necessary for the actors to speak broken English when they are supposedly talking in their native tongue? The illusion is destroyed by this anachronism.

Why do many news commentators say "YOUR" announcer when it is really their own announcer. None of us wants title to an announcer.

Why is it necessary to keep up the maddening clatter of a squealing telegraph instrument before and between certain broadcasters' lines? Unnecessary noise should be totally eliminated. (Winchell and Dispatch from Reuters.)

And why are men allowed to read news reports when they have not taken the pains to learn to pronounce commonplace American names of places properly, much less foreign cities or districts? A few hours' study of other languages will give the key to correct pronunciations. Particularly so in German where one of the first rules you learn is that there are no accented syllables in the German language: each syllable has an equal value.

This is for the sound effects man. The clicking of heels during a dramatization is very often vastly overdone and misplaced. You hear the characters talking as they walk in a room. Are we to believe that there are no rugs on floors or stairs in modern fine homes? They all sound like the barren hall of an office-building.

And still, despite previous protests, the buildups announcing the featured player continue to blast one's ear drums. A quiet, distinct announcement is much more effective from all points of vantage.

DYNAMIC DOROTHY

She HAS discovered the secret of perpetual emotion." The lady so credited is dynamic Dorothy Thompson, who brings to her new Sunday evening Mutual Don Lee program, "Topics of the Day," all of the crystal clarity and understanding of the political and human scene that has made her one of the two most influential and widely quoted women in America.

From a gawky, tomboyish daughter of a Methodist minister, living in up-state New York, she has become an imposing international figure, femininely handsome with soft gray hair, dressing inexpensively with visible disregard for clothes and with a capacity for work and laughter unmatched.

First signs of the crusading spirit that is Dorothy Thompson were seen when she entered the feminist movement on the campus at Syracuse University. After graduating, she was an organizational worker for woman suffrage and stumped New York state.

Typical of her boundless enthusiasm was her first newspaper assignment. After three years of publicity and advertising work, her restless spirit sent her to Europe.

She free-lanced in England and Europe, gaining the attention and ad-

miration of Fleet Street when she brought in the last interview given by the famed Irish hunger-striker, Terence McSweeney. Newspaper and article work sent her dashing all over Europe . . . by bribing a palace guard she interviewed Empress Zita in Budapest after the second Karlist putsch; wearing an evening dress, she covered the Pilsudski revolution, and was almost shot while in Bulgaria.

