The Ear Inspires the Pen

Sirs: Great indignation is felt here in San Diego over the so-called "new policy" at KFI which has resulted in the peremptory dismissal of some of the ablest and most popular commentators in radio. The "new policy" amounts to nothing more than KFI's arbitrary assumption of the right to "fire" newscasters whom station executives personally don't happen to care for, regardless of the fact that sponsors have, in some cases, gone to great trouble to secure the services of these men, and that they have a tremendous following.

The excuses offered in the face of the uproar evoked by this high-handed action, have been irritatingly feeble. At first there was the implication that the commentators had been discharged for lack of "background." In view of the distinguished careers and world-wide contacts of these men, this ridiculous excuse was promptly laughed down, and was hastily followed by the explanation that the station had to drop an equal number of what it chose to call "liberal" and "conservative"

newscasters. The answer to that is that while the so-called "conservatives" have been replaced with others of like viewpoint, no similar consideration has been shown to the auditors of so-called "liberals," who comprise the vast majority of the radio audience.

The important fact is not that this arbitrary action by KFI shows a contemptuous disregard of the radio audience. The important fact is that that radio is a responsible medium of public information, and that it is outside the prerogative of any station owner to attempt to influence the free dissemination of news by threat, either overt or implied, of loss of employment.

KFI's statement as to policy regarding sponsored commentators reads in part, as follows: "Many commentators deliberately make controversial issues out of factual news stories. By stirring up controversy or making attacks on prominent individuals, they seek to develop an audience for themselves. There is an important place in radio broadcasting for discussion of controversial issues, but when such issues are aired, it should be done fairly, factually, and as impartially as possible. That is our aim. This can best be accomplished by means of a forum or round-table type of program. This station will continue, as in the past, to provide time for the discussion of controversial questions by means of forum programs or in other impartial manner.

"Therefore, in order to maintain our standard, and be impartial, sponsorship of all local commentators was discontinued. This policy applies only to KFI. KFI will continue to carry the commentators of the National Broadcasting Company. No issue of free speech is involved in the discontinuance of sponsored commentators.

"KFI has always been strictly non-partisan. No preference is given to any individual or group interests. KFI does not have any editorial policy. The only news broadcast over this station is that which is received through the world-wide news services of the Associated Press and United Press, two of the three American news gathering agencies operating throughout the world. KFI contracts with these news gathering agencies to furnish it their full and complete service, just as they do for the daily newspapers. This news is not changed before broadcasting. The highlights of the news for each day are selected and arranged in logical sequence for broadcasting.

"Under our policy, KFI listeners are assured that they will get all the important news, impartially analyzed, and that there will be no attempt to influence public opinion on any question. A radio station has a definite responsibility and duty to the public. KFI has always endeavored to fulfill this responsibility by maintaining a high standard of broadcasting. The Supreme Court of the United States in a recent decision stated that a station is obliged to reserve to itself 'the final decision as to what program will best serve the public interest.'"

SHE MOST delightful thing about friendly Francia White is that she ably fits the description of the perennial June bride. (Well, almost. She was married on May 26). She is pretty, she glows like a bride, she speaks adoringly of her new husband, and her head is filled with thoughts of houses, furniture, linen, and silver.

But also, like the June bride of 1945, he is a war wife. Following a happy two month honeymoon, husband Captain Bernie Thompson, was off to another part of the country and Francia became co-star with Felix Knight of the "Electric Hour."

Born in Greenville, Texas, Francia has lived most of her life in Southern California. From her mother, Phoebe Reed, a noted concert singer, she inherited a gift of singing and started training at an early age. Throughout her school days she was active in musical events and at sixteen was soloist with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra.

