**THIS WEEK:** Recently Edgar Bergen yielded to a nostalgic impulse and visited his old home town of Decatur, Michigan. With Bergen, of course, went Charlie McCarthy, Mortimer Snerd and company, and by nightfall of the date previously designated as "Edgar Bergen Day" this ordinarily thriving village of about 1,600 population was a packed mass of holiday humanity, with more than 10,000 persons crowded into the Decatur Athletic Field. There, after a band concert, Bergen received a tremendous ovation, the key to the city, and trotted out McCarthy and Snerd to add their thanks to his. Said Bergen to assembled newsmen earlier in the day: "Please don't misinterpret the reason for this trip. I'm not giving anything or donating anything. I'm simply having a good time visiting old friends and neighbors." Eye-witnesses report Bergen did have a good time. Old friends state Bergen hasn't changed a bit. Then there's Mr. Tommy Harmon of Michigan, recently of Hollywood, where he made a movie, "Harmon of Michigan," still more recently of the annual football game between the college All-Stars and the professional football champions at Soldier Field in Chicago. Tommy didn't play any great length of time in the game, but while he did he bucked, weaved and fought his way for considerable ground gains. For what Bill Stern, the famous sports commentator,

has to say about Tommy, see page 7. Stern, who has known young Harmon for some time, reports that fame hasn't changed him either. Which is very encouraging in a day when Brass Hats and Big Heads seem to be the rule.

## MARLENE DIETRICH Saves Baby, Lands in Hospital

IF MARLENE DIETRICH had not used her wits with the speed of lightning last week, a baby might have been seriously injured. While carrying seven-month-old David James in a scene for "The Lady Is Willing," Marlene slipped and fell over a toy auto. As she fell, Marlene's first thought was of the child, whom she cradled to her breast as she fell, swiveling herself into a position which cushioned the infant. Result for Marlene: A fractured ankle.

A record of the unusual event was preserved as the cameras ground on the scene. MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE secured these pictures by printing them directly

from the film, publishes them below together with a picture of Marlene and David (above) taken a few hours later in the Cedars of Lebanon Hospital to prove the incident was no publicity stunt.

In "The Lady Is Willing" Miss Dietrich plays a glamorous actress. One day she finds a baby on a doorstep and runs away with it. Taking the child home she names the baby Johanna, then calls a doctor, who suggests she go and see a psychiatrist when she goes crazy about the child. Her manager and secretary want Marlene to tell the police.

In scene below Miss Dietrich has just said to Aline

McMahon, "Here, I'll take the baby myself before you kill him," when (1) the colored maid comes in and says, "The police have come," (2) whereupon Miss Dietrich, turning to run out of the room, tripped on a toy auto and fell. This action, uncalled for in the scene, was one of those unforeseen accidents. However, (3) Marlene did not lose her head. She threw her body forward to save the baby and landed on her back. A propman (4) and the baby's real father (5) rushed in and picked up Marlene and the baby. Marlene's ankle was broken, her shoulder wrenched. Baby James was frightened but unharmed!

So with our "We have a war to win—" program gaining acceleration, our tax-collection agencies are going "all out" in efforts to keep the Government's sinking fund from disappearing. Hollywood and the movie industry, synonymous with six-figured paychecks, is the garden spot for the enlarged appetite of the income-tax giant.

And no line is drawn on sex. A beautiful, talented actress when stopped by a traffic officer might let loose of her "charm" and wind up with a pair of ducats to the policemen's ball instead of a date in court. But when the income-tax bugaboo hovers about, the beauty, the talent and the celluloid wiles of the actress only give her the willies! She thinks her ship has come in, and it has, only the Government holds first, second and third mortgages on it.

Hollywood's ten richest women, all of whom can describe Henry Morgenthau, Jr. (in many ways), know the spelling of the Secretary of the Treasury's name quite well. In return, Morgenthau knows that, based on salaries earned in 1938, Hollywood's "top ten" actresses would be: Claudette Colbert, who grossed nearly \$427,000 that year; Irene Dunne, receiver of about \$405,000; Joan Crawford, about \$305,000; Norma Shearer, a cool, even \$300,000; Greta Garbo, alone

with \$270,000; Ginger Rogers, nearly \$208,000; Loretta Young, about \$181,000; Deanna Durbin, an even \$174,000; Bette Davis, over \$143,000; and Myrna Loy, slightly over \$140,000.

