MY BUSINESS !

ABBOTT: BUT YOU DUMMY . . . YOU NEVER WIN . . . WHY DON'T YOU QUIT?

COSTELLO: I CAN'T. THAT'S THE WAY I MAKE MY LIVING !

ABBOTT: COSTELLO WHAT DO YOU DO WHEN THE TRACK IS CLOSED?

COSTELLO: I RIDE MY LITTLE BROTHER AROUND THE PARLOR PIGGY BACK AND
THROW DOLLAR BILLS OUT OF THE WINDOW.

ABBOTT: TELL ME COSTELLO, HOW DO YOU PICK YOUR HORSES?

COSTELLO: I PLAY NOTHIN' BUT HUNCHES ABBOTT, AND FRIDAY NIGHT I HAD A TERRIFIC HUNCH!

ABBOTT: YOU DID?

COSTELLO: YEP...I HAD SEVEN CODFISH BALLS FOR SUPPER. THEN I WENT TO

BED AT SEVEN O'CLOCK AND ALL NIGHT I DREAMED OF NUMBER

SEVEN! SO THE NEXT DAY I BET SEVEN DOLLARS ON THE SEVENTH

HORSE IN THE SEVENTH RACE!

ABBOTT: WHAT HAPPENED?

COSTELLO: HE RAN SEVENTH &

ABBOTT: COSTELLO, YOU'VE GOT TO STOP THROWING MONEY AWAY ... WHAT
DID YOU DO WITH THE FIVE DOLLARS I LOANED YOU YESTERDAY?

COSTELLO: I LOST FOUR DOLLARS OF IT BETTING ON THE FIRST FOUR RACES.

ABBOTT: WHAT ABOUT THE OTHER DOLLAR?

COSTELLO: (SADLY) I SPENT THAT FOOLISHLY!

ABBOTT: NEVER MIND THAT COSTELLO...TODAY I WANT YOU TO PIAY

"SEA SOVEREIGN 8" I HEARD HE WAS A FAST HORSE 8

COSTELLO: FAST HORSE ... ABBOTT THAT SEA SOVEREIGN RUNS SO FAST THEY
HAVE TO TIE A KNOT IN HIS TAIL TO KEEP HIM FROM RUNNIN!
OUT OF HIS SKIN . What a line?

ABBOUT: COSTELLO, THAT'S THE KIND OF A HORSE FOR YOU TO BET ON!

COSTELLO: O.K. I'LL BET TWO DOLLARS ON HIM TO RUN THIRD!

ABBOTT: YOU NIT WIT..HE'S A FAVORITE!...YOU SHOULD BET ON HIM TO RUN FIRST!

COSTELLO: ABBOTT, WHY SHOULD A NICE HORSE LIKE SEA SOVEREIGN STRAIN
HIMSELF FOR MY LITTLE TWO DOLLARS.

ABBOTT: COSTELLO YOU'RE AN IDIOT...IF YOU WANT TO PLAY TWO

DOLLARS FOR THIRD, WHY DON'T YOU PLAY A LONG SHOT LIKE
"HONEST MOE"?

COSTELLO: HONEST MOE?..I WOULDN'T BET ON THAT HORSE...LAST TIME I

BET ON HIM HE STOPPED IN THE MIDDLE OF THE RACE, WALKED

OVER TO THE RAIL AND ASKED ME IF I HEARD WALTER WINCHELL

THE OTHER NIGHT.

ABBOTT: WELL, WHAT'S WRONG WITH THAT?

COSTELLO: HOW CAN A HORSE RUN IN THE DAYTIME IF HE STAYS UP ALL NIGHT LISTENING TO THE RADIO!

ABBOTT: COSTELLO YOU ARE GETTING DUMBER EVERY DAY! HOW CAN A MAN

BE SO STUPID AND LIVE SO LONG!

COSTELLO: (PROUDLY) I TAKE GOOD CARE OF MYSELF!

ABBOTT: COME ON COSTELLO..WE'LL WALK OVER TO THE STABLES AND I'LL
TRY TO TEACH YOU SOMETHING ABOUT HORSES!

COSTELLO: GEE THAT'S NICE OF YOU ABBOTT..HEY! WHAT'S THAT LITTLE HORSE OVER THERE?

ABBOTT: COSTELLO, THAT HORSE IS A FILLY...A WELL BRED FILLY!