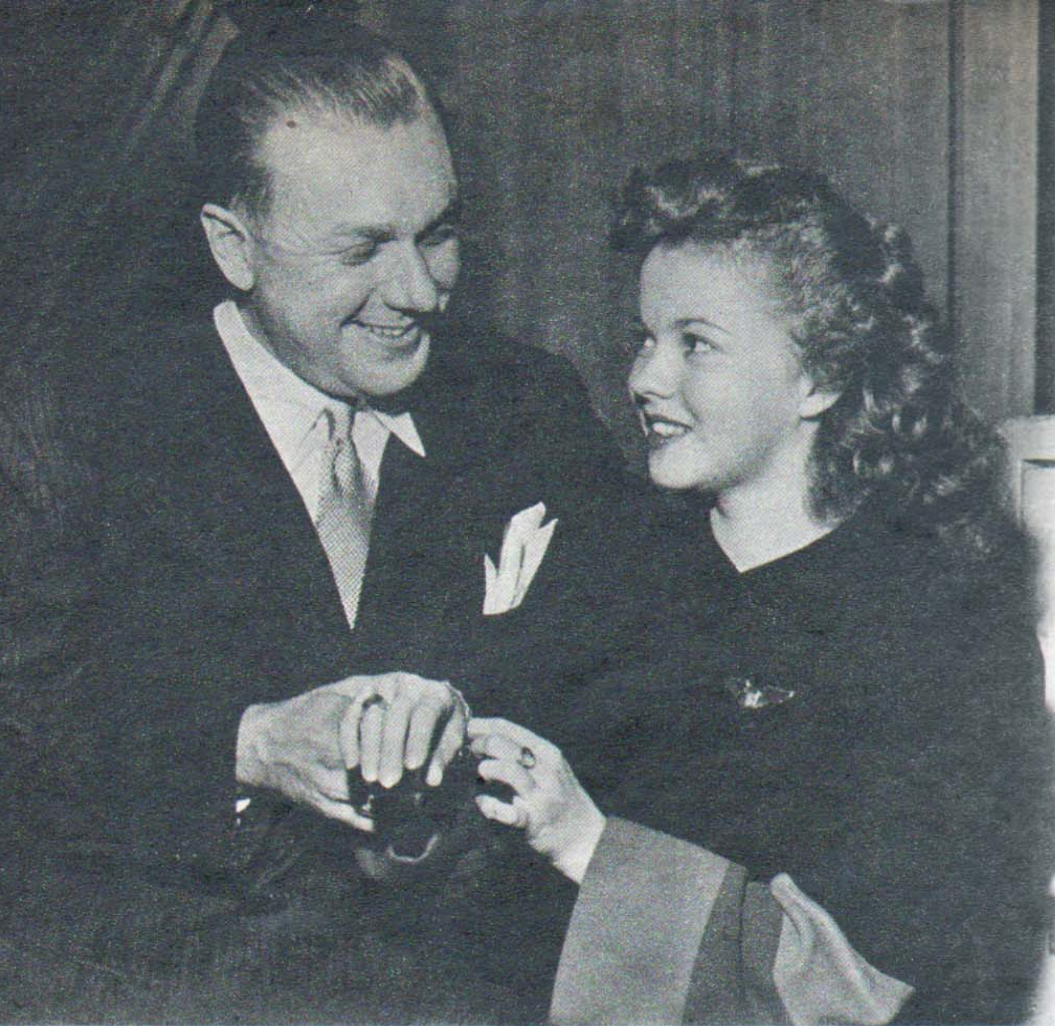
To Berlin

In the words of John Gunther, "She blazed her way through Europe like a blue-eyed tornado." The crest of this tornado carried her to Berlin as chief of staff for the *New York Evening Post* and *Philadelphia Public Ledger*, the first woman to hold such a journalistic position.

Her book, "I Saw Hitler," published in 1932 after an interview with the German leader, was the beginning of her crusade to warn the world of the rising tide of Nazism. She reported the Nazi revolution in Germany in a series of articles for the *Saturday Evening Post*, incurring the displeasure of the Nazi regime, so much so, that in 1934 she was expelled from Germany for "numerous utterances and writings hostile to the Third Reich."

Undismayed, she continued her fight against the Nazi menace, becoming a widely syndicated columnist

philosophy. He never searches for gossip, but those facts which make the star as real as you or I. Therefore, Hollywood likes and respects Erskine Johnson.

Show Important

The thirty-two-year-old, six-foot, columnist-commentator's present Jergen's show, "Tonight in Hollywood," is a pretty important thing in his life. After having done a previous fifteen-minute spot, "Hollywood Spotlight," five nights a week for two-and-a-half years, he now finds new "leisure time" which can be spent at home with wife, Isabelle, and their two youngsters.

"Don't think," he hastened to explain, "that I didn't enjoy doing the 'Hollywood Spotlight.' I did, for it was swell training and lots of fun while it lasted. Only thing that worried me was whether I'd last or not."

He likes to brag a little about the guest on his second broadcast. That was one of the nights when Franklin D. Roosevelt spoke, with all of the programs, including Erskine's making way for the president's talk. "You can't go higher than that, now can you?" grinned Johnson.

"We understood," Radio Life told the columnist, "that with only one show a week and all of your picture commitments finished, you practically live a life of leisure."

"Huh," grunted Erskine in answer, "do you call writing a daily column and a weekly show, a life of leisure. Gosh, no. For my own peace of mind

Hollywood's Biggest Fan

Columnist Erskine Johnson Admits He's Completely Glamor Struck; Can't Remember Names; Bites His Nails; and Doesn't Like to Talk

ERSKINE JOHNSON, who has interviewed hundreds of personalities, admitted with a shy grin to Radio Life that when people interviewed him, he didn't know what to say. "Gee," he confided, "there's nothing different about me. I like my work, I'm a family man, and I'm Hollywood's biggest fan."