These salaries all sound like a pretty fair load of country bucks, but even then Uncle Sam's arm was reaching deeply into the actresses' coffers. Now, with a new income-tax scale about to become a law, digging is going to be deeper.

Assuming the new tax contemplated becomes a law and assuming the salaried person in each case is married, the following are tax totals on high-bracket figures as computed by the Joint Committee of Internal Revenue of the Congress. (These figures are only approximate, but they present a clear picture of what Hollywood's ten richest women are up against under this new tax set-up.)

Tax on a \$100,000 income, joint return, would be \$53,000. Separate return, \$41,700. On a \$250,000 income, joint return would be \$159,000, separate, \$143,000. On a \$300,000 income, joint return would be \$202,250, separate \$180,000.

Missing from this dollar parade are Shirley Temple, recently absent from pictures, but who still will pay plenty under the new deal tax; Marlene Dietrich for her \$130,000; Merle Ober-

on at \$139,000, Jean Arthur, Alice Faye, Barbara Stanwyck, Joan Bennett, others. Despite their less pretentious salaries, the Government will get a lot of "national defense" out of their contributions. Remember! On \$100,000, under usual exemptions, the Government will get close to fifty percent of a star's salary! —L. R.

# KILLER GABLE Gets His Man

## A faithful re-enactment of old-time gun duel in "Honky Tonk"


IT'S a right-fine day as Candy (Clark Gable) and Elizabeth (Lana Turner) stop to admire the pretty slippers in a boot-shop window. But up comes the villain (Harry Worth) and snaps, "They're runnin' a brace game in your joint! Took me for my poke!" Candy pushes Elizabeth into the store entry and says evenly, "Glad to listen to your squawk, Mister."

"I'm through squawkin'—I'm actin'!" snarls the villain. "Draw!"

Well, you know how it is with Clark. He draws—and the result is a lively gun duel, highspot of the new Gable-Turner starrer "Honky Tonk." The scene (see pictures below) took two days to shoot, since it is difficult to synchronize properly a scene as long as this, in which two people walk down the street, stage a gun battle and then walk on.

The gun Gable (an old hand with firearms) used is a double-action Colt, lightning model, nicknamed "DA" after its action. The back of the hammer of Gable's gun is shaved off as it was done in those rough and ready days to facilitate a "quick draw," the hammer never catching on one's clothing. The gun used by Gable's opponent is a single-action Frontier Colt, "the gun" of the day—accurate, lethal and with good range. By "fanning" one of these guns you had a powerful weapon.

A most amusing situation occurred during this scene. After it had been rehearsed and Worth duly "killed," for the benefit of the camera, the villain continued to lie in the dust for two hours, patiently "dead." Cameraman Hal Rosson finally protested for the umpteenth time, "I can't stand dead men lying around—every time I look through the camera there he is." At that Worth got wearily to his feet and exclaimed, "Gentlemen, say no more about it. This corpse is going to find a shady spot and cool off."—C. S.

# SHIRLEY TEMPLE Goes Back to Work

**S**PECULATION concerning whether or not Shirley Temple failed to survive the awkward age and might be forever "washed up" in pictures is now over. Shirley not only is back at work in "Kathleen" but she has the starring role. She is earning as much money as ever and there is no doubt in the minds of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer executives that she will regain every bit of the popularity she lost when she began to grow up into a chubby little girl.

In "Kathleen," Shirley plays a motherless child who has a "split personality," is mean at times because of treatment at the hands of a difficult nurse. Herbert Marshall plays her father, engaged to a young gold-digger. The plot has Shirley conspiring to have a young doctor of psychology, played by Laraine Day, win her father's heart. The public will be treated to an advance view of Shirley as she will look when grown up through dream sequences in which Shirley dresses in an elaborate evening gown.