With members of the studio audi-

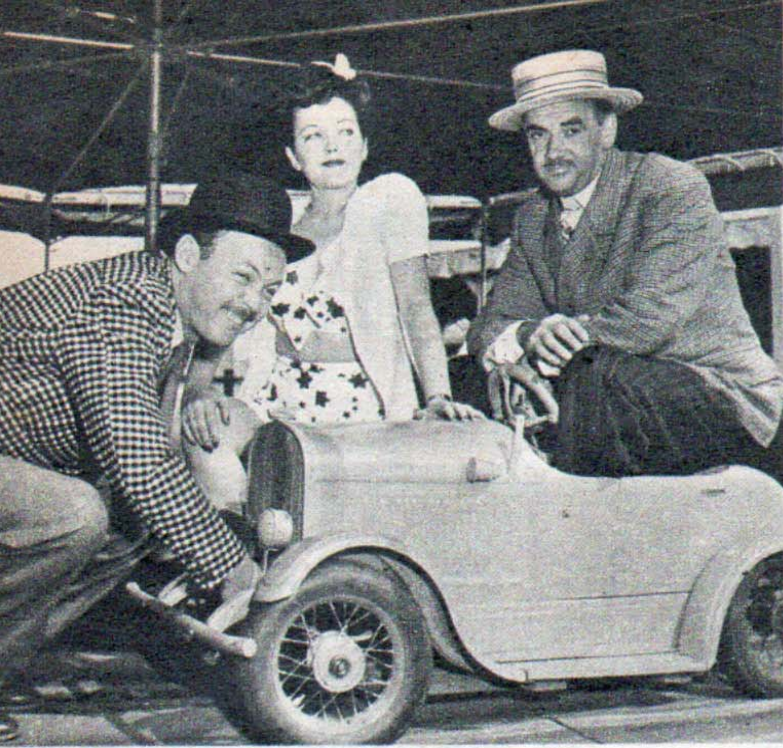
ence and guest stars participating, Bailey and Keating bring to the microphone a half-hour of gags and gimmicks, plus cash prizes totaling five hundred dollars.

He Creates the Groaner's Music

When John Scott Trotter First Heard Bing Croon, He Got an Idea Which Culminated in 324 Happy Broadcasts Of Blended Harmony on Beloved KMH

THINGS have a way of shaping up surprisingly," observed John Scott Trotter, whose old Negro Mammy in North Carolina used to tell him "to sit still and wait for things to happen; not to hurry to get their way." "Being the sort of person who likes to sit, I do just that, when I don't know what to do next. However, I keep my mind on some definite objective at the same time," he acknowledged with the warm smile which keeps his musicians happy and cooperative.

It was back in 1936 that John Scott Trotter, then a member of Hal Kemp's band, as musical director and pianist, first heard Crosby sing. Bing's vocal style amazed and intrigued him. Listening to Crosby

records and broadcasts, he became convinced that here was a voice which should be free to phrase a melody, unhampered by the simultaneous playing of the melody in the accompaniment. "This, of course, was not a new idea," explains Trotter. "It has been the general rule in classical music, but it had never been adopted by the so-called 'popular' musicians."

Evolves New Style

One day John Scott tried out his idea. He evolved a new style of composing the accompaniment to a popular song. "There was harmony, a bit of an obligato, a rhythmic figure, but something was missing; this was the melody; in this particular case, the Crosby voice."

"However," he continues, "I couldn't see much of a future in this sort of

The Saga of John Scott

HE WAS born in Charlotte, North Carolina in 1908. His sister was taking piano lessons when John was about eleven. When she went away on a holiday, he sneaked in, got hold of her book, practiced his way through the pages and emerged able to play everything in it, as well as several pieces he picked up.

He had a lot of musical company at the University of North Carolina, where he, Hal Kemp, Ben Williams, Saxie Boswell, Skinny Ennis and Harry Pond formed a jazz band, which they continued after graduating from the University.

Trotter has never married, but has recently bought a ranch with rambling Colonial farmhouse, (formerly belonging to noted Hearst motion picture columnist, Louella O. Parsons), located in the San Fernando Valley. Here he has been joined recently by his parents and sister.

He studied architecture in the University of North Carolina and one of his hobbies is designing new and daring ideas to incorporate in his ranch house, after the war. He is a collector of antique furniture and recently acquired an entire dinner set of old Willoware, which has sent him scurrying around California in search of ancient Chinese bric-a-brac to accompany it.

He likes to swim, about his only form of exercise, with the exception of his "farming," which now requires concentrated activity on his part, because of the shortage of labor.

He likes to remember:

Standing in front of Chopin's grave in the cemetery of Pere-Lachaise in Paris : : : Having "trifle" at an inn at the entrance to Warwick Castle : : : Hearing Prokofieff play his "C Major" concerto with the Chicago symphony, conducted by Dr. Frederick Stock : : : Hearing Leopold Stokowski and the Philadelphia Orchestra for five consecutive nights in the Hollywood Bowl : : : Having roast beef at Simpson's in London : : : Hearing Arturo Toscanini conduct Debussy's "La Mer" : : : Having dinner in a different restaurant each night for three weeks in Paris : : : Walking in the gardens of Versailles : : : Driving through New England in the spring : : : Giving the "down beat" on his first Kraft Music Hall performance : : : Seeing the Constitution of the United States in the Library of Congress in Washington.

