# IN THE DUGOUT

**POOR OLD HONUS**... A heavy snow storm swirled around Pittsburgh last spring as the train bearing the Pittsburgh Pirates approached the city at the end of the exhibition campaign. Going through the suburb in which Honus Wagner lived, the Pirate players got to thinking of their beloved coach who was supposedly sick in bed.

"Poor old Honus—guess he won't be able to see our exhibition games with the Yanks. Gee, won't it be too bad if he has to miss the opening game of the regular season, too? Poor old

Honus!"

Well, because of the snow storm nobody saw the exhibition game. Nobody was even out at the ball park—nobody, that is, except "poor old Honus". The 76-year-old Pittsburgh shortstop immortal was out at Forbes Field before noon, snow or no snow.

Said his wife to a sports writer who inquired

about this:

"He just jumped into a neighbor's car and headed for the ball park. He was that homesick and eager to get out there. Don't let the players worry about Honus—he'll show up on opening day all right!"

ROUND AND ROUND . . . Sid Hudson is a pitcher unique in the history of baseball. Few men can change from one pitching style to another very successfully, but Sid has done it three different times already, completing the

cycle twice, a feat never before accomplished. When Hudson came up to the Washington Senators in 1940 he was a full overhead fireball pitcher. Sid did all right for eight years pitching with the overhand motion, but in 1948 he suffered a shoulder injury which threatened his career. So he changed to a sidearm motion. Did all right with it too. When, in 1949, his shoulder hurt no more, Sid went back to his original delivery and continued to win.

But last training season the old shoulder injury recurred. Sid switched back to his side-balling style once more. Baseball men who have been around for many, many years were amazed. No pitcher, they said, had ever been able to change his style so radically nor so often and continue to do effective mound work

after the switch.

As Washington manager Bucky Harris puts it, "I've been in the big leagues for 25 years and I've never seen anything like it. But Sid's a real tough bird to hit whatever way he throws. He's a real ball player!"


THOUGH FANS PAY DOUBLE NO TICKET TROUBLE . . . For many years, Branch Rickey, shrewd and wily head of the Brooklyn Dodgers, who knows the value of a dollar more than any other man in baseball, has kept single-admission double-headers at Ebbets Field down to a minimum. Even on our most important holidays, though every other team in the major leagues may be playing a bargain bill, Rickey splits Dodger home double-headers into a morning ball game and an afternoon contestand if you want to see them both you have to leave the park after the first game is over and buy yourself another ticket to get in again for the nightcap. Although this practice is followed upon a few rare occasions by other ball clubs, it is not done elsewhere as common policy of the team.

Rickey defends the double admission at Ebbets Field on the grounds of the park being one of the smallest in the big leagues, seating only 32,000. Lots more people than that want to watch the National League champions play, and Rickey says that the split double-header is the only way to let them do so.

But last winter, a member of the New York State legislature—from Brooklyn, too—introduced a bill making it illegal to split double-headers into separate admission games. The bill was passed by both houses of the legislature and went to Governor Dewey for his signature.

However, that's as far as it went. The governor vetoed the proposal. "It isn't the business of the state to tell the ball teams how to operate their business," he said. So the Brooks continue to charge two admissions to see two games on the same day.

Most New York sports writers agree with the Governor's reasoning, but they don't like the Dodgers' practice. They say, however, that until the Brooklyn fans object by refusing to patronize Dodger games unless they can see double-headers for the price of one game, they have nobody but themselves to blame.



HIS ACTIVE DAYS OVER, THE BRAVES MADE CASEY BOTH MANAGER AND PRESIDENT OF THEIR WORCESTER CLUB IN THE EASTERN LEAGUE. MANAGING TOL-EDO FROM 1926-71, CAGEY BROUGHT THAT CLUB ITS ONLY PERMANT AND LITTLE WORLD SERIES VICTORY IN 1937. IN 1932 HE RE-TURNED TO THE DODGERS AS A COACH, AND IN 1934 KEPLACED MAX CAREY AS MANAGER.



