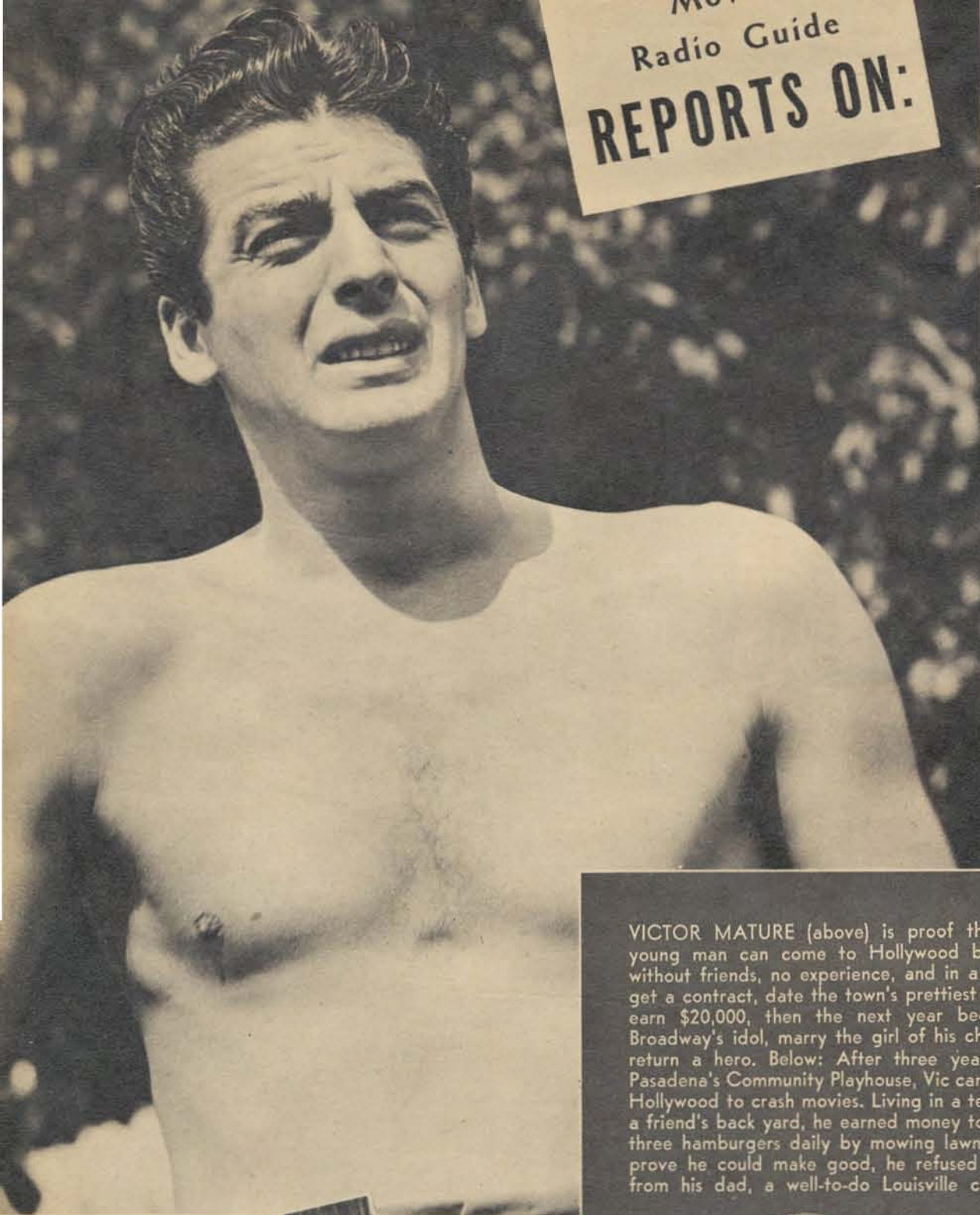

The Star Who Fooled Hollywood

Editor's Note: MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE readers who have heard actor Victor Mature in radio guest appearances, such as his most recent with Eddie Cantor, have requested a story about him. This one could not be more authentic. It is written by one of the young men who lived with Vic while his amazing leap to fame was being accomplished.—The Editors.

I STILL can't believe it. Five years ago a young man came into my office and said, "I want to get into pictures—how will I do it?" I told him to get experience, preferably at the Pasadena Community Playhouse. Three years later a friend introduced me to Victor Mature, who, he said, was living in a tent, half starving, trying to get a break in Hollywood. This was in 1939. Today he has behind him four movies, a smash Broadway play, a trail of broken hearts, and now marriage to as lovely a girl as there is to be discovered in this broad land.

While Vic fooled Hollywood by making good when all cards were stacked against him, he really flabbergasted his friends, who knew him as a fickle young man, by marrying suddenly. The girl is the former Martha Stephenson Kemp, widow of the late orchestra-leader Hal Kemp. Now back in Hollywood, Mature earns \$1,750 weekly, will make two pictures a year for 20th Century, the first with Alice Faye.