What Erskine — affectionately tagged "Skinny"—calls being "Hollywood's biggest fan" has resulted in a

nation-wide syndicated column and a weekly fifteen-minute radio show. This "fan stuff" all began when Skinny was a boy. He was completely movie struck and never missed a picture at his neighborhood theater. He laughed and he cried in all of them and when he came out he swore it was the greatest picture he'd ever seen. He hasn't changed a bit. He still does it.

He doesn't like to be disillusioned when seeking out his glamor and happily reports he rarely is. This is probably due to his own good-natured

I have to keep four days ahead on the column and six weeks ahead on the show, or I'd worry myself sick. I'm the world's worst worrier."

Wife Understands

It seems he worries so much about his unfinished work that he's miserable if he's forced to do anything else. "Isabelle's used to my uncivil ways," he laughed. "If friends come to call when I feel I've got to work, I'm in a daze until she excuses me and sends me off to my den."

His den is his sanctum. Upon his oak-paneled walls he pins notes he has jotted about people, alongside notes to himself reminding him of things to do. One by one these notes come down from the wall and are disposed of. "Heaven help the person who tampers with the papers on my desk," he muttered.

"You know," he continued, "there are a couple of things you ought to know about me. I hate to admit this,

but—I can't remember names. Isn't that awful? Look"—pulling a piece of paper from his pocket—"I've even got yours written down."

"And, believe it or not," he laughed, "I don't talk very much. I've found you learn the most by sitting still and listening. Yep," he concluded with a wink, "it works."

"On my very first radio show, the whole family listened in. Only comment my mother-in-law would make was 'Skinny, that's the most you've said in fifteen years.'"

Newsman at Heart

Asked if he had any virtues upon which he prides himself, he announced that working his way up

from a court and police reporter to his present status has given him his biggest thrill. "I'm a newspaperman at heart and darn proud of it."

"I used to think being early was a virtue. Gosh, I'm an hour ahead of everything. But"—with a shrug—"I just have to sit and wait in my car."

On the other side of the fence, he confesses he's nervous—"There was a time when I couldn't hold up my own script"—and he bites his nails.

Isabelle, seven-year-old Kathleen, four-year-old Ronnie, and Erskine live in a house in View Heights. When people quiz him as to why he doesn't move closer to Hollywood, he answers "nothing doing." He's lived

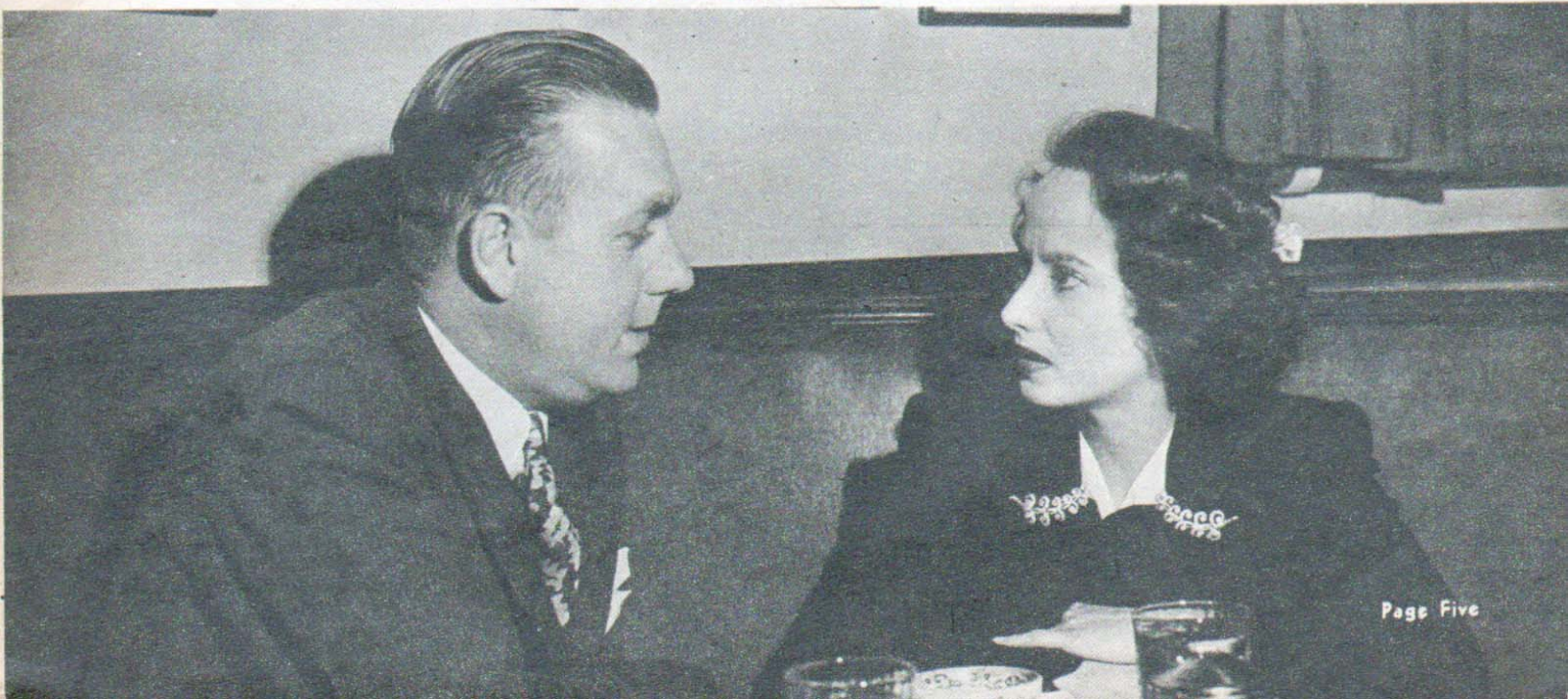
there all of his life and besides he knows the butcher, the baker, and the laundry man too well.

