Bing and Dinah

Poll-Winning Singers Are Paired at Mike Abroad and At Home, But Have Never Guested on Other's Show



HE calls her the "Dixie Diva," and she calls him "the King." But to dialers they're radio's singing twins, whose talents are so in demand that their careers as well as their voices have become a continuous duet.

They have full names, of course, but in Hollywood they're simply "Bing and Dinah." If you don't know them by their first names your dials must be rusty or your records dusty.

A few weeks ago Armed Forces Radio Service, which prepares and records the famed "Command Performance" program—as well as a multitude of others—for the fighting men overseas, called upon Bing and Dinah to head as brilliant a cast of Hollywood stars as has ever faced a mike. There were Bob Hope, Frank Sinatra, Judy Garland, Jimmy Durante, Cass Daley, Frank Morgan, the Andrews Sisters and Harry von Zell enacting the characters in the Dick Tracy cartoon series, but for Dick himself the soldiers wanted Bing and for Tess Trueheart, his sweetheart, they demanded Dinah.

The whole thing made a program so tuneful and funny it's being whooped up for the next Bond Drive.

Dinah's Admiration

The pairing of Bing and Dinah in radio goes back a couple of years, but to Dinah at least it goes back a lot further. Dinah says she used to buy every Crosby record that came out. Long before the world knew there was a Dinah Shore Bing was "the King" to her. He used to have a fifteen-minute program that reached Nashville at four in the afternoon and found Dinah always curled in front of her loud speaker waiting for Bing's noodling of "When the B-Blue of the Night . . ."

When Dinah came to Hollywood

for the first time in 1940 with the Eddie Cantor program, she had just one ambition: to meet Bing. But she couldn't quite get the nerve to go up and introduce herself. She slipped into the studio where Bing was rehearsing and sat far back in a corner alone.

Tom Harmon and Benny Rubin found her there one day and pushed her up on the stage.

"How are you, Dinah?" said Bing. "I've listened to you often."

It took Dinah a long time to get

over that. Imagine "the King" listening to her! But the second time Cantor came west, Dinah headed for Crosby's studio immediately. This time she could laugh with Bing over her earlier bashfulness, but her admiration of "the King" has never dimmed. She regards Bing as the most completely successful man she has ever met.

Dinah's apartment, which she shared with three other girls—Actress Shirley Mitchell, Singer Kitty Kallen and Dinah's secretary, "Rufus" Crain—was tagged "the Charm

School" by Crosby, who liked to drop over for a cup of coffee and a few laughs when business affairs got too troublesome.

The opera-symphonic people came to Bing for help in raising funds through a George Gershwin concert. "I'll do it if you'll get Dinah to sing, too," he said.

Dinah was flabbergasted. She says that when she faced an audience of several thousand people at the Shrine Auditorium, with Bing across the mike from her, she was more

is actually the result of ten hours of hard work by the members of the program's cast.

It is one of the most carefully-rehearsed programs in radio. Rehearsals for the Sunday show begin on Thursday evening when Bracken, Ann Rutherford, Bill Demarest, Janet Waldo, and the supporting players gather with producer Mann Holliner around a big table in Studio C in Hollywood Radio City.

After a preliminary reading, the show is done "on mike" for the first time. On Friday night, after another rehearsal, the show gets its premiere performance before a preview audience.

Final rehearsals occupy all of Sunday afternoon, almost up to air time. So far, not a single line has been muffed.

"No other radio show can make that statement," says Bracken. He's got his fingers crossed.

Who's Excited?

It was good to see capable Verna Felton again portraying a straight dramatic role. On the "Lux Radio Theater's" presentation of "A Tale of Two Cities," Verna (better known as "Blossom Blimp") stood out as the blood-thirsty "Madam De Farge," who brought about the death of the play's hero, Orson Welles. She won the admiration of the whole cast, including Mr. Welles, who openly praised her fine work.