This is how it happened. After three years of theatrical study, Mature came back to Hollywood. Typical of producers' disinterest was the comment of one who made an appointment to see him, promptly exclaimed: "You won't do. Your face isn't right. You haven't the bearing—you don't even look like a leading man!" Vic saw red. "Is that so?" he snapped. "You asked me to come here

and now you insult me. Well, I don't think you are much of a movie executive either!" With that he slammed the door so hard two pictures fell off the wall. Some time later, producer Hal Roach found an old theatrical poster for which Vic had posed, liked his looks, signed him up.

In quick succession, Vic did "The Housekeeper's Daughter," "1,000,000 B. C." and "No, No, Nanette." Then it appeared that there were no more assignments for him and that predictions of his failure would come true. "I think I'll get out of Hollywood," he told me one day while we were taking a sun-bath in his back yard. "I've just enough money to get to New York." I laughed at him, but two weeks later he had signed to appear opposite Gertrude Lawrence, the finest actress in the theater, in "Lady in the Dark." The stage production was a smash hit, and Vic, in the role of a Hollywood actor, immediately attracted a large following.

In 1938 his total earnings were \$82. In 1941 he will earn almost \$50,000. How did he do it? Mainly by never losing confidence in himself, by good hard work, ceaseless energy, and never letting an opportunity go by to "insult" the big people and help the "little guy." One half of Hollywood swears he's crazy and won't last; the other half just swears by him.

Not half-way through this story a telephone call interrupted me. It was Victor Mature, calling from New York. "Hey, Bud," he shouted, "what's cooking? In an hour I'm getting on a plane. Tell everybody that noise they'll hear tomorrow night won't be an earthquake—just me getting home. . . . And don't forget to order up a hamburger dinner de luxe at the corner drive-in!"

Is there anything else you want to know about Vic Mature? Just watch the papers! —C. S.

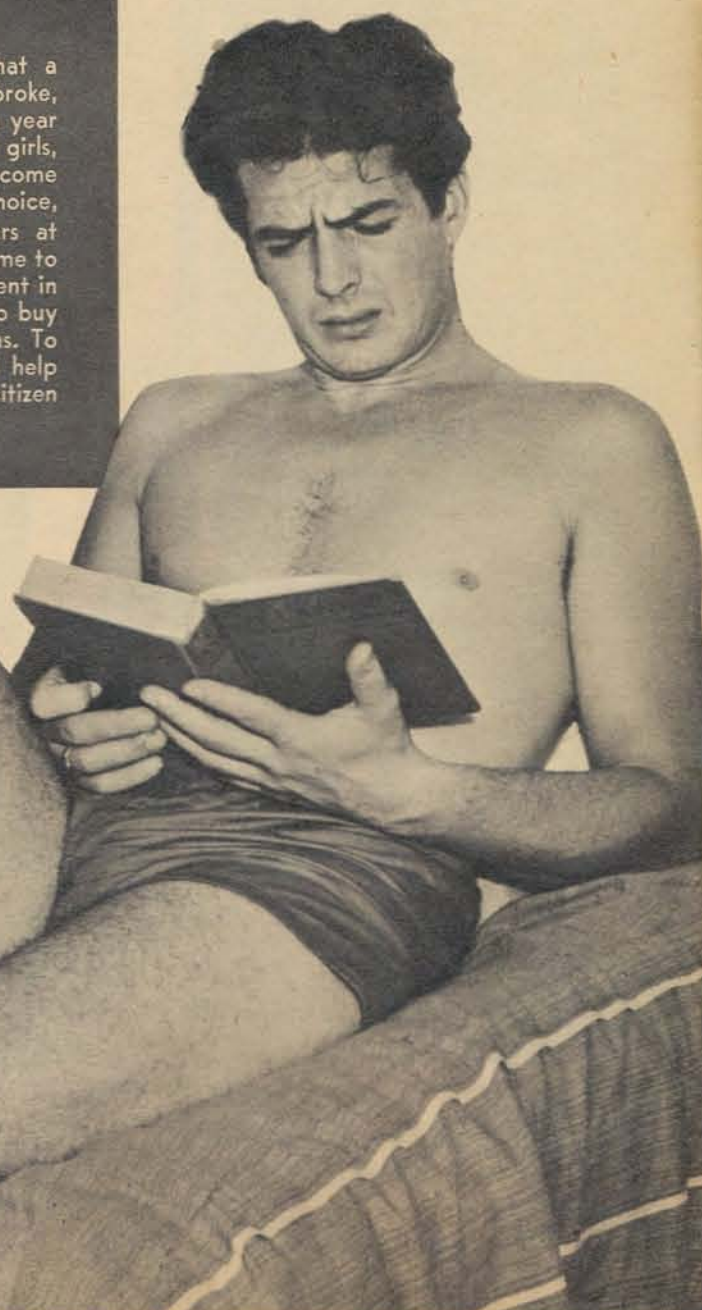

Betty Grable's New Love-Story

How almost-romances nearly kept Betty Grable from meeting the man she may finally marry

REPORTERS grow a little calloused in writing about the love-stories of movie stars. Frequently, before the last copies are off the presses revealing a "true love" of some Hollywood glamour girl, she has found romance with another man.