Among the more interesting changes in Shirley Temple during the last year is that she has let her hair, once quite blond, grow into its natural chestnut color. All of this has been achieved without artificial means, so that it may safely be assumed that the Shirley Temple you will see on the screen in "Kathleen" is definitely not "done with mirrors." Shirley today is quieter than the Shirley of several years ago.

Between scenes on the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer set Shirley plays Chinese

checkers with Mary Lou Isleb, the girl who has been her stand-in for several years. As this is written, Miss Temple is going back to Westlake School for Girls two weeks after the school's opening because of her work on the picture, but she has been tutored on the studio set so she will not be behind in her studies.

Yes, Shirley Temple is back at work for the first time in a year and a half and she loves it. She seems overjoyed to be before the camera again.

# Tommy Harmon: THE GRID KING'S INSIDE STORY

**F**IRST met Tommy Harmon three years ago at the University of Michigan when a somewhat shy and reticent youngster came to my hotel room with these words: "My name's Harmon. I'd like to be a radio announcer. How do I do it?" We sat and talked for almost three hours. At that time I had no idea that Harmon was destined to become as great as he has, but I immediately liked him for his inherent modesty.

The following year I went back to Ann Arbor to do another football game and again came in contact with Tommy Harmon. At this time he was beginning to become known for his football ability. He was a University of Michigan gridiron star, but I don't think Tommy at that time could look into the future and see he was destined to become a national figure. Again we talked about Harmon's radio-announcing career. Tommy was so interested in learning how to become a radio announcer that it was eleven o'clock before either of us knew it. As the rule is that all football players have to be in bed by ten o'clock, the lateness of the hour presented a bit of a problem. However, we smuggled Tommy out of the hotel into the rumble seat of a convertible car, slammed the rumble seat down on top of him and smuggled him up the back stairs of his boardinghouse. If you think this affected his football ability, let me say that the following day he ran wild against the University of Iowa, making Nile Kinnick seem tame in comparison.

I didn't see Tommy Harmon again until the following year, last fall. By now Tommy had become a national figure. He was doing two radio shows of his own out of Ann Arbor and was no longer shy or reticent but he was still very modest. My first experience with Tommy in 1940

was when we both returned from the West Coast on a plane. Tommy had run wild against California, Michigan's opening opponent, had made three touchdown runs of over eighty yards each. Instead of talking about his accomplishments that day, Tommy spent the whole trip telling me about his plans for the future. When we arrived in Chicago there were bands massed at the airport to meet Tommy. It was only then that I remembered this was his twenty-first birthday. The entire Michigan alumni of Chicago had turned out to welcome him.

The next time I saw Tommy was before the Penn game at Ann Arbor. By this time Tommy knew that he couldn't miss All-American—that he

couldn't miss a job in radio—that he was on his way to Hollywood—but he was just as modest as he had been.

As I said a moment ago, Tommy had two radio shows. One was on a Saturday morning and Tommy asked me to go on as his guest. We began checking whom we thought would win the day's games, when Tommy threw a question at me and I replied, "This is merely a question of deciding which of the two teams is the lousier." Tommy's face went white. After we got off the air he came to me in all seriousness and said:

"Bill, my radio professor is going to be very mad at you. The first rule they teach us at Ann Arbor is never to use the word 'lousy' on the air."

Five weeks later I again ran into Tommy Harmon, this time in Hollywood, California, rehearsing with Bing Crosby for the "Kraft Music Hall." Tommy was now an established success. Yet I think his parting remark to me showed very clearly just what kind of a boy Tommy is. Tommy, Bing and I were at NBC in Hollywood. Tommy looked around and I will never forget his remark:

"This sure is a big place for a little guy like me."

You've got to like a guy like that!

### Hayden Quits Hollywood

From Gloucester, Mass., comes the press-release that Stirling Hayden has quit Hollywood to "live his own life." **This is the Story:** A convict released from prison goes back to his brother's plantation home, is forced to live in the stables while he trains horses. The hero in the person of Jack LaRue makes friends with his six-year-old niece, trains a winning race-horse. Back into his life comes the man whose testimony sent him to prison and who now threatens to break the heart of the child by buying the horse she loves. The plot moves swiftly to a climax in which the horse saves the child, kills the villain.