CASEY INHERITED A DEFINAT, PERENNIAL SECOND-DIVISION BALL CLUB. THE DODGERS NEEDED MONEY AND PLAYERS, AND COULD NOT GET EITHER WAN LINGLE MUMBO, BIG, TEMPERAMENTAL FASTBALL PITCHER WAS THE ONLY GOOD BALLPLAYER ON THE TEAM. 
















THOSE WERE THE REAL ROUGH-AND-READY DAYS OF BASEBALL. FOR LAYING ON OWEN'S WHISKERS BASE WAS FINED PENDED A MERE IO DAYS. TODAY A PLAYER WOULD BE THROWN OUT FOR A FILL YEAR. BUILTHAT GAME MADE MISTORY FOR ANOTHER REASON ERWIS SHOWN CUT STEALING, AND SHORE WENT ON TO RETIRE THE NEXT 26 BATTERS, PITCHING A MERES OF THE WAS THROWN CUT STEALING, AND SHORE WENT ON TO RETIRE THE NEXT 26 BATTERS, PITCHING A MERES OF TOWN.

ON APPIL 6, 1917. THE UNITED STATES DECLARED WAR ON GERMANY BUT BASEBALL LOST COMPARATIVELY FEW STARS IN THAT FIRST WAR SEASON. THE RED SOX AND WHITE SOX POLICIT FOR THE PENNANT, BUT IN SEPTEMBER THE CHICAGO TEAM FORGED AREAD AND COPPED THE FLAG BY NINE GAMES. THE BASE HAD ANOTHER OREAT YEAR, AGAIN WINNING 23 GAMES AND HITTING 323, HE WAS TRULY A GREAT GOUTHPAW STAR.



THOUGH THE BASE WAS PAST BECOMING ONE OF SASSEBALUS NOTORIOUS HELL-RAISERS, HE OFTEN HAD SERIOUS MOMENTS IN WHICH HE THOUGHT OF ST. MARY'S INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL AND THE GOOD BROTHERS WHO HAD BROUGHT HIM BIR HE KEPT IN CLOSE CONTACT, AND THOUGH NOT YET IN THE BIG MONEY, FREQUENTLY SENT IN CONTRIBUTIONS,



IN 1918 THE WAR MADE DEEP INROADS INTO BASEBALL LIFE. MANY OF THE RED SOX WENT INTO UNIFORM. BABE, AS A MARRIED MAN, WAS DEFERRED WITH MANY OTHERS. HE JOINED A NATIONAL GUARD UNIT, HE AND OTHER BALL PLAYERS DRILLED WITH BATS INSTEAD OF GUNS.



MANAGER JACK BARRY WAS ONE OF THE SOX TO JOIN THE RANKS. OWNER FRAZEE AGAIN NEEDED A MANAGER, HE FOUND HIS MAN IN EDEMAROW, THEN INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE PRESIDENT, FORMER PILOT OF THE DETROIT TIGERS AND THE DEVELOPER OF THE IMMORTAL HONUS WAGNER.



BARROW WAS A MARD BOLLED, MOT TAMPERED, STATE DISCHES, MOT ARTAW WHO LIKED TO USE HIS FISTS AND KNEW ADAY TO USE THEM. IT WAS INEVITABLE THAT HE AND THE FUN-LOWNS, EASY-GOWN, RIVES-BABE WOULD CLASH. ONE DAY, AS THE TEAM TRAVELED FROM WASHINGTON TO PHILADZI-PHIA ON AN OPEN: DATE THE BABE DECIDED TO SEE HIS SISTER IN BALTIMORE, WITHOUT ASSEMBLE PAR-MISSION, HE HOPPED OF THE TRAIN.



THE NEXT DAY, BEFORE THE GAME, BARROW CALLED THE TEAM TOGETHER IN THE CLUB HOUSE AND GAVE THE BASE THE WORST BAWLING OUT OF HIS CAREER!