Star Story

One day last week Radio Life was lucky enough to meet the new Metropolitan Opera tenor, Richard Tucker, and his pleasant wife who are spending a couple of months in Hollywood while Tucker is starring on the summer Westinghouse program over NBC. They made us like them right away, because they were so enthusiastic about California (and this was their first trip here).

Tucker told us he was, to his knowledge, the only cantor ever to be taken from the synagogue into the Met family. From the time he was a small boy in Brooklyn until he made his Met debut three years ago, he sang, year in and out, for his congregation. Then, the break he was sure, deep down inside him, would come, did come, and with it, radio assignments on "Chicago Theater of the Air," and now filling John Charles Thomas' summer spot.

A stocky chap with nice brown eyes, Tucker told us he practices every morning for an hour and a half and that he is an ardent baseball, football, and handball player. It seems that the fine weather in California constantly tempts him to go swimming. He and his wife are also consistent radio fans and like all kinds of fare, including popular music, both sweet and swing. "I'm dying to cut a rug!", exclaimed the tenor, "but I've never done it yet."

The Tuckers were anxiously awaiting a letter from the older of two sons, a seven-year-old who stayed behind to attend a New York camp. "Next to my wife, he's my severest critic," laughed Tucker.

Tucker said he is never one to get nervous and that the night of his Met debut, all his associates were worried because he WASN'T jittery like most singers. He also holds the distinction of being one vocal star who thrives on a big meal before singing. Before an appearance, he usually stows away steak, French fries, green salad, and lemon meringue pie.

To a modest Los Angeles family came the almost unheard-of thrill of talking to their soldier son in Honolulu. On NBC's "Everything for the Boys," Mrs. Sally Isaacs and her three children talked with the absent mem-

ber of the family, Second Officer Charles Isaacs of the Merchant Marine, in a naval hospital at Honolulu.

Charlie was a navigator on a Liberty ship "suicided" off Okinawa several months ago. The plane hit right in line with Isaac's stateroom knocking him out of his bunk and onto the deck. His only unfulfilled ambition is to be a motion picture producer and don't be surprised if reaches his goal in the near future.

Flourishing Wonderfully Today
On Facts, Golf and a Few Hard
Knocks He Won't Easily Forget*

SPEAKING OF BONERS (and he dares to recall them), George Fisher might be qualified to write a book about the things. It was a boner—sometimes more gently referred to as a faux pas—which introduced young Fisher's name to the front pages of every paper in America.

That was back in 1937 when George, a comparatively unknown columnist, substituted for Winchell on the Jergens Journal for nine weeks. Young George, whose proverbial nose for news was well developed even then, gambled everything on a hot tip about the Duke of Windsor. Unfortunately, Fisher was not only wrong but grossly misquoted, thereby, cutting short his fine, new entry into radio.

Waits Two Years

Returning to the job of publicity director for a local station, Fisher patiently awaited another crack at radio. A radio gossip columnist at that time was a novelty and George knew if he ever received the chance to say the right thing that he'd be on his way. The chance came some

two years later. Not only did he wish to reinstate himself but to impress the head of a large studio, as well, who was bidding for his services.

Poor George! He did it again! This time it was the studio head who didn't speak to him for three years—in addition to cancelling their impending deal. It seems in trying to make a favorable impression upon his 'future boss,' George went all out in reviewing his latest picture, one very dear to the magnate's heart. Only George gave directorial credit to a rival studio's fair-haired boy, one *not very* dear to the magnate's heart. It was September, 1944 before George again appeared as an airplanes regular.

Things weren't as bad as they sound. In the ensuing time, Fisher spent nine months in the army, as well as proving himself a capable columnist. Last September he took over the vacated Erskine Johnson spot for Thrifty's "Hollywood Spotlight" heard five nights a week.

George, himself, is a very personable young man who admits he must have been "quite a punk" back in the days of '37. The past eight years have not only mellowed him but have gained for him a repu-

tation as a square shooter. He has blue eyes, brown hair and shows a sartorial preference for vividly colored ties and shirts.

