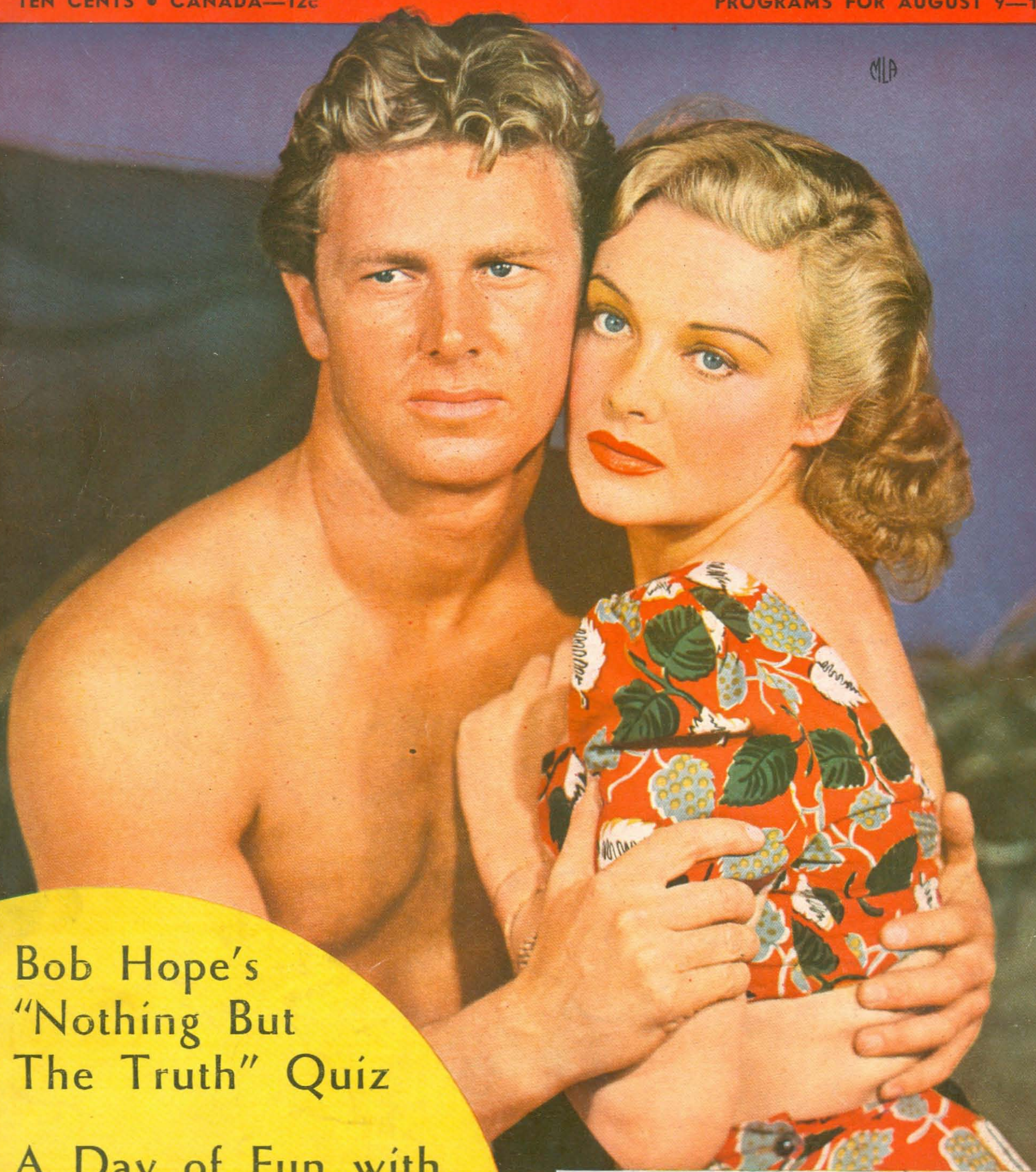

PROFESSIONALLY, Edward G. Robinson is a toughie. As Steve Wilson, militant newspaper editor on radio's "Big Town" (currently off the air for the summer), Robinson has a pair of ever-ready fists, will slug it out with the toughest hoodlums the script-writers can devise. On the screen he likely as not may be a hoodlum himself, hard-bitten, cruel and despicable.

All of which goes to prove what a consummate actor the man is. In real life Edward G. Robinson is a gentle, kindly soul, a solid citizen who lives quietly in an unostentatious Rexford Drive home with his charming wife, the former Gladys Lloyd, and his young son, Mannie, to both of whom he is completely devoted. The walls of this home boast a rare collection of paintings. They are his hobby. But the all-consuming passion of his life is the welfare of his fellow men. Hence, if these stars who won't work because Uncle Sam gets most of the money when they do go on like they have been for a couple of years they won't be stars at all. Isn't it a pity? It isn't!

Corporal James Stewart Blitzkrieged by a Horse!

HOLLYWOOD'S
NEWS PICTURE
OF THE WEEK

RAPIDLY becoming a number one American is Corporal James Stewart of the United States Army, ex-actor and Academy Award winner. What he does, what he says, now makes news over the entire country, but newsier than ever is his appearance at the Hollywood Park race-track for a rare occasion back in "civvie" (civilian) clothes. The event should have been a happy one but wasn't—Jimmy "lost his shirt." An attentive MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE cameraman watched Stewart as he and Mrs. Mervyn LeRoy (1) picked a horse, (2) tensely

watched it leave the starting-gate, (3) experienced an exciting moment as they saw their selection running well to the front, (4) focused glasses as the horses turned into the home stretch, muttered (above), "Well, I'll be —!" as the horse finished "out of the money." Typical of Army treatment of men like Corporal Stewart is the fact that he gets frequent leave, that he looks a good deal better than he did, feels much better than when he was one of Hollywood's most popular screen actors. If you don't believe it—ask him!

