difficulty, and be still going strong, where less resolute individuals would have collapsed and crawled up on the shelf. One who writes like this does not give up easily, or admit defeat readily, in the face of obstacles.

That long dynamic downstroke at the end of her signature enhances the significance of the rest of the writing. Remember, there was the same kind of final in Al Pearce's handwriting last week? And Mary Pickford's writing, like Al's, shows an unusually large share of pluck, vitality, determination and endurance.

Another important feature lies in the fact that while there are many breaks within words, and most of the capitals are separated from the letters following, others are joined. The same goes for other initial letters—some separated from, others joined to the second letter. This always denotes a fine mind, which is both intuitive and logical—that is, in which both the perceptive and reflective faculties are in a high state of development. The combination gives all-round clarity of vision, and good powers of observation, analysis, deduction and comparison. It gives the ability to make quick decisions, based on inner feelings and impressions, but with it the ability to reason things out in a logical, deductive way, from the general to the particular. The bold, clear-cut "squarish" quality of the writing in general just emphasizes this.

Getting back to the keen intuition revealed by the many well-defined breaks in words. . . . It gives, not only a quick penetrative insight into essentials, but also a spontaneous grasp of human nature and character.

And incidentally, the vibrations of either her real name of GLADYS SMITH, or her professional name of MARY PICKFORD, (but particularly the former) denote a quick, critical, investigative and versatile mind, tremendously interested in human beings.

Her handwriting shows wide curving in the strokes which form the base-line, plus exaggerated "heads" to a number of letters (for example, the "P" in her signature). This is a sign of spirituality or occultism, love of and faith in extraordinary and unusual subjects, giving an urge toward religious or occult study. The strong intuitive faculty would certainly be conducive to success in this field. * * *

Vision, foresight, ambition, driving qualities, and everything which goes to create the executive temperament are shown in Mary Pickford's writing. Even the "f's," like figure 8's, are, in this kind of a "hand" a sign of money sense and financial ability.

And both of her names have strong business vibrations, which accounts for the fact that she has made a name for herself as an excellent business woman, quite apart from her theatrical career.