"Not much else to say about me. I'm just a family man at heart," he pointed out. "Live a very normal, everyday life."

Except Friday—we might add. Because into Friday's radio show goes everything that Erskine has to give; a lot of hard work, nervous worry, and his specially dramatized incidents featuring the guest stars.

But the nicest thing about Friday to Erskine is that he can portray his favorite role in presenting his favorite stars; that of being "Hollywood's biggest fan."

"I'll show you," she said with a twinkle in her eye, whereupon, she pulled out a huge sheet of ledger paper from her handbag and unfolded it. quisitiveness of all youth as well as an amazing capacity for asking embarrassing questions.

Two of Hollywood's best known radio actors are regular characters in the Charlotte Greenwood show. Charles Cantor, who is Finnegan on "Duffy's Tavern," plays Judge Cronin who recently stepped down from the bench to enter private law practice. John Brown, well known for his work with Jack Carson and "Date with Judy," plays William Anderson, who is managing editor of the newspaper in Lakeview, the mythical town which serves as the setting for Charlotte's weekly adventures.

Martin Broones, who is Charlotte's husband as well as her business manager, handles her radio show. Thomas Freebairn Smith produces the program and it is written by Jack Hasty, who long wrote for Al Pearce and "Dr. Christian," and Don Johnson, who was with Fred Allen for many years.

The Charlotte Greenwood legend rightfully takes its place alongside those of Will Rogers and Marie Dressler. Her emergence as a national institution, however, is no overnight mushrooming. Twenty years ago she made headlines when President Coolidge invited her to the White House for breakfast—the first and only such invitation he ever tendered. More recently Charlotte can recall three trips to the White House as the guest of President and Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt. Nor is Charlotte's fame tied down by boundaries. One night in London she played before five Kings and four Queens.

The Greenwood program is all the more outstanding by virtue of the star's dominance and long experience in three different fields of entertainment. Broadway will not soon forget her brilliant reputation as a comedienne—nor her box office receipts. Charlotte enjoyed her greatest triumphs in the four-year run of "So Long, Letty" and the three-year run of "Leaning on Letty," which toured the United States and closed in Australia in 1939.

In London, Charlotte starred in three plays—"The Gay Deceiver," "Three Sisters" and "Wild Violets," which played for one year at the Theatre Royal in Drury Lane.

At home Charlotte revels in her rambling, spacious country-style house in Beverly Hills. All the windows in the back of the house look out on her tennis courts, flower beds and blue-green swimming pool. Charlotte considers her flower garden very practical because all the flowers serve individual purposes. For example, she cuts the roses for house decorations. She picks a camellia every day to wear. Charlotte's pink camellia bush was a gift from Stella and Leon Errol. Her yellow rose bush was a gift of William Gaxton and a red rose bush was given her by Mrs.