You see a good many pictures of Betty Grable. Most of them are labeled "romance" but few of them really are. I think the real story about a star and her alleged loves deserves to be told. In the first place, Betty's marriage to Jackie Coogan was the result of a girl-hood courtship. They had secretly separated after a short marriage, but both agreed that it would be better to stay married for a time when Jackie partially lost his suit to recover his childhood movie earnings. Otherwise it would have been said that she had ditched Jackie when his money was gone.

After her divorce from Jackie, Betty was seen often with Vic Orsatti, but he's an agent, and this situation was as much business as pleasure. Then she began to go with bandleader Artie Shaw. But they're of opposite temperament, and, fortunately for both, this romance failed to develop into marriage. Next, it looked like lasting love, perhaps, with Victor Mature—but wasn't. Vic went to Broadway, and wed Martha Kemp before he saw Betty again.

Then—**THE Man**

And then—George Raft came into the picture. Betty is reluctant to say this is the real thing, but she does say: "So many of the fellows around the sets work under such pressure they've forgotten all about gallantry. George treats me as though neither of us had ever seen a studio or a star."

Raft sends his car to call for Betty at the end of each day's work in "Yank in the R. A. F." He's a generous suitor. Recently he gave her a mink coat, and during the same week presented her with a \$4,000 race-horse. Almost any girl might learn to care for a fellow who thought that much of her, and Betty Grable seems to be leaning pretty steadily toward George.—C. S.

Ken Murray's lengthy bachelorhood closes with a happy marriage

WHEN comedian Ken Murray took young beauty-contest winner Cleatus Caldwell down to the Los Angeles marriage-license bureau June 23, a great Hollywood tradition collapsed. You see, until now Murray was always the fellow who courted the glamour girls just before they eloped with somebody else!

But with nineteen-year-old Miss Caldwell Ken stacked the cards on fate. He was growing tired of his role as "extra man." He had dated Mary Brian, Shirley Ross, Mary Healy, Brenda Joyce, Helen Mack, Nancy Kelly and numerous others. But they all seemed to get the matrimonial urge just when some other chap happened to be on the spot.

Waits for Her to Grow Up

Then on a balmy spring day two years ago young Cleatus Caldwell of Fairfax High School won a "Miss Hollywood 1940" bathing-beauty title. Her victory entitled her to appear on a broadcast. It was there Ken Murray met her—and fell so hard the studio almost collapsed. He had sense enough to realize Cleatus was little more than half his age. But that didn't stop him.

That same season the charming youngster was entered in the finals of the International Bathing Beauty Contest in Hollywood. Murray dropped a broad hint that he'd like to be on hand for the judging, and his friend, Jerry Riley, who was one of the impresarios, fixed it. Ken and his pal Edgar Bergen were present to see Cleatus cop blue ribbons as "Miss Blue Pacific 1940" and "Miss United States 1940."

Bing Sings at Wedding

Since then Murray has let Cleatus "grow up." She finished her high-school education. He built a home in the Pacific Palisades in readiness for the time when he might ask her to become his bride and she would say—he hoped—"yes." He did and she did.

The wedding took place Friday, July 4, at his friend Lew Ayres' home, with Edgar Bergen acting as best man and Bing Crosby singing for the first time at any wedding. Then the couple departed for a honeymoon at Lake Tahoe.

So ended the Ken Murray "always a best man but never a bridegroom" tradition—and happily! —E. P.

To Feature Desk:

WARNER BROS. believe that in "Sergeant York" they have the picture of the year. They believe that Gary Cooper, as Sergeant York, gives the greatest performance of his career; that Joan Leslie, through her sincere portrayal of York's wife, has proved she is a top-flight actress. Superlatives will vie with superlatives in attempts to describe the picture that brings the story of America's greatest World War hero to the screen, but to most movie-goers "Sergeant York" will be great because it is a true story of a great man.

The Common People's Hero

Alvin C. York is the kind of man Americans have always found irresistible. A young, occasionally hell-raising Tennessee farmer, York was eking out a hard but honest living on his hillside farm in 1917. A year later he went to France with the A. E. F. At Argonne he was one of seventeen men detailed to circle behind German lines. When nine of them were put out of action under German fire, York was left as the only non-com to take command. In a moment of supreme heroism he shot down twenty-five Germans, won the engagement and took back 132 prisoners. For his bravery, York was hailed as the outstanding soldier hero of the war, received the Distinguished Service Cross, the Croix de Guerre and Congressional Medal of Honor. Then, when the war was over, he went back to Tennessee to realize an old dream, for the people of his state had given him a farm on the richest bottomland of the Valley. Refusing money-making offers of all kinds, Alvin York settled down to become an ordinary Tennessee farmer, which he is today. But he has never been forgotten by the hero-loving American people.