During the Sunday rehearsal, "something" slipped up and gave the cast its biggest laugh. If you remember the play, you will recall "Madam De Farge's" evil chant, "Fifty-two heads shall fall today." The climax is reached when here, Sydney Carton's head makes the fifty-second. But—as the drums dramatically rolled and the hero made his last martyred speech, Verna caught in the tense excitement of the moment shouted out, "Fifty-four."

"Oh," moaned Verna, "I don't know what happened. It just came out."

Jap Menu

Letters written by Americans recently released from the custody of the Japs in the Philippines have been heard of late on CBS' "Meet the Missus"—among the most stirring of which was one postmarked "Manila—March 6, 1945." It read:

"... in February, 1944, the Japs got meaner. They stopped all contact with the outside. It went from bad to worse in the last six months. We were getting a cup of lugao for breakfast. This, we ate with salt (if we had it). There was no milk. Even 'Butch' (the baby) didn't get any. Then, at noon, we got a six-ounce canful of some greens boiled up in water and salt. That's all. At supper, we got some kind of greens or soy beans boiled up in water and a small scoop of rice. And that's all. When the rice ran out, the Japs issued coarse ground corn. This is one experience I'll never forget. It's im-

or a suit or a coat as she can by producing an artistic painting. In fact, the same elements of perfect composition of line and harmony and contrast of color tones are just as important in a costume as they are in a picture."

Then and there, the mikeman turned to free-lancing.

Today, he still keeps exceedingly busy (he announces NBC's "Kraft Music Hall" and "The Great Gildersleeve," the Blue's "One Man's Family," and "Command Performance;") he narrates such screen features as "Unusual Occupations," "Speaking of Animals" and Army training films; and does occasional picture work, (his latest film being "Weekend at the Waldorf"), but his time is regulated so that he can fully enjoy his home and his family—his wife, Betty, and son, Ronny, who is now fifteen years old.

The Carpenters have been married for twenty-two years. "We were college sweethearts," smiled the mikeman, "'way back when." WITH the airing of March 29, KNX's "Citizen's Forum" celebrated its fifty-second week of broadcasting. Sponsored by the Citizen's National Trust and Savings Bank of Los Angeles, "Citizen's Forum" is a public service program designed to demonstrate democracy in action.

It brings to the airwaves weekly an enlightening half-hour discussion of timely, provocative topics by the people best qualified to talk about them. On controversial subjects, both views are equally represented by the four persons chosen to participate in the forum.

Produced by Del Castillo, the program is a non-audience show, has had onlookers on only one occasion, when the topic of discussion was

"Los Angeles Plans for Prosperity." Four hundred businessmen attended and took part in an hour's discussion of the subject before the actual broadcast began. This particular program was jointly sponsored by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, and brought to light the city's plans for postwar production.

Each week, the program's participants meet early on Thursday evening, have dinner together at seven and enjoy a preliminary discussion of the night's topic. At nine, the group adjourns to a KNX studio, to spend the half-hour immediately preceding the broadcast testing their voice levels and the program's procedure at the microphone. Only a skeleton script is employed, and only when Army or Navy personnel participate on the broadcast is a censor present.

Hottest Topic

• Hottest controversial topic that has been brought before the "Citizens' Forum" was the subject, "Shall the Japs Return to California?" By the end of the broadcast, the heated debate had every member of the panel talking at once, and KNX's switchboard was flooded with phone calls from frantic Californians who wanted to have their "say" on the subject.

On another occasion, when the topic under discussion was "Should India Be Free Now?" the members of the panel debated the subject calmly during the program, but after the broadcast, when the discussion was resumed, one of the participants lost his temper and left the room.

Dr. Wallace Sterling, professor of modern history at Caltech and CBS news analyst, acts as moderator for the forum. He keeps the discussion flowing smoothly, and when it is time for it to be brought to a close,

he signals to the members of the panel by raising his broad, clenched fist.