Thomas Meehan. Charlotte's flowers are constant reminders of her friends.

Charlotte's garden is adequately supplied with orange, lemon and banana trees. From the latter she picks brilliant red and yellow blossoms for table decorations. Winkle, Charlotte's pet dog, lazily wanders around the garden from the red-brick barbecue pit to the thick vines which cover the grill fence.

Postwar plans will convert the interior of her house into a world of icy blue walls and carpets with big splotches of white. Chintz covers for her furniture will be the same color as her swimming pool—a languid blue-green. Mahogany inside the house will be bleached a grey-white and the entire decorative scheme will be complemented by flowers. Among Charlotte's most prized possessions are eight vivid flower paintings by the famous sculptor, Epstein.

Having a horse named after her stood Charlotte in good stead recently when she sent Producer Darryl F. Zanuck a most unusual note for an interview. Enclosed with a picture of Australia's Charlotte Greenwood, the note read something like this: "I know as a glamour girl I will never get into your office, but as a horse I might!"

for the *New York Herald-Tribune*. Her column, "ON THE RECORD," now in 125 newspapers with a circulation of 7,500,000 was originally intended for women, but drew an even wider masculine audience.

Thrice married, once to Sinclair Lewis after a cross-Europe courtship in 1928, she is the mother of a son, Michael, born in 1930. She divorced Lewis in 1942 and married Maxim Kopf, refugee Czech painter, whom she met while sitting for a portrait.

Miss Thompson is a member of the American Academy of Political and Social Science and honorary Phi Beta Kappa, she holds numerous honorary degrees from U. S. and Canadian colleges. She delights in German cooking, has been twice named by Durward Howes, editor of "American Women," the standard biographical dictionary of notable women, as one of the ten most outstanding women of the year, winning his nod in 1937 and 1940.