**Verdict:** "Gentleman From Dixie" is one of the most unusual pictures of

It is astounding to note that this picture was produced for a sum less than \$22,000 by its producer, Edward Finney, who marks himself with this effort for a Darryl Zanuck future. —C. S.

### "The Pittsburgh Kid": A Review

Cast: Billy Conn, Jean Parker, Dick Purcell, Alan Baxter, Veda Ann Borg, Jonathan Hale, Ernest Whitman, John Kelly, Etta McDaniel, Dick Elliott, John Harmon, et al. A Republic picture, produced by Armand Schaefer, directed by Jack Townley. Screen play by Earl Felton, Houston Branch.

**Type of Picture:** This is one of those films in which a professional fighter plays the hero. Many doubtless have read the Octavus Roy Cohen story which ran serially in *Collier's*. This is the screen version.

**This is the Story:** When a popular young prize-fighter's manager dies, his daughter takes over the job of piloting him. She is secretly in love with him, does her level best to prevent him from falling in with tough promoters as he shies from taking advice from a woman. The story is melodramatic, takes on its most thrilling aspects when Billy Conn, who nearly stole the real-life heavyweight crown

from Joe Louis, gets into his fight scenes.

Movie-goers will be astonished at the good looks and personality of Billy Conn, who as a result of this picture will receive so many movie offers that he can't be blamed if he gives up prize-fighting for good. Conn has the looks of Bob Taylor and the ruggedness of Gable, plus the happy factor that he is really believable when he fights because he knows his job. Jean Parker is the delightful little heroine of "The Pittsburgh Kid" who shares honors with Dick Purcell, excellent in his comic portrayal of the sports reporter.

**Verdict:** This hasn't the smooth quality of a big production, which shouldn't bother movie-goers who are used to falling asleep watching the big ballyhoo pictures. It has thrills for everybody and is worth your price of admission. —L. R.

### 'Ladies in Retirement': A Review

Cast: Ida Lupino, Louis Hayward, Evelyn Keyes, Edith Barrett, Elsa Lanchester, Isobel Elsom, et al. A Columbia picture, produced by Lester Cowan in association with Gilbert Miller and directed by Charles Vidor. Screen play by Reginald Denham and Garrett Fort from the Broadway play by Messrs. Denham and Edward Percy.

**Type of Picture:** Here's a chiller-diller of the most thrilling and heavily emotional type; two insane women are the motivation of a slightly unbalanced sister's murder of her benefactor.

**This is the Story:** As in the stage play, with modifications for the purpose of passing the Hays office self-imposed censorship code, Ellen Creed (Ida Lupino) makes her life's work the unreciprocated care of her two demented sisters (played by Edith Barrett and Elsa Lanchester most convincingly and weirdly). To prevent them from being sent to a London

insane asylum, she prevails upon her employer, Miss Fiske (Isobel Elsom), to invite them as guests to her country home where she, Ellen, is employed as housekeeper. After six weeks of them, Miss Fiske is thoroughly fed up with their peculiarities and her nerves are about to give way. She orders the sisters removed from her house—whereupon Ellen plots and executes her murder. But she runs into many difficulties, one of the greatest of them her nephew by marriage (Louis Hayward), who makes the country home his refuge after absconding with funds from the bank where he was employed, and who soon guesses she is the murderess.

**Verdict:** An adult piece, but a very, very good one. In fact, it is one of the best of its type, and encomiums are deserving by the entire cast, with special mentions to Ida Lupino and Edith Barrett. —E. P.