SPOTLIGHT ON:



Jack Oakie
WISE GUY
COMES BACK

JACK OAKIE gave up understudying to be a stock-broker a score of years ago and began mugging himself to fame and fortune as a "wise guy" comedian whom the public alternately hated and loved. For fourteen years now, barring a two-year "rest," he's been manufacturing screen guffaws by following admittedly the same old slapstick rules laid down by pioneers Mack Sennett and Al Christie.

"I've had my share of gravy licks (laughs)," Oakie told this reporter, "but they've all been second hand." First hand, however, is the Oakie gravy-stirring technique. Jack is the wise guy who makes himself disliked and then is properly squelched by a pail of water, a mud puddle, or a conk on the cranium. That's old too, but not the way Oakie does it. For Jack succeeds in making himself a character the audience despises in order to win a top-cream popularity rating.

In 1938 he likewise succeeded in making himself unpopular with radio and film producers by a streak of what is known as "undependability." So Jack dieted down his waistline, swore off drinking, generally reformed and made peace with his little woman by taking her on an extended trip to Europe. When he returned to Hollywood, the producers would have none of the good Jack Oakie. He almost had holes worn through his pants before his big break came when Charles Chaplin—a genius and judge of genius—gave Jack the second most important role, that of Benzino Napolini in "The Great Dictator," which turned out to be a smashing success. Whereupon Oakie almost swiped the picture right from under the master comedian's nose!

So started Jack Oakie's screen comeback, bigger and better than ever before. "Little Men," "Tin Pan Alley" and "The Great American Broadcast" confirmed the sure-firiness of an Oakie performance.

An odd hobby Jack has is to keep a card index of everything which the world and his wife laugh at. To date he has more than 1,000 cards listing situations, gags and predicaments. In addition to his screen work, Jack also is mayor of West Van Nuys, where he lives. He takes the job seriously, works at it. Every two weeks Jack presides at the meeting of the city fathers, where city affairs are threshed out.

As the Admiral in "Navy Blues," with Ann Sheridan and Martha Raye, Oakie's forthcoming and first Warner Bros. production, Jack outdoes himself. There won't be any more layoffs for Jack Oakie for a while. —E. P.

To News Desk:

THE HEROIC evacuation of Dunkirk, miracle of the war which had the world amazed a year ago, will shortly flash on the nation's screens as a part of 20th Century-Fox' "A Yank in the R. A. F." Before Britain evacuated its expeditionary force of nearly a half-million men, few Americans believed the overwhelming task could be done. But it was!

In Hollywood, when director Henry King had the evacuation written into the screenplay, he was told, "That's too big to try. You'll never be able to re-create it effectively." King thought otherwise. "I'll do it," he answered. He did!

The pictures made by MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE and shown herewith give a small idea of how well King accomplished "the impossible."

To begin with, a special budget of \$150,000 was set aside from the picture's general fund for purpose of making this one climactic scene. But after looking at rushes of the first week's shooting of the Dunkirk fight, Darryl Zanuck increased the budget by \$40,000.

Assisted by Director James Stevens, King employed between 700 and 800 extras on the English Channel set that was built on 20th Century-Fox' back lot. Dozens of assistant directors aided in setting various scenes of action. Several score of small craft were rented and hauled from the

Pacific Ocean beach at Santa Monica to the "channel."

Despite balmy California weather, water of the artificial lake which became the English Channel for the movie was not the most comfortable in which to bathe day after day while wearing full army equipment. Therefore it was heated and 800 \$16.50-a-day extras were given cups of hot coffee regularly to combat the exposure.

Likewise to save broken ankles and legs, King supplied evacuating "soldiers" with rubber-soled sneakers so they wouldn't slip and injure themselves. Day after day black-powder bombs burst, tanks of gasoline were exploded, and fires raged on the Dunkirk set, yet no one was seriously injured.

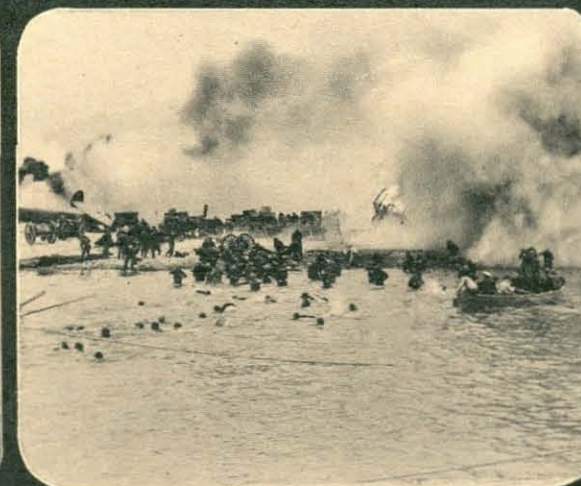
Briefly, "A Yank in the R. A. F." is the story of an irresponsible American (Tyrone Power) who makes good in the British flying corps at evacuation of Dunkirk, wins his girl (Betty Grable). Considered from all angles aside from filming one of the decade's most exciting pictures, Director King achieved a historic milestone in motion pictures by the re-creation of the Dunkirk battle.

He had other troubles too. Before setting any flying-scenes he had to have the okay of the R. A. F. of Canada and of the United States government where American warplanes were shown.