His Schedule

As a columnist-commentator, Fisher spends three days out of five covering the studios; five nights out of seven covering the night spots; and every Wednesday, come what may, on the golf course. He makes a point of knowing everyone and is deeply hurt when he feels people are nice to him only because they fear him. He is always in a hurry and has an unintentionally abrupt manner. He loudly laments the fact that he doesn't get enough sleep.

To his apartment high atop Whitley Terrace, he returns every evening by five and with the day's assembled news begins to write the script for that evening's show. He never works ahead on his scripts and if anything, is sometimes behind schedule. He makes a point of interviewing his guest stars in their homes and takes copious notes, now being a stickler for accuracy.

He subscribes to three book-clubs, and never reads the books. Instead he may delve into philosophical masterpieces or the newest issue of Time. He hates being alone, eating alone, living alone.

His wife, dancer Nica Doret, has

EACH TUESDAY noon finds a gay chattering group lunching at Mike Lyman's on Radio Row. There is a charming lady who looks like 'mama.' The gentleman looks like 'papa.' The pert, blue-eyed, blonde-haired girl looks like sister and of course, the boy looks like little brother. They even sound like a family, complete with friendly bickering, the sound of four tongues wagging at once, and lots of giggling.

Well, they are a family—and they aren't a family. 'Father'—John Brown

—will tell you that he is becoming as fond of Louise and Dix (the kids, of course) as he is of his own two youngsters. And 'Mother'—Myra Marsh—confesses to worrying over their adolescent problems at home as well as on the air. So you see there's more to the "Foster Family" than meets the ear on the weekly adventures of NBC's "Date With Judy."

Live All Week

In fact, Aleen Leslie, writer of the series, claims the actors are so like the Fosters that she often con-

ceives the idea for next week's script by listening to their off-mike conversations. "Judy" isn't a character who comes to life only on Tuesday afternoons, but flourishes effectively twenty-four hours a day in the person of Louise Erickson. John Brown, Myra Marsh and young Dix Davis, too, appear as real Fosters in the eyes of Miss Leslie and producer Helen Mack. "It's wonderful," they happily exclaim in unison.

Myra Marsh, who plays Dora Foster, needed no practice when she

stepped into the role of air mother to the irrepressible Judy. A perennial 'mother' type, Myra played her first maternal role in stock at the age of nineteen and throughout her long career on the legitimate stage, in movies and in radio has always been in demand for that type of characterization.

Entering radio when it was still a fledgling art, she played longtime roles in William Farnum's "Drums" and Kay Van Riper's "English Coronet" series. Her movie roles number more than forty, of which eight were as movie mother to child star, Jane Withers. With her adopted son, George in Okinawa, Myra takes the

problems of young Miss Erickson to heart.

"You know," she exclaims in much the same wise manner of "Mrs. Foster," "I like to feel that I'm of aid to Louise in solving any of her problems. It's like having a daughter of my own."

Though he rarely does it, John Brown, the harassed father of Judy Foster, can express his exasperation in any of a dozen foreign dialects. For ten years Brown has been appearing on the air as a dialect comedian, reaching the peak of his career, he says, when he told the

same joke for four comedians in one week—each time with a different accent.

With Allen, Benny

Brown made his radio debut in 1934 with Fred Allen and soon was a regular fixture of the Mighty Allen Art Players. When he joined the Jack Benny troupe in the fall of '43 he moved to Hollywood with his family. As the happy father of nine-year-old Jarod and five-and-a-half-year-old Julie, he enjoys portraying the lovable, hot-headed papa Foster because he feels he derives good par-

SAILORS aboard big transports talk about it almost as soon as ships leave the States, and several days before a soldier lands in the South Pacific he gets his first introduction to GI Radio—"The Mosquito Network."

Booming out across the blue Pacific through a series of thousand watt transmitters, the Mosquito Network brings home-style radio entertainment to men who sail the big ships and the thousands of soldiers, sailors and marines stationed on islands fringing along the equator.

Programmed by the best America's four major networks can furnish through the Armed Forces Radio Service, and staffed by men who were top-notchers in civilian radio, Mosquito Network stations are providing thousands of American, New Zealand and French troops with "quality" radio.

A typical Mosquito Network outlet is the AFRC Station in New Caledonia, headed by Lt. R. W. (Bob) LeMond. A former CBS-Hollywood announcer, LeMond has surrounded himself with a group of radio men

Radio Staff

M/Sgt. Paul Masterson, program supervisor, was a former Blue Network announcer in Hollywood, and S/Sgt. Bruce Collier, production manager, was commercial manager of KFYO in Lubbock, Texas. Chief engineer S/Sgt. Billy Baldwin is a part owner of Station KORN, Fremont, Neb., while the other half of the engineering staff includes Cpl. Bill Cole, a studio engineer at WAGE, Syracuse, N. Y., before entering the Army.