Lasky Makes a Comeback

In a sense, "Sergeant York" is a personal triumph for producer Jesse Lasky. One of Hollywood's pioneer movie-makers, Lasky has had few opportunities to show his genius since 1932, when he produced such hits as "Berkeley Square" and "Zoo in Budapest." Now he makes an impressive comeback with the story he has tried many times since 1918 to film. Always before, he—and other Hollywood producers—had run into the refusal of Sergeant York to capitalize on his service to his country until now, when he feels the present war has brought a real threat to freedom. Smartly, Lasky concurred with York's own choice of Gary Cooper to portray himself.

Mammoth Undertaking

The picture was filmed on 123 studio sets and on eight outdoor locations. One set included a mountain built on a revolving base with a 200-foot stream, a stationary peak and a large section of wood and farm land dressed up with 121 real trees. The eighty-acre battle-field was the largest ever used for a motion-picture war. Five tons of dynamite were used to blast out realistic shell craters, 3,400 powder mines were exploded and 3,200 pounds of black powder went into ground mines. Irrelevant statistics: 6,700 hot lunches were served to troops on the battle-field.

Sergeant York was technical adviser on this picture but his salary went to a Tennessee home for backward children. Sergeant York has proved himself a fine man and the screen version of his life is a grand picture.

Some say he is a genuine crusader for peace—others insist he is "selling out the country." What answer will you, the American public, give?

It has long been true of Americans that they are intensely loyal to the President of the United States and that both in times of peace and threatened war the great majority sincerely believes that he guides the nation wisely and well. By strange circumstances a situation now arises in which a famous American appears to be pitted against the President on a question vital to every American. It is MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's intention to find out exactly what Americans are thinking by conducting a strictly neutral poll. In this case the questions are being asked about Lindbergh and not about the President. Let no reader question the sincerity or purpose of these questions. The results, to be published in an early issue, will be carefully tabulated and presented with an affidavit from the editors attesting to the accuracy of the poll.—The Editors.

"WE HAVE been making gestures with an empty gun . . ."

These were the words of Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh on June 15, 1940. Since then he has consistently opposed the government policy as the international war clouds have grown blacker. Since then he has become just plain citizen Lindbergh. Since then he has gained the following of thousands of enthusiastic backers. Since then he has lost the

confidence and respect of many an American.

Together with Senators Gerald P. Nye and Burton K. Wheeler, Lindbergh has broadcast attack after attack upon presidential policy. MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE has sought to secure from representative radio commentators and news analysts their opinions about Lindbergh's ideas, methods and motives. Almost every radio network turned down the publication's request on the basis that they do only a reporting job, never an analytical one.

However, from Drew Pearson, who with Robert S. Allen, writes the syndicated column *Washington Merry-Go-Round*, comes this sensational statement: "There are two things behind Lindbergh's stand on the Roosevelt foreign policy. The first one is that Lindbergh is going to run for the Senate in Minnesota, and even for the presidency. The second is that Lindbergh went to England for privacy, and got it. England respected his wishes. Likewise, in France they left him strictly to himself as he requested. When he went on to Germany they made a great commotion over him, which appealed tremendously to his ego. At heart, I think it is fair to say he is a spiritual Nazi."

Less bombastic but still as severe is the comment of Wythe Williams, heard by thousands of Americans over Mutual Broadcasting System: "My opin-

ion of Lindbergh holds nothing of the personal. I have never met him; I have never even seen him. Therefore, under different world conditions, I would not express myself—BUT Lindbergh takes the position opposed to all I hold important for the conservation of American life.

"From long study of Lindbergh in the abstract; from what I have learned from those who do know him, I believe that he aspires to a task for which he is mentally, morally and spiritually unfit—the dictatorial leadership of the nation."

Much more could be said about Lindbergh, pro and con. "Tom, Dick and Harry"

Cast: Ginger Rogers, George Murphy, Burgess Meredith, Alan Marshal, Jane Seymour, Joe Cunningham, Lenore Lonergan, Vicki Lester, Edna Holland and Phil Silvers. An RKO picture, produced by Robert Sisk and directed by Garson Kanin. Screen play by Paul Jarrico, from story by Paul Jarrico.

Type of Picture: "Tom, Dick and Harry" is a whimsical, Cinderella fantasy. It deals with Janie (Ginger Rogers), a small-town telephone-operator who believes that it is as easy for a poor girl to marry a rich man as to marry a poor one.

This Is the Story: In rapid succession she has three hasty, whirlwind romances with three different types of

men. The secure, energetic, ambitious type, played by George Murphy; the carefree type who doesn't believe that success is worth the headaches, played by Burgess Meredith, and the wealthy, personable, playboy type, portrayed by Alan Marshal.

In the midst of each romance she goes to sleep and conjures visions of how married life would be with each of her suitors. All of them have their good points, all their bad. It's a tough, triple dilemma for Janie to solve. She finally makes her selection, and it would be interesting to see if you would take the same one. The tip-off is this: When she kisses one of her three fellows, bells ring, symbolizing real love.