MUSIC NOTES: The Philadelphia Orchestra has again contracted with Mutual to broadcast its fall and winter concerts on an exclusive basis. That "two-thousand-mile downbeat" which Andre Kostelanetz was to have given his orchestra on August 24 from Mexico City did not come off "advertised." Telephone trouble in Mexico caused it to be canceled at the last moment ... Sir Thomas Beecham is again the guest conductor for the CBS Symphony Sunday. Sir Thomas made his American debut in 1928, when he directed the New York Philharmonic. At that concert, immediately following the first number, he was seen to walk off the stage with mincing steps. The audience was vastly intrigued. Said Sir Thomas to those standing in the stage wings, "By Jove, I must have overdid it, my braces snapped!" After getting them repaired he returned and resumed the concert. The sixty-two-year-old musician, who has conducted the world's greatest orchestras, inherited his taste for music from his father, Sir Joseph Beecham. He also inherited \$150,000,000 from the old girl Sir Thomas, however, still likes to conduct.



"March of Time" may return; Crosby slips off to South America

### GENERAL

#### Radio Set Shortage Seen

NEW YORK.—Although the OPM is doing its best to obtain the materials necessary for the continued manufacture of radio receiving sets, the problem is becoming more and more acute, according to a report by that office. All producers of radio sets are required to accept defense orders, regardless of their non-defense contracts. Some government officials estimate that radio set manufacture may be reduced by as much as seventy percent.

#### No Propaganda, Please

NEW YORK.—NBC has notified the directors of all its sustaining programs that they cannot use music of propaganda nature, no matter what the cause. The network recently turned thumbs down on a request to broadcast the tune "V for Victory." The network declined to say why the British propaganda song was refused.

#### CBS Expands Chicago Staff

CHICAGO.—In a move to enlarge its talent staff to take care of expanding program schedules, WBBM-CBS in Chicago has added several well-known radio entertainers. From "National Barn Dance" station WLS come the Prairie Sweethearts, singing guitarist Rusty Gill and "Little Swiss Miss" Christine. Other additions are guitar virtuoso Les Paul, piano duo Al Nielson and Bill Moss, and Bill Alexander's orchestra, with Elizabeth Hall as singer.

#### Your Radio—If War Comes

WASHINGTON.—Preparations have been made by the Defense Communications Board to have every radio in America become a means of conveying air-raid warnings and distributing official announcements in event of war. The plan would call for a regional hook-up for the first-named, and a national hook-up for the last. The 880 radio stations would remain in private hands.

#### Singing Coeds Get Chance

NEW YORK.—College songstresses of the nation are to be given a two-minute shot at fame and fortune via the "Hour of Charm" program. Beginning September 28, for the following ten weeks a female singer from some college or university will be featured in a two-minute solo spot on each show. Each of three finalists in the contest will receive a \$1,000 prize.

### TRAVELING

#### "Town Crier" From London

NEW YORK.—Alexander Woollcott, famous writer who was formerly radio's "Town Crier," is going to London to make a series of broadcasts to this

country based on his observations abroad, it has been announced by CBS.

#### Bing Pulls Sneaker

HOLLYWOOD.—It became known last week that Bing Crosby, still vacationing from his radio hour, had quietly and secretly slipped away aboard an unnamed boat bound for South America, where he and his brother, Larry, will engage in a bit of horse trading and buying in the Argentine.

#### Shirer in Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD.—William Shirer, CBS Berlin correspondent and author of the best-selling "Berlin Diary," arrived here September 6 to confer with film executives as adviser on the forthcoming picture, "Passage from Bordeaux," and to meet CBS officials. Shirer's new air series, "William Shirer and the News," was launched last Sunday, September 14, over CBS.

SOME months ago several of our readers reported reception of a mysterious station believed to be located in Aden, Arabia. Many listeners unable to hear the station even doubted its existence. Our readers were right. Not only does such a station exist but three lucky listeners, namely Jack Gardner of Cleveland, Ohio; Fred Borchardt of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and L. M. Clark of Scarsdale, New York, have received definite letters from Aden, Arabia, confirming their reception. According to H. S. Bindon, the engineer in charge of the station, ZNR (12.12), Ras Boraldi, Aden, Arabia, has a power of 250 watts and operates daily from 10:28 to 11:45 a.m. CST. Items included regularly in the programs are as follows: 10:28 a.m., identification announcement in English, sometimes preceded by recorded music; 10:29 a.m., identifica-

scribed programs, preferably music and comedy. We don't care how old they are—they'll be new to our gang. We've been in these jungles two years now and it begins to look like we're gonna stay here a while more to protect the Canal against attacks from the sea and from the air. How about it? Can you help us out?"