But, as a monument to British audacity and American ingenuity, the evacuation of Dunkirk now has been accomplished on celluloid.—E. P.

GLAMOUR GIRL
BRAVES MIKE

SINCE Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's picture "Come Live With Me," with Jimmy Stewart, little has been heard from Hedy Lamarr, one of Hollywood's most glamorous ladies who broke into screen fame with her rather unclad part in "Ecstasy," a European picture. It was therefore with interest that the editors of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE observed that Hedy (she likes it pronounced Hay'-dee) was booked by the DeMille Radio Theater to co-star with Charles Boyer in a radio adaptation of their "Algiers."

This was news from two points—first, because it was the final performance of the season for the Radio Theater, and second, because it was Miss Lamarr's very first radio broadcast.

A third point of interest was the rumor that the Viennese ex-stenographer had been feuding with her home studio and was on suspension. At radio rehearsal she was interviewed.

"Have you been off pay or on suspension?" she was asked. "I haven't missed a single week getting my pay-check," she replied. "Here, do you want to see it?" We did, naturally enough, but being a gentleman we said no and let it pass. But we did observe in talking to her that she obviously was under a great tension just before the broadcast. Who wouldn't be—breaking into radio in a program with 25,000,000 listeners throughout the country waiting to say "she's awful!"

It developed during our chat that Miss Lamarr has been on a three-month vacation following "Come Live With Me."

The glamorous brunette was clad in a black chiffon, floor-length dress, and was wearing black wedgie sandals over bare feet, with her toenails enameled a cherry red. She was plenty nervous about that first broadcast, too, but was calmed considerably by Cecil B. DeMille, producer of the program, who succeeded in making her laugh just before the "on the air sign" flashed, and also the ever calm Charles Boyer.

We listened to her "Algiers." She'd lost much of her accent, and her radio version was not quite as sure as her screen "Algiers." We checked with our better half for her opinion. She said:

"Hedy sounded just like Joan Bennett." That was a compliment, because La Bennett is an accomplished, sure-fire radio performer.

Gene Markey would have agreed. He was married to both actresses in turn. —E. P.

MADELEINE CARROLL and Stirling Hayden are back in Hollywood from their location trip to Nassau for exterior scenes of "Bahama Passage." Film Stars Get Behind \$10,000,000 U. S. O. Drive to Provide Entertainment for Soldiers and Sailors

ALREADY an acknowledged leader in the nation's all-out program for defense, Hollywood on June 29 again massed its formidable talent, gave unstintingly of valuable time to aid the \$10,000,000 U. S. O. drive to provide entertainment and religious facilities for the nation's defenders.

Staged in Hollywood Bowl, broadcast over CBS, this three-hour program brought an array of names before the microphone which actually made listeners dizzy, earned \$23,675 for the cause in paid admissions, reached its most dramatic moment with announcement that Edward G. Robinson was donating his salary for his next picture—\$100,000—to this worthy cause.

The U. S. O. is an organization supported by the Salvation Army, National Catholic Community Service, Jewish Welfare Board, Travelers Aid Society, Y. M. C. A. and Y. W. C. A. which will build 335 service clubs housing libraries, game rooms, lounges and facilities for religious services for camps isolated from large cities.

In addition to money collected from those who attended the broadcast, the contributions of the stars themselves, thousands of dollars sent in by a generous public were added to the swelling coffers of the U. S. O.—again proving Hollywood will always support a worthy cause.