Delightfully romantic and whimsical, "Tom, Dick and Harry" light-heartedly presents the problem many girls have faced, either in real life or in their day dreams. It's an ideal woman's picture, and men with romance in their hearts will also enjoy it. To decide which of the three suitors turns in the best acting-job is a hard task; they all are perfectly cast, chalk up fine performances.

Verdict: The story is not as strong as "Kitty Foyle," nor as good. However, it will give every movie-goer a full evening of fun and entertainment. Ginger Rogers again is excellent and she has fine support from her three suitors. For real enjoyment "Tom, Dick and Harry" has "IT." —L. R.

Dear Public:

DAMNING Hollywood always has been a popular indoor sport with certain classes of people. Chief offenders are disgruntled actors who have tried to find the pot of gold at the end of the movie rainbow and failed. Next in line are politicians, who long ago learned that a blast at filmdom's capital is good for a newspaper headline any time. Finally come crusading organizations of various kinds, which usually are well-meaning but often misguided.

All of which makes the action of the Rev. Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, pastor of the Marble Collegiate Church of New York, decidedly significant. Speaking before twenty thousand delegates of the International Christian Endeavor Society recently, Dr. Peale championed the motion-picture industry, citing ten significant points, among which were:

That Hollywood was the hardest working place he ever saw.

That its people are not blase and sophisticated, but wholesome, friendly, home-loving folks.

That Hollywood would gain in pub-

lic favor and in business if the country could be shown its real character.

These are facts about Hollywood which have been related before. What makes them really important is the fact that Dr. Peale knows what he's talking about. As technical adviser on Warner Bros.' "One Foot in Heaven," the story of a Methodist minister and his wife, he has been in daily contact with Hollywood and its workers.

After long years of attack, that

such a man should speak in Hollywood's defense is significant. It proves that many statements emanating from Hollywood, hitherto shrugged off simply as a defense, are true.

Hollywood itself could do worse than remember that when this year's Academy Awards are made. It could make a special award to Dr. Peale for distinguished service to the motion-picture industry.

It wouldn't be out of place!

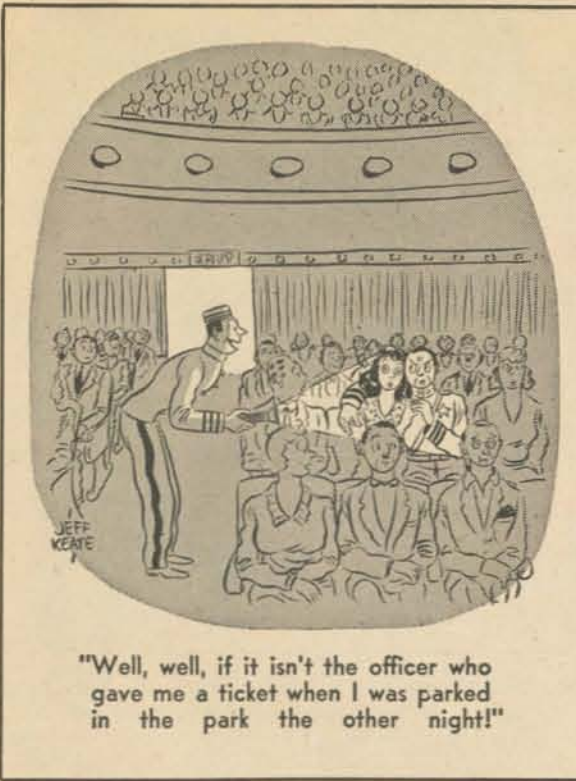

RADIO VIEWS by Martin Lewis

IN THE opinion of this writer, it's high time the quiz show cycle was brought to an end. With the exception of the more unique types of quiz shows, such as Kay Kyser's "College of Musical Knowledge," "The Quiz Kids," "Information, Please," "Vox Pop" and "Truth or Consequences," the programs are no longer sufficiently novel or entertaining to warrant continuance.

As a matter of fact, none of the quiz shows has ever reached the higher brackets in popularity surveys. Kay Kyser's program, which is a semi-music quiz, leads all the rest—and you'd be surprised to learn that many of them have a listening appeal which is nothing to brag about.

Another reason for the elimination of the run-of-the-mill type of dull quiz show is the tendency of the programs to propound questions which have been asked on other programs. A nice little racket we know of is that in which a listener hears an exceptionally odd question on one quiz program and immediately sends it to another quiz show, thus having the question repeated within a short period of time. The program committing the faux pas of course doesn't know that the sender snatched it from another show.

In hanging on to the quiz shows, radio is falling into a rut, and the

listeners are not tuning them in as they did in the early days of the quiz cycle. We suggest that something be done about them, and something done soon.

