

Our 100 Best Bergen & McCarthy

Edgar Bergen first appeared on Radio on December 17, 1936 on Rudy Vallee's Royal Gelatin Hour. It was a radio first: whoever thought a ventriloquist would go over unseen on radio? Bergen made such a hit, he starred on his own Chase and Sanborn series starting the following May. His lovable dummy, Charlie McCarthy, was soon joined by country-bumpkin dummy Mortimer Snerd and later, in 1944, by "bachelor girl" dummy Effie Clinker. Ray Noble was the long time band leader when the show was shortened to 1/2 hour and renamed the Edgar Bergen - Charlie McCarthy Show. In 1949 along with many other stars, Bergen moved to CBS Radio where be stayed until 1956. He achieved the dubious distinction of being the last major comedian on network radio (Jack Benny and Bob Hope re-runs continued until 1958). All of the following shows contain the original commercials (except the AFRS shows), and unless otherwise noted, run 1/2 hour, are in very good to excellent condition or better, and are complete.