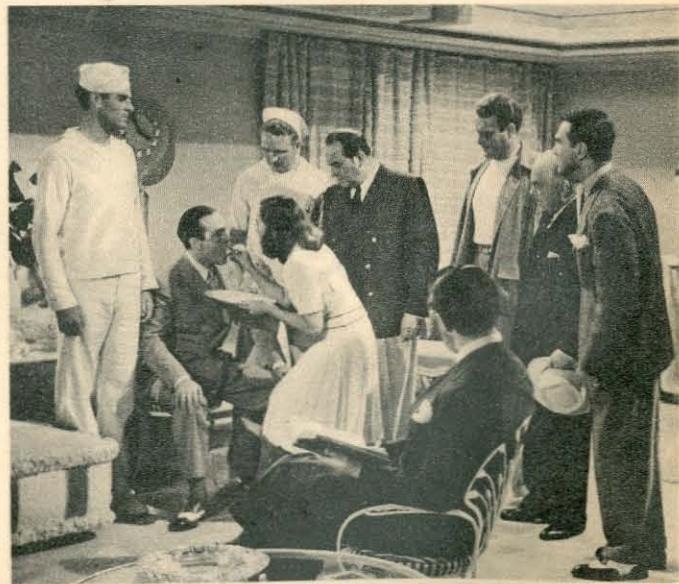

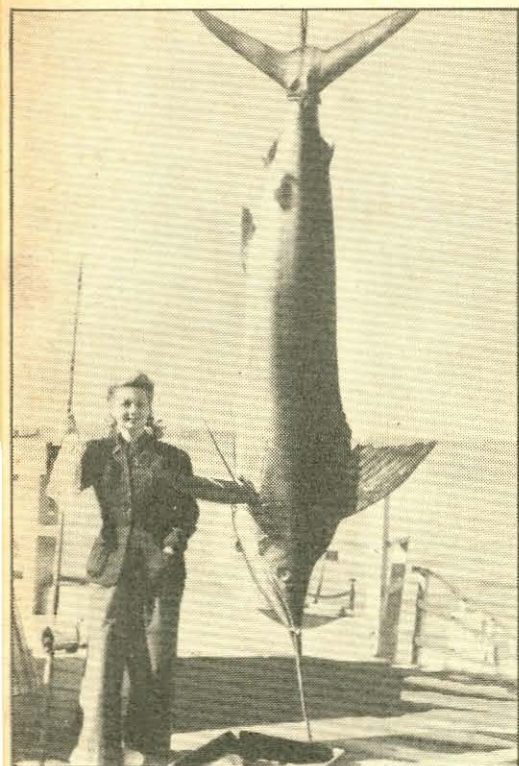
Carradine Hiss-Honored

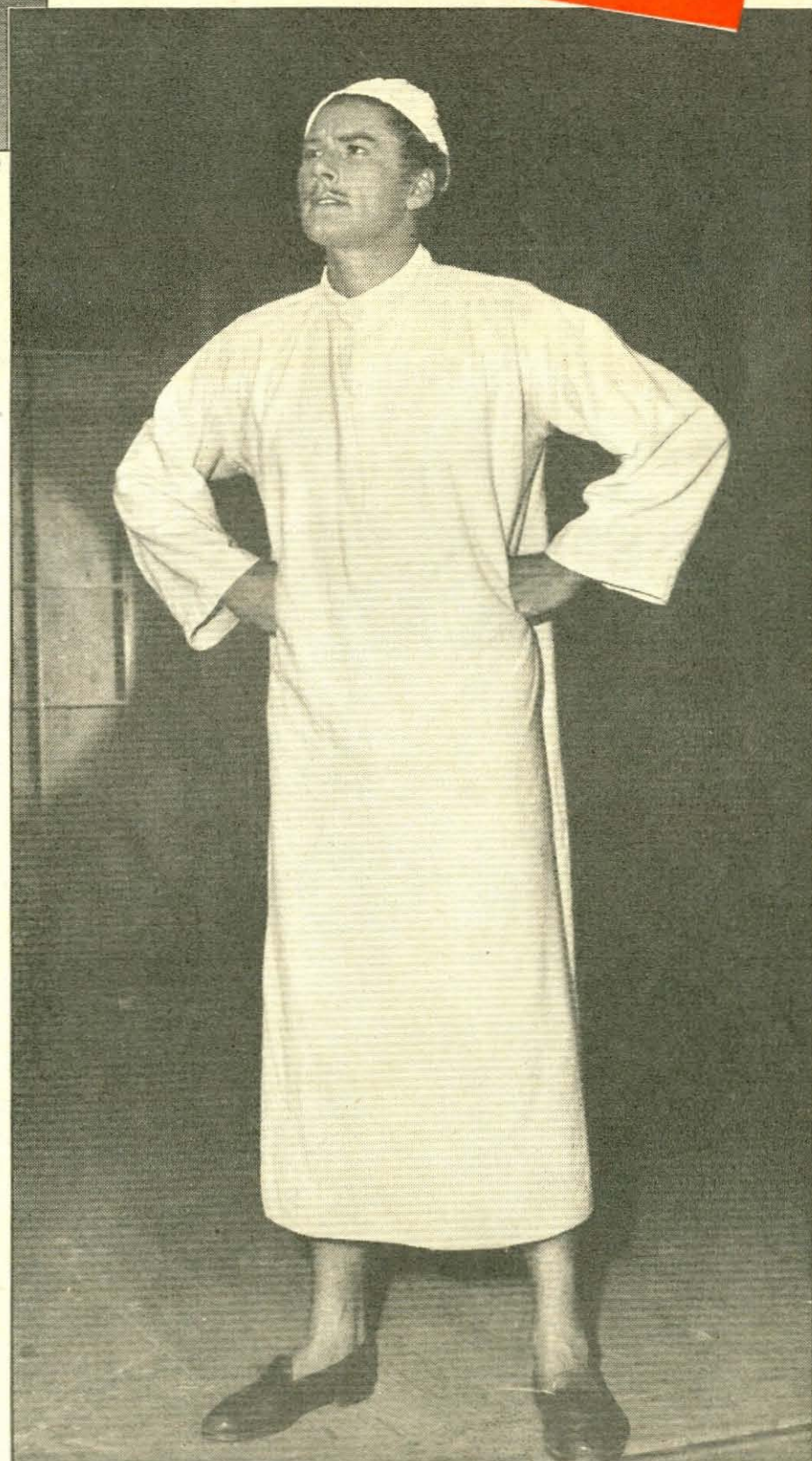

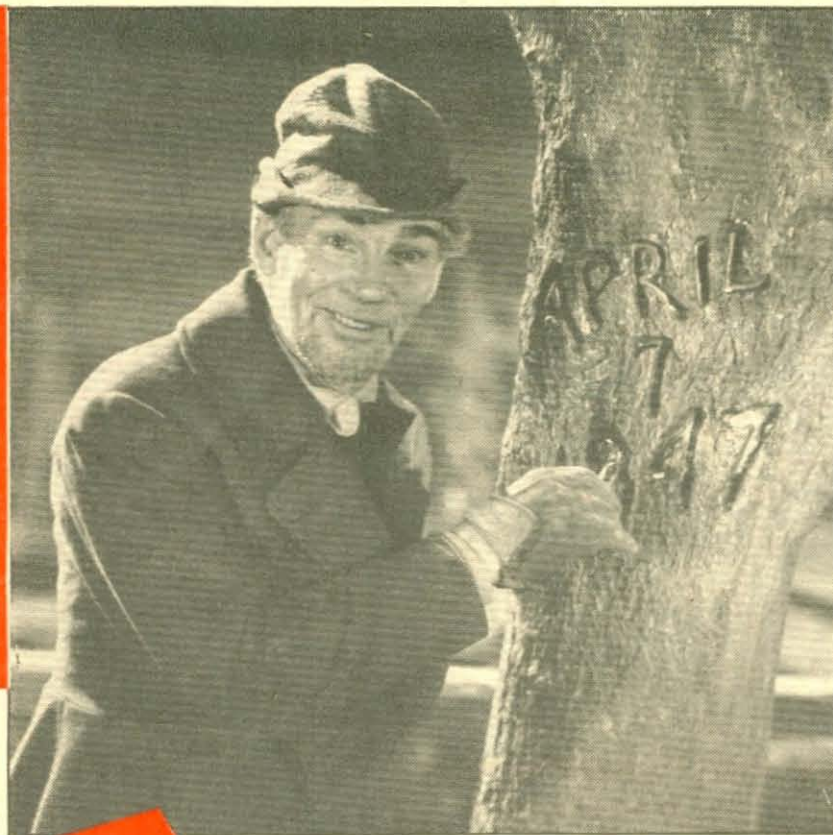
"Hold That Ghost"

