












When Rance Horgan rode out of town with only a gunshot lead on the marshal's posse, no one at Cholla Crossing thought he would make it.

The man in the assay office looked at the ore, asked dryly, "You say you dug this out of your own discovery vein?"


"Sure I did," Rance blustered.