NBC could and did help out the lads in the Panama jungles. Hundreds of records—two thousand of them to be exact—containing a total of one thousand hours of the most up-to-date entertainment available from such artists as Jack Benny, Bing Crosby, Eddie Cantor and many others, as well as some special records made up especially for the Jungleers, were packed in four great smash-proof cases and have been dispatched to the boys by Army transports.

### Live for Jarman's Junglemen

"This is a voice from the jungle and we're in a helluva fix!"

That cry of distress, relayed to NBC from thirty thousand isolated U. S. soldiers who are stationed at almost two hundred isolated anti-aircraft artillery positions in nine hundred square miles of wilderness surrounding the Panama Canal, set wheels in motion which resulted in the shipment of two thousand pounds of recordings of top-flight NBC musical and dramatic programs to short-wave radio stations PCAN and PCAC, the pride of the "Jarman Jungleers."

Clay Doster, master sergeant and editor and publisher of the PCA News, writing to NBC explained that the local military radio stations PCAC and PCAN were on the air four hours every day, but that they were running desperately short of material. "We have just finished distributing more than two hundred receivers to our jungle posts," wrote Sgt. Doster, "but they're not much use to the gang out there. What we gotta have is tran-

"CITIES SERVICE CONCERT" (Friday, NBC) is an ideal radio show in the sense that it is better heard than seen. Nevertheless, a visit to Radio City's largest studio on a Friday night points up some interesting facts about this solidly popular broadcast, which came to the air in the pioneer days of radio—1927.

Most obvious is the impression that a giant share of responsibility for the presentation must be borne by iron-gray-haired Dr. Frank Black, the director. Pyramiding individual directorships such as Cities Service on his strenuous duties as general musical director for NBC, Dr. Black has his finger in a huge amount of the music which radio produces. On Cities Service Concerts he and producer Paul Dumont have presented some of the best of that music—and between them a neatly timed, almost flawless performance is whipped up during a concentrated morning's four-hour rehearsal.

Another impression one receives on seeing the broadcast is the easy teamwork with which soprano Lucille Manners and baritone Ross Graham cooperate with Dr. Black and the orchestra. Both are real musicians with a feeling for the total effect of the music rather than for their own personal accomplishment. Neither has the traditional "temperament" of artists.

Cities Service musicians aim to present not-too-highbrow, not-too-lowbrow music—and do it a little more perfectly than any other broadcasters. Fourteen years of popularity seem to be the proof of their success. —J. C.



THE radio public knows Fred Waring chiefly as the guiding genius of the Pennsylvanians, one of the finest and highest paid musical organizations in radio, heard on the always enjoyable "Pleasure Time" (Mon. through Fri. evenings, NBC). Listeners know him as a musical expert, a master showman and a master of ceremonies who sounds like the sociable, likable fellow he is. But beyond his musical activities, which would seem to be enough of a career for anyone, there is much more to Fred Waring and his life. Fred is the designer of, among other things, an electric iron and drink mixer,

a promoter, a music publisher and an all-around shrewd businessman. And even beyond all his professional enterprises he finds time for relaxation with the members of his band and their families at the Pennsylvanians' lodge, Shawnee-on-Delaware, Pa. The lodge is a former inn which adjoins Fred's summer home. It was bought by Waring and refurbished to accommodate the Pennsylvanians and their families. 

IT'S never too early to instill in a young girl the importance of preserving the youthful loveliness of her skin, hair, teeth and figure as insurance against the future. It's a rare youngster who doesn't relish getting into mother's rouge pot and powder box, and it's a wise parent who knows that this desire to "dress up" can be the foundation for lifelong habits of good grooming.

Joan Leslie, the young star of "Sergeant York," credits the meticulous care of her nails to the fact that at ten she was given her own little manicure kit, complete to colorless polish. It filled Joan with such a feeling of importance that she became a juvenile crank about her nails from that day forward.


