- 1871. The Whistler: March 30, 1952. "Homecoming." A man commits a murder and frames his stepbrother for the crime. Three years later, the stepbrother escapes from jail to seek his revenge The Whistler: April 6, 1952. "Element X." A blackmailing lawyer doesn't take into account the unknown factor...the "Element X!"






