High Fidelity ... Excellent condition with a full frequency range.

Excellent.....Perfect audio with no audible defects.

Very Good.....Contains only a minor defect (such as surface scratch or slight distortion). Hardly noticeable but not perfect audio quality.

Fair or Listenable...Contains serious defects and is not recommended to any but a diehard enthusiast of a particular show

Broadcast dates listed are based on available information, if any and are subject to correction.

The time (length) of the programs are understood to be approximate and may vary several minutes.

The term "Complete" usually means just that, nothing missing.

also used for a small number of programs with parts of the closing, or some of the commercials missing. If the story is and the amount missing is not excessive, the word "complete".

Note that when programs are syndicated (sold to individual stations), they will not normally contain commercials. Nor marked "Sustaining". These are shows that were not meant to sponsored.

When requesting any material from this catalogue, the number to the left of the description MUST be included as part of the request.

AFRS as used in this catalogue is short for Armed Forces Radio Services This part of the Army rebroadcast popular stateside radio shows to overseas. An AFRS show is exactly as heard in America except the commercials have been deleted. Some AFRS programs were not restricted but original performances and contained no commercials to begin with