Rush New Radio Novelist Reports for Denmark Has Secret Links to Europe CBS from Moscow Freedom Station

AS WE move ever closer to actual participation in the war, our American international broadcasters are bending every effort to strengthen and intensify their radio links between this country and Europe. WBOS, Boston, now operating with its full power of 50,000 watts, inaugurated its new European beam antenna on July 1. The station has been broadcasting to Latin America regularly since January 1 of this year, when the station was moved to Boston from Pittsburgh, Pa. Operating on a frequency of 11.87 megs, WBOS now broadcasts daily from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. EST to Europe in French, and from 4:00 to 11:00 p.m. EST to Latin America. Further programs to Europe, in French, Portuguese and

friendly and authoritative answers to your questions will be given over the air by a distinguished panel of experts, which, varying from week to week, includes cabinet ministers, government officials, famous writers, foreign correspondents, as well as representatives of the common people of Britain.

General Notes

On Wednesday evening, July 9, at 9:30 p.m. EST, listeners to the German Shortwave Station were surprised to hear a broadcast of a vaudeville show put on by internees of the German concentration camp at Sanbarstal. The program had been arranged in its entirety by Henry Mollison, husband of movie actress Lina Basquette of Hollywood . . . The CBS radio commentator in Moscow is Erskine Caldwell, novelist and playwright. He and his wife were visiting a summer resort on the Black Sea when the Germans attacked the Russian frontier. There had been no radio broadcasts from Moscow prior to the outbreak of the Russo-German war since the opening of the World's Fair in New York . . . Soviet broadcasts to North America, in English, are best heard at present from 10:00 to 10:52 a.m. over RV96 (15.18); from 7:30 to 8:00 p.m. over RNE (12.00), and from 9:30 to 10:00 p.m. EST over RAN (9.60) . . . RFL (6.83), Khabarovsk, transmits press messages, in Russian, from approximately 4:00 to 6:00 a.m. The Far East division of the Soviet network with headquarters at Khabarovsk is broadcasting pep talks and propaganda fare to Russian workers nightly from about 1:15 a.m. EST on. According to Ashley Walcott of San Francisco, these programs, some of which are relays from Moscow, are best heard over transmitters operating on 9.565 and 9.545 megs, respectively . . . HER4 (9.535), the Swiss government station at Berne, is now broadcasting daily, except Thursdays, from 7:00 to 9:15

p.m. EST . . . At the time of writing, TAP (9.465) at Ankara, Turkey, is transmitting a special press bulletin to the New York Times daily, starting at 6:00 p.m. EST. The dispatches, which vary in length from 400 to 3,000 words, are read by Ray Brock or C. L. Sulzberger, war correspondents for the New York paper . . . Of special interest to amateurs is the decree of the FCC on July 9 which makes an additional 400 kilocycles available for voice communication on the ten-meter band. Radiotelephony is now authorized on the amateur band 28.1 to 30 megs instead of the 28.5 to 30 megs as heretofore. Almost immediately, should the United States enter the war amateur operators will be ordered to dismantle their equipment, but it is believed the government has secret plans under way to permit certain picked amateur stations to remain on the air for defense activities . . . "Radio Denmark" (9.71), a secret freedom station somewhere in Denmark, may be heard broadcasting daily from 12:30 to 12:45 a.m. EST. Before signing off, "Long Live the King, Long Live Denmark," is repeated in English . . . "Freedom Forum," a new London program, consisting of a discussion of subjects vitally concerning both the peoples of the U. S. A. and Britain, may now be heard Wednesdays at 9:00 p.m. EST over GSD (11.75) and GSC (9.58) . . . In answer to numerous requests, the Irish short-wave station operates as follows: On 6.19 megs, 7:30 to 8:00 a.m. and 3:45 to 4:30 p.m.; on 17.84 megs, 8:00 to 8:30 a.m., 12:30 to 3:45 p.m. and 4:30 to 5:00 p.m. EST.

English, will be added soon . . . On July 4, NBC international stations WNBI and WRCA with a combined power of 100,000 watts inaugurated a regular service beamed particularly to France and England. The new antenna used on station WNBI will operate on 11.89 megs, while WRCA will continue to operate on 17.78 megs. These two antennae beamed to Europe will increase the signal strength to Europe at least four times . . . CBS is rushing two new 50,000-watt transmitters and several new directional antennae to completion at Brentwood, L. I. . . WRUL at Boston is already providing a splendid daily program service to Europe . . . MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE
VISITS:
Fred Waring's
"Pleasure Time"

THIS Monday Fred Waring will welcome listeners to his 551st broadcast of "Pleasure Time," the five-a-week, fifteen-minute series which makes the Pennsylvanians radio's most expensive music-makers. It all started a good many years ago on Penn State College campus when Fred organized his first band, a four-man affair, composed of his brother Tom, "Poley" McClintock, Fred Buck and himself. Ambitiously, they called themselves the Pennsylvanians; hopefully, they proclaimed themselves available for fraternity dances and small-time social affairs. Adding four more men to their crew, they quit school to go professional. Waring's band plugged along as most small-time outfits until 1921, when they audaciously pioneered theater-band engagements, playing old, badly equipped movie houses with narrow stages, poor lighting—if any. But it was as a theater band that the Pennsylvanians won fame and their greatest distinction—of being a variety show within a band. Gradually they added to their act glee-club effects, comedy musicians, specialty acts, such as the famous "Dancing Tambourines," and smashed box-office record after record until 1933, when they entered radio, the last of the great bands to admit broadcasting was their future. They were a radio hit from the first. For everyone, including MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's reporter, their "Pleasure Time" is a sight to behold, as it is to hear (7 p.m. EDT, Monday through Friday over NBC). —J. C.

