

Other scribes argued that an error should be charged regardless of where the fielder was playing, inasmuch as the rules plainly state that all players. except the pitcher and catcher, may be placed anywhere on the field in fair territory.

So it looks as though the scoring rules will come up for discussion and decision during the major league meetings this winter.

"But I'm not going to the Garden," explained the member. "I'm having a house party to see the meet over television. We want the programs to follow the events." Can you beat that one?