COSTELLO: ABBOTT I NEVER HEARD OF A BREADED FILLY: IN MY HOUSE IF WE ARE LUCKY ENOUGH TO GET A FILLY..MY MOTHER BROILS

IT! ... ONCE IN A WHILE SHE BREADEDS THE VEAL CUTLETS..

BUT NEVER A FILLY!

ABBOTT: NO NO COSTELLO: I'M TALKING ABOUT THIS HORSE...THE HORSE

COSTELLO: A FILLY STEAK HORSE?

ABBOTT: THAT'S RIGHT!

COSTELLO: BOY! WHAT UNCLE ARTIE STEBBINS COULD DO WITH HIM!

IS YOUR UNCLE ARTIE A TRAINER? ABBOTT:

COSTELLO: NO, HE'S A BUTCHER!

NILES:

IF WE CAN PICK SOME WINNERS .... WHO DO YOU THINK

WILL WIN THE FIRST RACE?

COSTELLO: I'M HAVIN! A LOT OF TROUBLE WITH THAT FIRST RACE

ABBOTT .... THERE'S ONLY SEVEN HORSES IN IT !

ABBOTT: WHAT'S WRONG WITH HAVING SEVEN HORSES IN THE

FIRST RACE?

COSTELLO: I GOT NINE TIPS

ABBOTT: COSTELLO I SHOULDN'T HAVE COME TO THE TRACK WITH

YOU IN THE FIRST PLACE! YOU KNOW NOTHING ABOUT

PLAYING THE HORSES.

COSTELLO: I DO SO! BETTIN! ON A RACE IS JUST LIKE GETTIN!

MARRIED. YOU PUT UP TWO DOLLARS AND WONDER WHAT

YOU'RE GONNA GET !

BLANC: (SLIGHTLY OFF) (CRYING) OH THIS IS TERRIBLE,

WHAT WILL I DO? WHAT WILL I DO?

ABBOTT: SAY COSTELLO, WHAT'S THE MATTER WITH THAT POOR FELLOW?

LET'S SEE IF WE CAN HELP HIM.

COSTELLO: O.K...WHAT'S THE MATTER MISTER?

BLANC: (ON) (HICCUP) I BE W HERE AT THE TRACK SINCE YESTERDAY

(HICK) AND I'M AFRAID TO GO HOME...I LOST ALL MY MONEY

AND IF MY WIFE FINDS OUT ABOUT IT SHE'LL KILL ME (CRIES

AND HICK) I CAN'T GO HOME WITHOUT MY MONEY....

COSTELLO: GEE ABBOTT, WE GOTTA HELP THIS POOR GUY.. HOW MUCH DID YOU LOSE?

BLANC: THIR (HIC) THIR (HICK) THIR....

COSTELLO: THIRTY DOLLARS?

BLANC: NO-SEVEN FIFTY!

COSTELLO: HERE, TAKE THIS SEVEN FIFTY AND GO HOME AND YOUR WIFE
WILL NEVER KNOW THE DIFFERENCE.

BLANC: GEE THANKS PAL.. (HIC) JOU'RE & KILLY
DOLLARS MORE?

COSTELLO: BUT YOU ONLY LOST SEVEN FIFTY.

BLANC: YEAH, BUT I WANNA SHOW MY WIFE THAT I WON! (HIC) (LAUGHS GOING, OFF)

ABBOTT: YOU'LL NEVER SEE THAT MONEY AGAIN: COME ON COSTELLO,
LET'S GO OVER TO THE PADDOCK...IT'S TOO WINDY HERE!

COSTELLO: WINDY? HEY THAT'S A HUNCH! IF IT'S WINDY LET'S PLAY
PETTICOAT!

ABBOTT: WILL PETTICOAT WIN IF IT'S WINDY?

COSTELLO: NO, BUT IT'S BOUND TO SHOW.

REASON FOR THAT?

ABBOTT: AH: THERE'S THE PADDOCK COSTELLO...ISN'T THAT A PRETTY SIGHT? ALL THE JOCKEYS IN THEIR DIFFERENT COLORED SILKS?

COSTELLO: YEAH...ABBOTT, WHY DO SOME HORSES HAVE LITTLE JOCKEYS

AND OTHER HORSES HAVE BIGGER JOCKEYS...CAN YOU TELL ME THE

ABBOTT: WEIGHT!

COSTELLO: WAIT? WHY SHOULD I WAIT? WHY CAN'T YOU TELL ME NOW?

ABBOTT: I JUST TOLD YOU WEIGHT!

COSTELLO: WAIT? HOW LONG DO I HAVE TO WAIT?