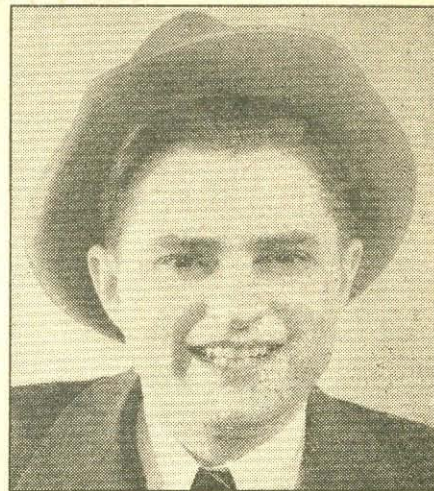

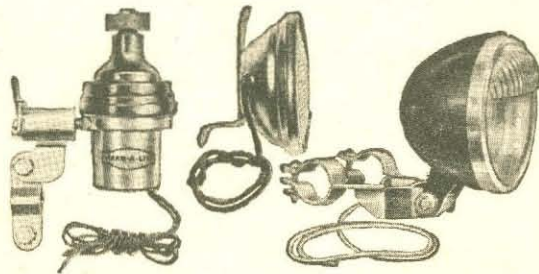

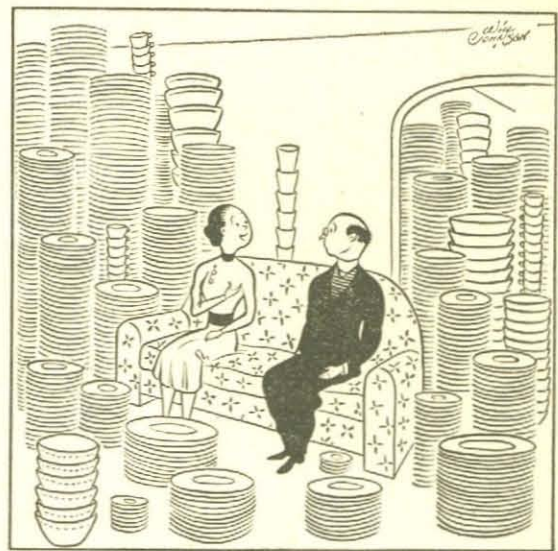

MUSIC NOTES: The where-abouts of Mme. Kirsten Flagstad, acclaimed by many the greatest Wagnerian singer of all time, has become a mystery to her friends and business associates over here. Dozens of cables and letters to her in Oslo, Norway, have gone unanswered for the past five weeks. Mme. Flagstad, when she flew to Europe last April, said she would return in October to fulfill her singing contracts, which total more than \$125,000. In June the German government released an announcement saying that her husband, an Oslo lumberman, had said she would remain in Norway until the war was over. Many of the singer's friends fear that the Nazis are detaining her with the hope of compelling her to appear on the German operatic stage. Hitler is known to be a great admirer of Mme. Flagstad's singing.

Determined to Listen

NEW YORK.—No matter how severe the penalty imposed in some countries for listening to foreign broadcasts, there is evidence that American short-wave programs are reaching their targets, an RCA report discloses. The corporation bases its claim upon mail reaching the country from listeners in countries where foreign short-wave listening is banned.

CONTROVERSY

FCC Action Postponed

NEW YORK.—The Federal Communications Commission postponed its action which would have required NBC to dispose of one of its two networks. The date upon which the FCC's regulations become effective has been moved up to September 16. The postponement was requested by both NBC and CBS, the two networks asking for more time for a discussion of problems created by the ruling.

Jolson Wins, Jolson Loses

NEW YORK.—A suit brought against Al Jolson has been dismissed by the Supreme Court. Jolson was being sued for \$25,000 by his brother, Harry Jolson, who contended that the money was owed to him under an agreement made in 1934 whereby Al was to pay him \$150 a week for life provided he would leave the theater and give his brother exclusive professional use of the name of Jolson. Harry testified that the payments had continued until 1937, when they ceased.

High Cost of Feud

NEW YORK.—NBC's fear of broadcasting ASCAP tunes leads the company to exercise great caution, which

often is costly. Before "Skaters Waltz" was permitted to go on the air in a short-wave broadcast from London, NBC had the orchestra in London play the selection for its music department so that branch of the NBC could ascertain whether or not ASCAP was infringed upon. There proved to be no infringement, but the cost of short-waving the song was eighty dollars!

The writing is done by young Fred Kress, who is one of the most prolific of radio-comedy writers. GENERAL

Suspend Rules for F. D. R.