Marine S/Sgt. Jack Briggs, announcer of Beverly Hills, Calif., was under contract to RKO-Pictures before entering the service, and Sgt. Hy Averbach, announcer, was a Los Angeles free lance radio actor. Other program men include Sgt. Joe Juba, Clairton, Penn., and Cpl. Charles Posner, Los Angeles. Before joining the Army, Posner was well known in radio circles having done agency work with Young and Rubicam, and worked for a time with WLW, Cincinnati.

LeMond and his men are responsible for many outstanding broadcasts not only to South Pacific listeners, but audiences in America as well. From New Caledonia the Mosquito Network short-waved for NBC both the Jack Benny and Bob Hope

programs when the two comedians visited the South Pacific on USO tours.

Unique Broadcast

Outstanding perhaps, of all Mosquito Network broadcasts was one on Christmas Day from tiny Norfolk Island. Unique in the fact that a lone American soldier is stationed on Norfolk, the little island has a story-book air about it, since all the inhabitants are descendants of the famed mutineers of the "Bounty." After two flying trips to Norfolk with Paul Masterson and Bruce Collier, LeMond set the stage for a Christmas "Army Hour" pick-up that drew wide and favorable comment from radio circles.

The Mosquito Network has its share of "commercials" too, with spot announcements urging food conservation, war bond purchases and malaria control. There are programs on orientation and education, and LeMond and Masterson have a two-man newscast each day at noon that's listened to from Australia to the New Hebrides.

One of the things GI's like most about the Mosquito Network is the tag used in broadcasts from enlisted men's dances: "From the beautiful New Caledonia Paradise Club, just 6,500 miles off the coast of Southern California, it's been music by . . ."

Nice—but 6,500 miles! . . . The tag will sound better coming from Catalina!

thing, with Bing Crosby in California and myself in New York. It was at this time that Fate moved in on me. Hal Kemp and his organization had been a co-operative band for ten years, nearly all of us having started at the University of North Carolina in our college days. Then, Kemp decided to scrap the co-operative idea and become a corporation and I decided to strike out on my own. I sat down to figure things out. And I sat and sat, with nothing happening to give me an inspiration. Then I made up my mind I would take a vacation and do a little traveling. I went as far as Denver with the band, then continued along to California. I saw all the wonders of this beautiful state—Yosemite, Sequoia, Death Valley, Palm Springs, Coronado, Del Monte, finally coming to a pause in the house of a friend, Johnny Burke." At this point Trotter beamed through his glasses and dismissed the KMH band for an hour.

Nothing Missing

"Johnny Burke," he went on, "was working on a Crosby film, 'Pennies from Heaven.' One day somebody suggested that I arrange the title

song for the picture. Fate had taken me by the coat collar. I was ready to take advantage of that offer, having experimented with the Crosby accompaniment a long time before. All this time, too, Bing had been conscious of my work. Skinny Ennis was singing with the Kemp band and Crosby had listened and liked the arrangement that built up the rather thin, but distinctive voice of the singer. I made the arrangement for 'Pennies from Heaven' and this time there was nothing missing—Bing Crosby was there!"

For Trotter, this first excursion into a Bing Crosby accompaniment is a wonderful memory. Usually Bing sings his songs in an enclosed recording booth; for the picture, "Pennies from Heaven," the song was sung in the actual scene, with Bing seated in front of a fireplace, with a child on his knee telling a bedtime story in song. The atmosphere of the song, the setting, the strings and woodwinds of the orchestra and, most of all, Bing's singing created a truly moving scene.

This first association of Trotter and Crosby was short-lived, as just prior to making the arrangement for "Pennies from Heaven," Trotter had accepted the position of musical director of American Record Company in New York, motoring across the continent in the same car in which he had come to California. No sooner had he settled into his new job than he received a wire from Bing: "How about taking over the musical direction of my radio show?"

"In no time flat I was on my way back to Hollywood," declared Trotter. "The date of my first broadcast for Kraft Music Hall was July 8, 1937. Since that time, (until I took my first vacation in the fall of 1943), I have been on hand every Thursday for 324 broadcasts."