ABBOTT: YOU DON'T HAVE TO WAIT...I'LL TELL YOU NOW.

COSTELLO: WELL GO AHEAD AND TELL ME.

ABBOTT: WEIGHT!

COSTELLO: ABBOTT ARE YOU GONNA ANSWER MY QUESTION OR NOT?

ABBOTT: CERTAINLY I'LL ANSWER YOUR QUESTION.

COSTELLO: ALLRIGHT. NOW TELL ME, WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN

THE BIG JOCKEYS AND THE LITTLE JOCKEYS?

ABBOUT: WEIGHT!

COSTELLO: THIS THING KEEPS GETTIN! WORSE ALL THE TIME. LOOK

ABBOTT, EVERY HORSE HAS A JOCKEY?

ABBOTT: THAT'S RIGHT.

COSTELLO: SOME OF THE JOCKEYS ARE BIG

ABBOTT: CERTAINLY.

COSTELLO: ALLRIGHT! NOW! WHAT'S THE REASON FOR USIN! LITTLE

JOCKEYS ON SOME HORSES AND BIGGER JOCKEYS ON OTHER HORSES?

ABBOTT: WEIGHT!

COSTRULO: ABBOTT I WAITED A WHOLE PAGE! THIS IS ONLY A HALF HOUR

SHOW! IF I WAIT ANY LONGER, I'LL BE DOIN! THIS ROUTINE

RUDY VALLEE! Propour

ABBOTT: YOU DUMMY! IT'S NO USE TRYING TO EXPLAIN ANYTHING TO YOU.

YOU DON'T EVEN KNOW WHAT A JOCKEY IS!

COSTELLO: I DO SO...BACK IN PATTERSON I RODE MORE HORSES THAN ANY

OTHER KID IN TOWN.

ABBOTT: YOU DID?

COSTELLO: YEAH, AND I GOT THE BRASS RINGS TO PROVE IT...AND SOME DAY I'M GONNA BE A REAL JOCKEY LIKE THEM GUYS OVER THERE.

ABBOTT: WELL COSTELLO, IF YOU REALLY WANT TO BE A JOCKEY, HERE
COMES THE GREATEST JOCKEY TRAINER IN THE WORLD.

FIELDS: AH MR. COSTELLO! PERMIT ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF, I AM

THE WORLDS GREATEST JOCKEY TRAINER, PROFESSOR MELLONHEAD

...BETTER KNOWN IN RACING CIRCLES AS "HOME STRETCH

MELLONHEAD".

IN THE BACK YARD!

ABBOTT: SHUT UP COSTELLO: PROFESSOR MELLONHEAD, DO YOU THINK
YOU COULD MAKE A JOCKEY OUT OF COSTELLO?

FIELDS: I COULD MAKE TWO JOCKEYS OUT OF HIM AND HAVE ENOUGH LEFT
OVER TO MAKE A SHETLAND PONY:

COSTELLO: MELLONHEAD, YOU AIN'T GONNA MAKE NO SHETLAND PONY OUTTA

ME !

FIEIDS: COSTELLO THERE IS ONLY ONE THING THAT MIGHT KEEP YOU FROM BEING A JOCKEY.

COSTELLO: TELL ME WHAT IT IS.

COSTELIO: WEIGHT. Sive abbott back his scripe. Let's don't go uite that again

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FIEIDS: NOW COSTELLO, WE'LL START THE FIRST LESSON....STEP OVER HERE...THIS IS A HORSE. AND THIS IS THE HORSE'S SADDLE.

COSTELLO: THE HORSE'S SADDLE? HE DON'T LOOK SADDLE. HE LOOKS
GLADDLE TO ME.

ABBOTT: COSTELLO, MR. MELLONHEAD SAID THE HORSE'S SADDLE !

COSTELLO: WELL IF THE HORSE'S SADDLE MAYBE HE'LL GET MADDLE AND HE
WON'T RUNNEL IN THE RACELS !

FIEIDS: NOW COSTELLO, I'M GOING TO GET YOU READY TO RIDE. FIRST I
WILL WHITTLE DOWN YOUR AVOIRDUPOIS. STRETCH OUT YOUR
STRIKE. PUT A ZIP IN YOUR GALLOP. TAKE THE KINKS OUT OF
YOUR CROUCH, AND PLACE AN EQUESTRIENNE'S CROP IN YOUR RIGHT
HAND!

COSTELLO: YOU WOULDN'T DARE !.....YOU HAVEN'T GOT THE