NEW YORK.—Both NBC and CBS waived their rules against broadcasting recordings the other day when President Roosevelt requested that they air a recording which he had made of his message to Congress on the extension of service of selectees. It was CBS' first occasion to lift its ban against recordings. The last time NBC made an exception was two years ago, in 1939, when Chamberlain announced that hostilities between Germany and England had begun.

CBS FM Station in Hollywood

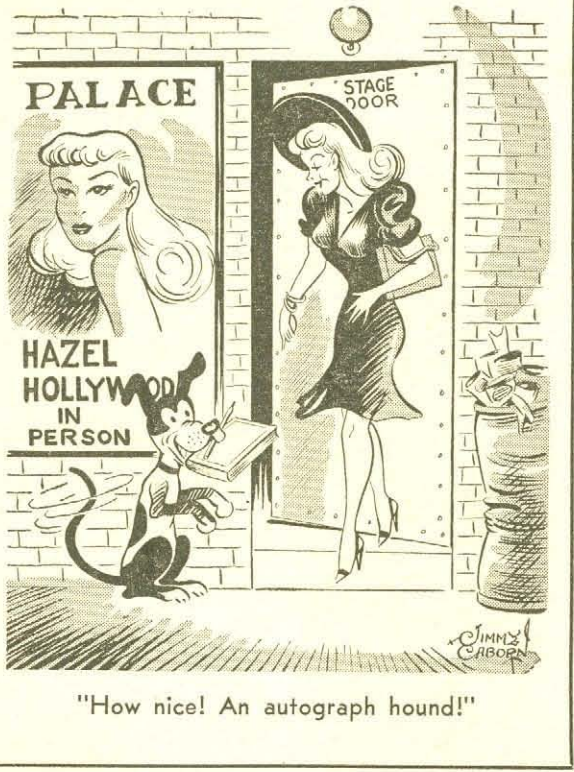

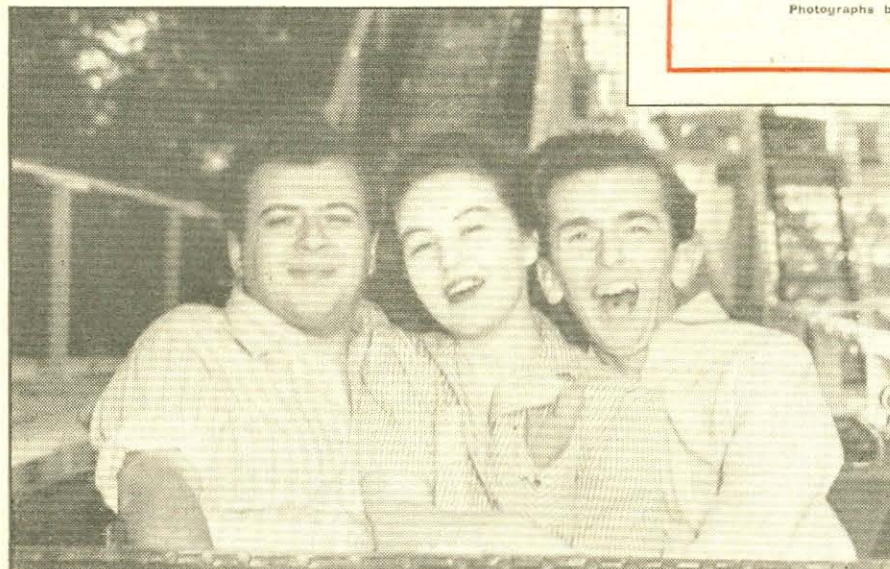

The Melodious "Telephone Hour"

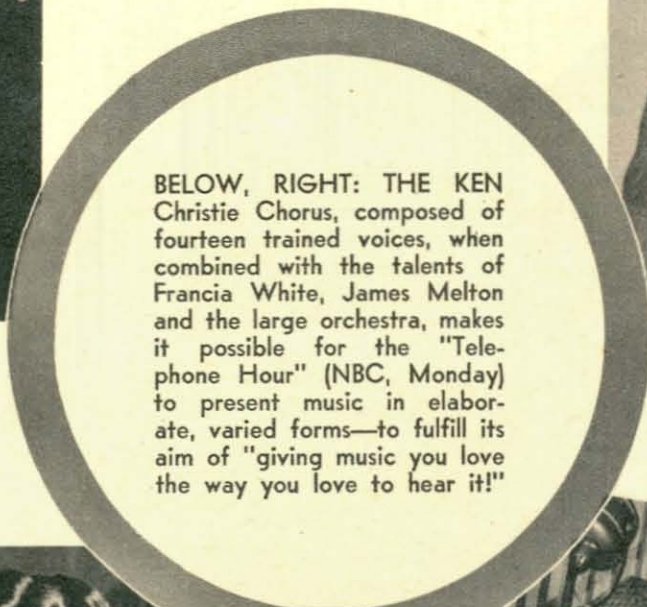

THERE is method in the apparent madness of such an affluent corporation as the Bell Telephone System in taking its radio show to a small threadbare studio long ago abandoned by other NBC programs for the glittering beauty of Radio City. It is the same scientific method which the telephone people apply to everything. Because telephone engineers decree that a studio at NBC's old headquarters, 711 Fifth Ave., has the best studio acoustics in New York, it is to that address one must go to see Don Voorhees, James Melton, Francia White and company present their musical broadcast. Because telephone executives want to concentrate on music, studio audiences—and therefore studio applause—have been ruled out. Preparations for each broadcast are carried on with the same precise care. Conductor Don Voorhees begins to plan programs three months in advance. A staff of story-hunters spends all of its time digging up little-known facts about well-known music to be passed on to listeners by narrator Floyd Mack. But listeners know already that the "Telephone Hour" (NBC, Monday) is good. Now MOVIE RADIO-GUIDE's visit shows why.