Rehearsals start at 1:30 daily and aren't finished until around 6:30 p.m. A rebroadcast (except Wednesdays) follows the first airing (7:00 p.m. EDT) by four hours, keeping them busy the whole evening. But "Pleasure Time's" reported weekly budget of twenty thousand dollars allows ample salaries for everybody, and keeps fifty-five Pennsylvanians happy

BANDSTAND NOTES

AS PERHAPS some of you may have noted, there has been of late a tendency on the part of swingsters to invade the field of classical music. At first it was to arrange classical tunes in swing time. Then followed a more personal sort of invasion. A lot of swing instrumentalists began appearing with musical organizations which played only classical music. This latter type of invasion brought about some fireworks the other day when Jose Iturbi, the noted conductor, openly refused to direct the Philadelphia Symphony orchestra in a performance where Benny Goodman, the King of Clarinetists, was also scheduled to appear. Mr. Iturbi, who recoils at anything remotely resembling jazz, stated that for him to appear on the same platform with Goodman would be "beneath my dignity." This is a rather curious attitude on the part of the Spanish pianist, for it is well known that he has hobbled with bazookas, having appeared on Bing Crosby's radio program. Perhaps he has suddenly become aware of his dignity as a great musician. Anyway, Benny isn't feeling hurt over the incident. When notified of Iturbi's outburst, the bandleader remarked easily, "If Iturbi doesn't appear then I guess it's up to them to get a better conductor."

Artie Shaw Also Goes Symphonic

And we mean just that. The nearest rival to Goodman's fame as a clarinetist plans to form a fifty-piece orchestra with which he will tour the country this fall. The orchestra will feature native American music of both symphonic and jazz nature. According to present plans, none of the dates which are now being booked will allow for dancing. Shaw on recent tours discovered that most people who attend one-nighters do so primarily in order to hear the band, not to dance by its music. So he figures that a straight concert will be even more profitable than a dance date.

Bandata

Will Bradley, the country's leading exponent of "boogie-woogie," is another who is studying classical music. . . . A former Hal Kemper, bandleader Skinnay Ennis is renewing old friendships, now that he is at the Palmer House in Chicago. Down the street a way is the Blackhawk, where many members of the Old Hal Kemp band are playing. They are being led by Art Jarrett. . . . This column's prediction that George Hall would surrender his baton to vocalist Dolly Dawn came true the other day. Hall has decided that he would rather be the band's manager. . . . Bandleader Henry Busse was made a deputy sheriff of a midwestern county recently, badge and all. . . . When Glenn Miller purchased a fifty-five acre ranch in California, he decided to name it "Tuxedo Junction," after one of his biggest recording hits. . . . Kay Starr, vocalist with Joe Venuti, was the victim of a couple of accidents recently. When stepping up to the microphone she tore her dress, and when stepping down she turned her ankle. The name of the song she sang was "Everything Happens to Me." . . . As some of you may know, that big dance carnival at Madison Square Garden in New York was

supposed to run for three months. Instead, the show, which simultaneously featured three big name bands, has closed after three weeks.

Sammy Kaye Inks It

Sammy Kaye's record-breaking engagement at the famous Meadowbrook has gained for the swing-and-sway man a most unique contract. The sweet-band leader has been inked to an agreement which will see him playing at the spot for at least eight weeks a year for the next ten years! . . . Lina Romay, who is currently a sensation with Xavier Cugat, was formerly with Horace Heidt. She was billed as "Josette" and had a phony French accent, remember? . . . Bandleader Anson Weeks has been forced to give up his playing of the piano. A bus accident some months ago caused an injury which has permanently crippled his right arm. It does not prevent him from working with the band, however. . . . Radio comedian Parkyakarkus is now part owner of the Palladium, Hollywood's most famous dance emporium.

Purely Personal

The stork has presented songstress Marion Hutton with an eight-and-a-half-pound boy. Incidentally, reports

have it that she will resume her singing career shortly. . . . Ella Fitzgerald has adopted a little boy from the same orphanage in which she was placed. . . . Are Mildred Bailey and Red Norvo making up? Anyway, that's the talk. . . . Another report says that Patti Andrews will marry a dancer, Al Norman. . . . Dee Keating, singer with Al Donahue's orchestra, has married Hank Maddelena, a trumpet-player in the band.