OWNER FRAZEE MADE SOME GOOD DEALS TO BOLSTER HIS WAR-WEAKENED TEAM. THE SOX GOT GOOD PITCHING FROM BABE, CARL MAYS, JOE BUSH AND SAD SAM JONES. BUT THEY WERE LIGHTAT BAT ESPECIALLY AGAINST RIGHT-HANDED PITCHING. ONE DAY, BABE WAS CALLED TO BARROW'S ROOM.



BARROW JUGGLED HIS STAFF SO THAT BABE USUALLY PITCHED AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS, PLAYED LEFT FIELD WHEN AN OPPOSING RIGHT-HANDER WAS ON THE MOUND. BABE BEGAN DEVELOPING RAPIOLY INTO A POLISHED FLY-CHASER.



NOBODY WAS DARING TO TAKE ANY BASES ON BABE'S POWER-FUL LEFT ARM EITHER.



IN THOSE DAYS, BABE WOULD HAVE PRE-FERRED PLAYING FIRST BASE. SOME-TIMES HE DID, WHEN THE CLASSY STUFFY MEINING WASN'T IN THE LINEUP.



PITCHING IN ONLY 20 GAMES THAT 1918 SEASON, THE BABE SHOWED HIS USUAL MOUND MASTERY IN CHALKING UP 13 WINS.



BUT THE BABE WAS HELPING THE GOX EQUALLY AS WELL WITH THE BCOMING POWER OF HIS BIG BAT. EYERY BALLPLAYER IN THE LEAGUE WAS AWED AT THE TREMENDOUS DRIVES THE PITCHER-OUTFIELDER WAS BLASTING AGAINST AND OVER THE FENCES.



WITH MEN ON BASES, IT DIDN'T TAKE OPPOSING PITCHERS LONG TO REALIZE THE BEST WAY TO DEAL WITH BASE.



THE BABE FINISHED THE CURTAILED WAR SEASON BATTING EXACTLY 300 IN 95 GAMES. BUT, BATTING AGAINST THE SOFT, SQUASH BALL USED THEN, AMONG HIS 95 HITS WERE 25 DOWNES, ITRIPLES AND IT HOME RUNS. THE BABE HAD TIED WITH "TILLIE" WALKER OF THE ATHLETICS AS HOME RUN KING OF THE AMERICAN LEAGUE.



THUS, THE 1918 RED SOX WON THEIR THIRD PENNANT IN FOUR YEARS, RUTH'S PITCHING AND HITTING FEATS WERE THE TALK OF THE BASEBALL WORLD. AS THE 1918 WORLD SERIES APPROACHED AGAINST THE CHICAGO CUBS, FANS EVERYWHERE RECALLED THE GREAT SOUTHPAW'S 13 CONSECUTIVE SHUTOUT INNINGS PITCHED IN 1916. EVERY SWIMMER SHOULD BE FAMILIAR WITH THE CHIEF RULES OF LIFE-SAVING., JUST IN CASE! IF YOU EVER HAVE TO SAVE SOME ONE, THESE POINTERS WILL HELP. LEARN THEM! HELP! HELP! SAVE ME!

USE EQUIPMENT! THERE ARE LIFE-SAVING TOOLS WITH WHICH TO WORK, SWIMMING SHOULD BE THE LAST RESORT! EVERY SUMMER PLACE SHOULD HAVE SUCH STANDARD EQUIPMENT AS BOOTS, LIFE BOUYS, LINES THE USE OF EQUIPMENT IS SURER AND SAFER TO BOTH THE PERSON IN DISTRESS

F YOU'RE ON SHORE, COMPLETELY DRESSED, AND HAVE TO SWIM AFTER A PERSON, YOU SHOULD DISROBE QUICKLY BE-FORE GOING IN. WEARING CLOTH-ING AND SHOES WILL WATER-LOG THE SWIM-MER AND NOT ONLY SLOW HIM DOWN BUT EN-DANGER HIM AS WELL, COM-PLETE DISROB-ING CAN BE DONE IN 20 SECONDS.