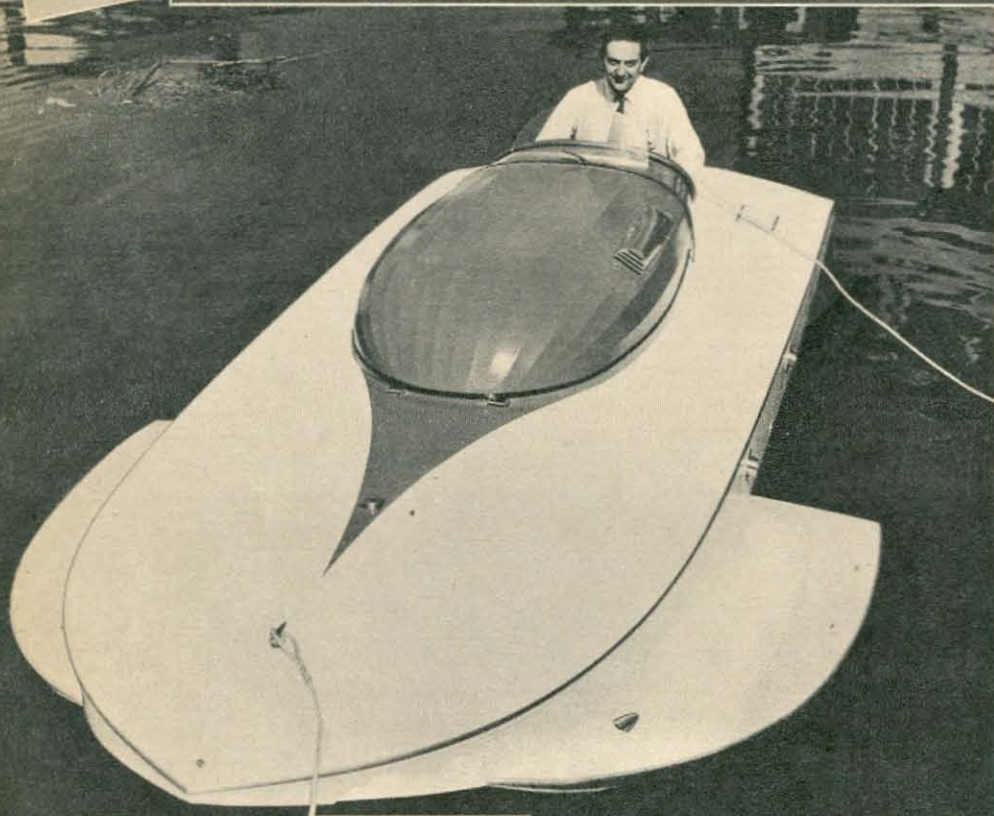

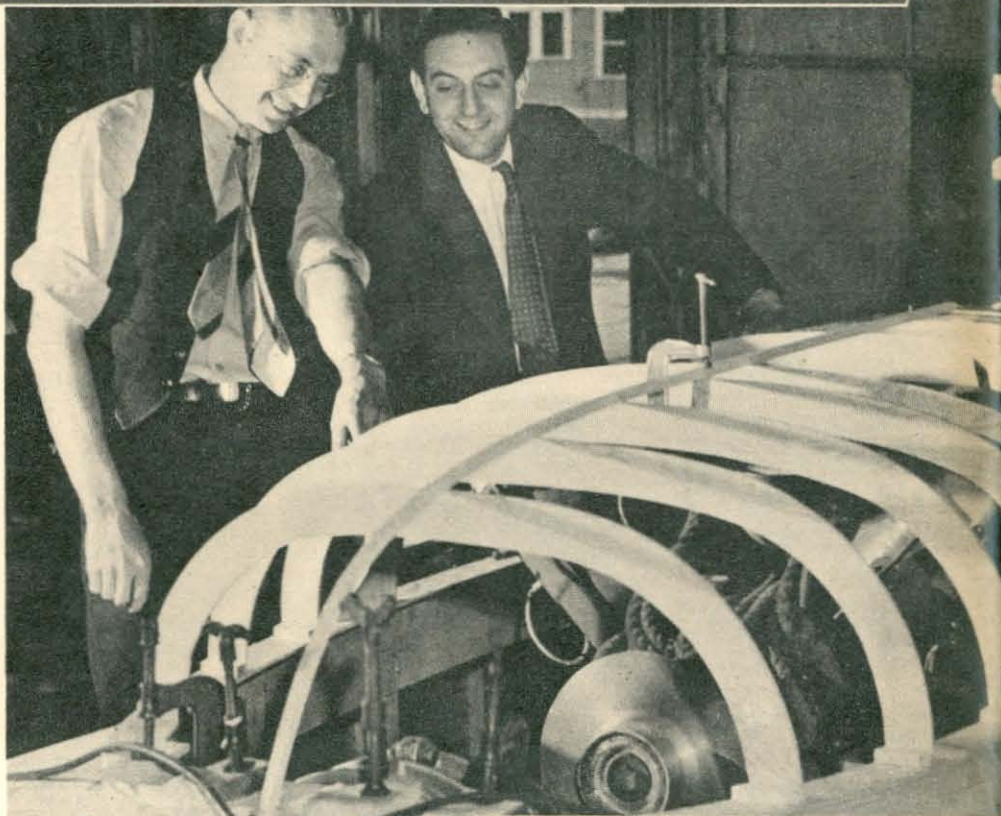

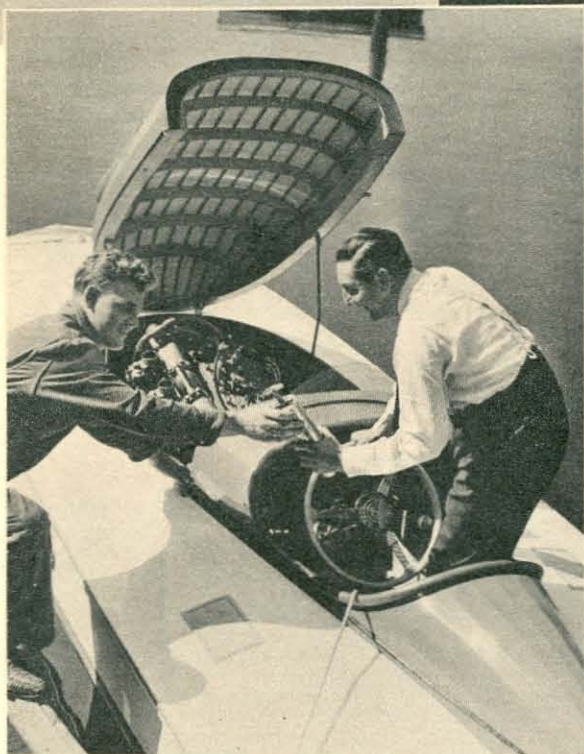
Guy Lombardo—Boat-Race Champ

WHETHER you're a jitterbug or not you'll probably be interested in this little piece of news, for it so happens that Benny Goodman, the idol of millions of swing fans, has broken down and named those whom he believes to be the finest hot soloists in the business. Goodman, in an article in the *New York Times*, named the orchestras of Duke Ellington and Count Basie as the two which he personally liked best. For soloists he chose Teddy Wilson and Count Basie as pianists; Lester Young, tenor saxophone; Cootie Williams, trumpet; Joe Jones, drums; Walter Page, bass violin, and Jack Teagarden, trombone.