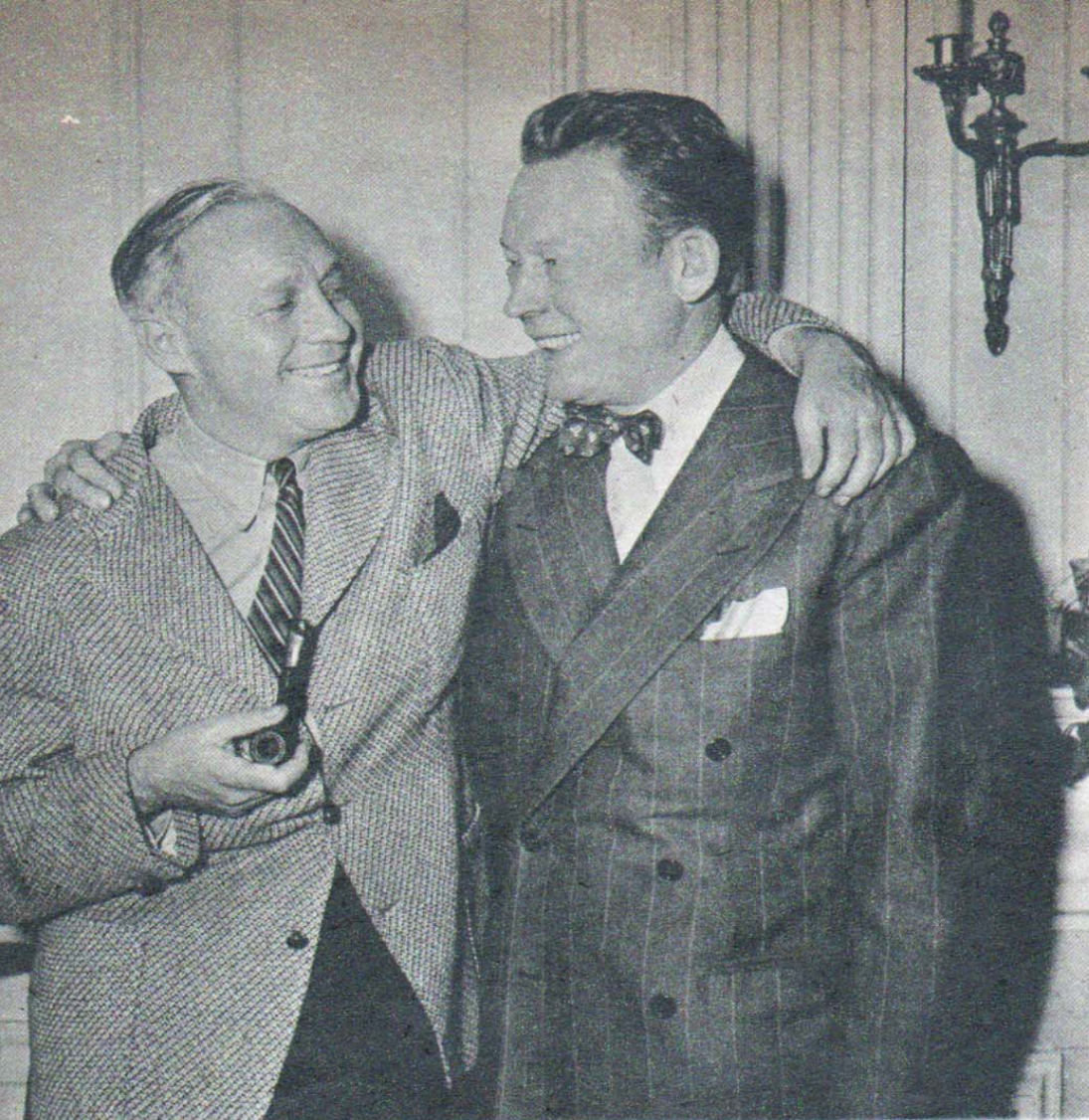

BEA: Jack Benny is waiting in the outer office.

HICKS: Oh good, good . . . Tell him I'll see him in a few minutes, I'm in conference right now.

BEA: Yes, sir.

Sound: *Door opens and closes*

Airs Opinions

HICKS: Now as I was saying, your opinions interest me, and I'd like to hear more of them.

FRED ALLEN: Well, first of all Mr. Hill . . . I don't want you to think that I have anything against Benny personally.

HICKS: Oh, of course not, Mr. Allen!

(APPLAUSE.)

FRED: And I'd be the last one to try to get his job because I've always admired Benny.

HICKS: Well after all, Fred, how could anyone dislike a man like Jack? . . . A man who last year was affectionately nicknamed after General Patton . . . Old Blood and Guts Benny.

FRED: Old Blood and Guts Benny? . . . You mean Old Toupay and Wrinkles . . . Old Blood and . . . Why last week his doctor took a sample of Benny's blood and sent it to the laboratory to be analyzed . . . It came back with a note saying . . . "Congratulations! Put an olive in this and you've got a martini! Blood Benny wasn't brought by a stork—he was brought by a leach.

Sound: *Click of phone, slight pause before door opens and closes fast*

Grand Entrance

JACK: Hello, Mr. Hill, I'm sure glad to see you . . . Here, have a cigarette.

MARY: Hello, Mr. Hill.

JACK: Now I don't mind telling you, Mr. Hill, that—

HICKS: Hello, Mary.

JACK: Now I don't mind telling you, Mr. Hill, that you're one of the swellest guys I've ever met . . . not because you're my new sponsor, but because you're one of the finest fellows in the world, one of the squarest, grandest guys that ever—

MARY: Oh Jack, stop pinching his cheek.

JACK: Oh, oh . . . Well Mr. Hill, here we are, yes sir . . . ready to get off to a great start on our new radio series.

HICKS: Well Jack . . . that's what I wanted to talk to you about.

JACK: Thanks, Freddy boy . . . I was just telling Mary and Mr. Hill how much I've missed you.

FRED: Yes sir, Jack . . . it's great being together again.

JACK: I'll say it is!

MARY: It couldn't sound more unbelievable if they were Roosevelt and Dewey.

JACK: Please, Mary . . . Fred and I are good pals . . . Tell me, Freddy boy, what are you doing here in Hollywood?

FRED: Making a picture . . . I'm over at United Artists.

JACK: Oh yes, yes . . . I heard that Boris Karloff isn't there any more.

FRED: Yes, yes . . . and I heard that since you've been with Warners, the studio isn't there any more.

JACK: Now listen here, Allen—