**BUICKEST DISROBING PROCEDURE IS AS FOL-**LOWS: REMOVE COAT AND SHIRT WHILE KICKING OFF SHOES AT THE **SAME TIME**, THEN PANTS ARE DROPPED AND KICKED FREE. IT'S BEST TO GET RID OF UNDERSHIRT AND SOCKS, TOO. WHILE YOU'RE DISROBING, WATCH YOUR SUBJECT ALL THE TIME.



INTER THE WATER FEET FIRST. LEAP HIGH AND FAR. LOGS, ROCKS AND VARYING DEPTHS MAKE HEAD DIVES MOST DANGEROUS. ALSO, YOU'LL KEEP SIGHT OF THE PERSON YOU'RE GOING AFTER. TAKE YOUR SHIRT WITH YOU.

ARTICLES OF CLOTHING CAN OFTEN BE USED AS BUOYS TO KEEPA PERSON AFLOAT, A PAIR OF COTTON PANTS, LEGS TIED TIGHTLY, CAN BE SWUNG IN THE AIR AND INFLATED ENOUGH TO SUPPORT FOUR PEOPLE. A SAILOR HAT OR A BUCKET, FILLED WITH AIR AND UPTURNED, WILL ALSO SUPPORT A PERSON.



OW LET'S SUPPOSE YOU HAVE **NO EQUIPMENT AT ALL**TO WORK WITH. IN APPROACHING A PERSON THIS WAY,
ALWAYS DO SO FROM THE **REAR**. THIS WILL HELP TO
PREVENT HIS GETTING A HOLD ON YOU.



TO APPROACH FROM THE FRONT, THE RESCUER DIVES ABOUT SIX FEET FROM THE VICTIM AND SWIMS UNDERWATER USING FEET ONLY, WITH ARMS OUT STRAIGHT. WHEN CONTACT IS MADE, PLACE ONE HAND ON THE FRONT OF ONE THIGH AND OTHER ON THE BACK OF THE OTHER THIGH. TURN VICTIM, SURFACE AND PROCEED AS IN REAR APPROACH.



OROWNING PERSON USUALLY GRASPS HIS RESCUER AROUND THE **NECK** OR **WRISTS...** EITHER FROM THE **BACK** OR **FRONT**. ONE OF THESE HOLDS IS THE **DOUBLE WRIST HOLD**.



TO GET OUT OF THE BACK STRANGLE POLD, GRASP THE DROWNING MAN'S WRIST, PULL DOWN FIRMLY, WITH YOUR OTHER HAND, FORCE HIS ELBOW UP AND OUCK YOUR HEAD OUT FROM UNDER HIS ARM.



SUPERIOR METHOD FOR BREAKING A FRONT NECK HOLD IS TO EXTEND BOTH ARMS TO THE FRONT AND PLACE THEM AGAINST THE VICTUM'S BODY, WITH THE HEELS OF YOUR HANDS AGAINST HIS ABDOMEN AND FINGERS GRASPING HIS SIDES. THEN LIFT AND PUSH HIS BODY UP AND DUCK YOUR HEAD OUT.



CF YOU'RE GRABBED IN THE SIMBLE WRIST HOLD BY BOTH THE VICTIM'S HANDS, PLACE YOUR OPPOSITE FOOT ON HIS SHOULDER AND PUSH AWAY, PUSHING WITH YOUR HANDS AT THE SAME TIME.



ONE OF THE BEST AND SIMPLEST WAYS TO TOW A PERSON TO SAFETY IS THE SIDE-ARM OR CROSS-CHEST CARRY. REACH OVER THE SHOULDER AND ACROSS THE VICTIM'S CHEST, GRASPING HIS SIDE, JUST BELOW THE ARMPIT. TURN ON YOUR SIDE SO THAT YOUR HIP IS DIRECTLY BENEATH THE SMALL OF THE VICTIM'S BACK. USE SIDE STROKE TO SWIM TO SHORE.