Wants Ellington in Concert Series

Since Goodman has already broken ground for us by naming Ellington's orchestra as one of the two best in the swing field, we'd like to pass along an idea which we've entertained for some time. We'd like to see one of the major networks broadcast a series of Ellington swing concerts. Duke Ellington's orchestra is one of the few in the country whose music is neither jam music nor symphonic jazz. There have been quite a few jazz concerts given in the past decade or so, but not many

of them have presented swing in true concert style. Ellington could come nearer to doing it than even Benny Goodman or Artie Shaw.

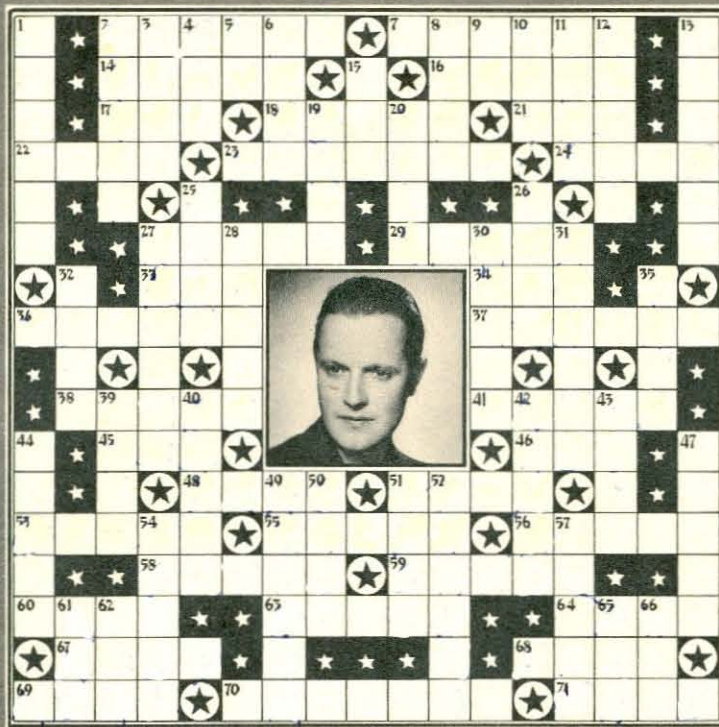
Jazz-Battle Rages

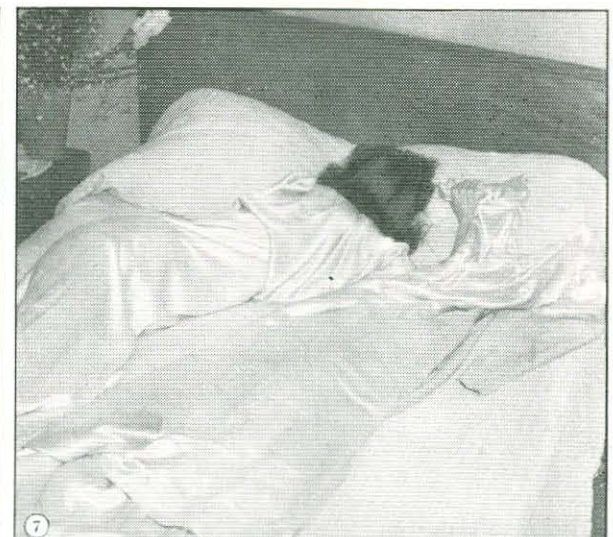