Joseph Rohner, formerly a vocalist with Lawrence Welk, is now a member of the Third Armored (Bayou Blitz) Division. He is stationed at Camp Polk, La. . . . Vaughn Monroe has added a singer who will do rhythm and novelty numbers. He still retains Marilyn Duke. . . . Helen Forrest is leaving Benny Goodman. Songstuff

The other day NBC turned down a song written by three Chicago amateurs because it sounded too much like an ASCAP song. They just couldn't be convinced that it wasn't written by ASCAP writers. The tune, "Jim," will nevertheless be recorded by several prominent bandleaders. . . . Understand "The Cowboy Isn't Speaking to His Horse" is one of the funniest novelty tunes in recent years. . . . Song-writer Jimmy Van Heusen tells me that a hit song is about as easy to write as obtaining a royal flush in poker. Not more than two out of about thirty thousand tunes submitted to song-publishers ever get into the "hit" class.

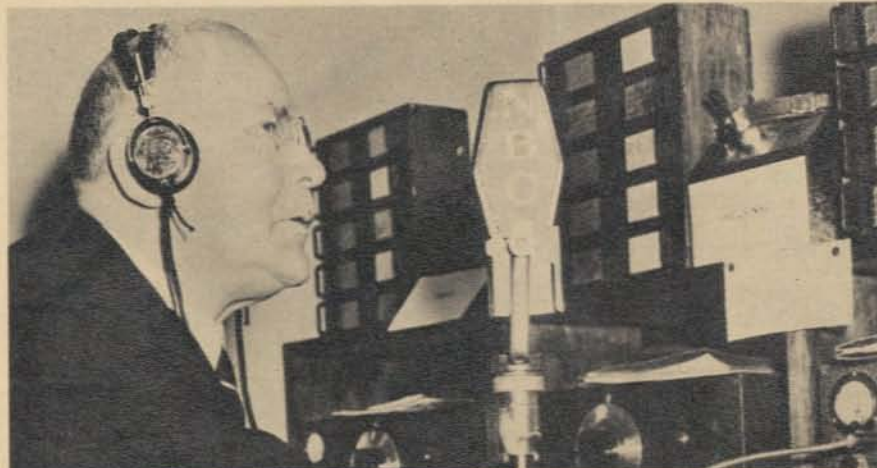

AT SIXTY-THREE, Hans V. Kaltenborn is dean of radio commentators. There are several good reasons why. Born in Milwaukee, he started a globe-trotting career at twenty by running away to enlist in the Spanish-American War, returned to become a reporter, later associate editor, on the Brooklyn Eagle. On the Eagle he made it a practise to shut up shop and travel every summer. He has made twenty-six voyages to Europe, the first by cattleboat, the last by Clipper. Eighteen years ago he began his first series of commentaries over station WEAF. That was in the "honeymoon" period of world affairs when peace and disarmament were prominent in the news. During the years which preceded a vastly different era, Kaltenborn was busy preparing for his job of news analysis. He broadcast interviews with Mussolini, Gandhi, Hitler, other world bigwigs. In Spain, he was the first man to cover a battle with a microphone. Then came Munich and Kaltenborn's spectacular twenty-four-hour feat of keeping Americans informed. Hans V. Kaltenborn had spent a lifetime in preparation; now he was ready to report World War II. He does so—brilliantly—Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, Sundays over NBC.

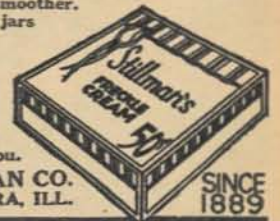

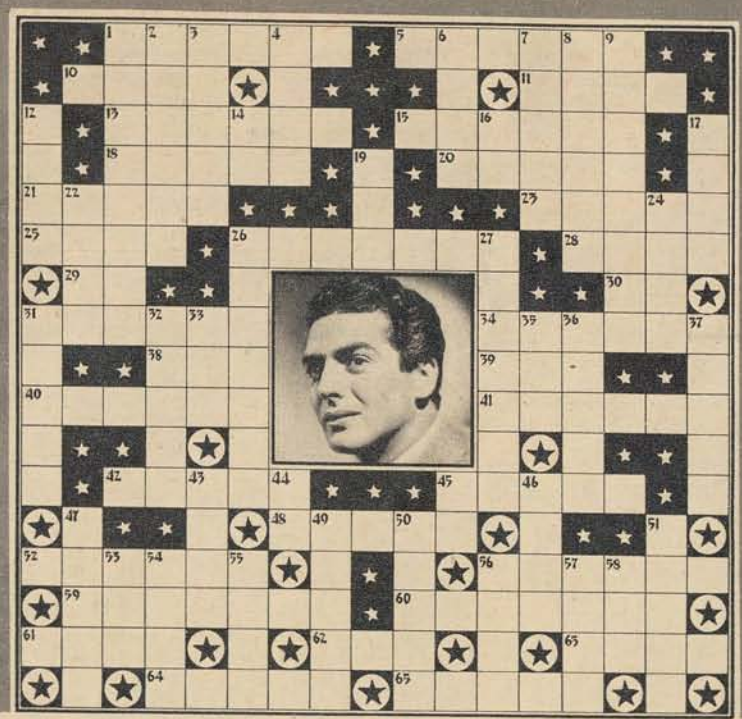
