think this is the topper thus far. In case you've forgotten, Rollo and the Saints are Rollo Laytan, drums; Marie Marcus, piano; Tony Parenti, clarinet; Tommy Justice, cornet; Jay Gorman, trombone; and Al Mariucci, bass.

### Columbia Records Issue "Kismet" Album

Some years ago a teen-age pair of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer musical arrangers were commissioned to make a Hollywood film operetta out of some music by Tchaikovsky. The music was mostly Tchaikovsky's Fifth Symphony; the operetta was "Maytime", which starred Nelson Eddy and Jeanette MacDonald; the young arrangers, Robert Wright and Charles Forrest, promptly became Hollywood authorities on operettas and classical composers. In the next seven years they did three dozen musical films for which they wrote such gems as

"The Donkey Serenade" and "At the Balalaika."

Then the Messrs. Wright and Forrest decided to "retire" from the movies and take to the Broadway stage.

Edwin Lester, impresario of the Los Angeles Civic Light Opera Association, approached the team with the idea of doing a musical based on compositions by Grieg. This turned out to be "Song of Norway," a highly successful production. Next, at Mr. Lester's behest they did "Magdalena," based on music by Villa-Lobos. When Mr. Lester decided that he wanted to do a musical version of that Near Eastern melodrama, "Kismet," he naturally invited Wright and Forrest to do the musical adaptation.

But whose music? It was a choice between Tchaikovsky, Rimsky-Korsakov and Borodin. Borodin won. Wright and Forrest proceeded to study his music. They became "musical chameleons," steeped themselves in all available Borodin compositions.

Out of an incomplete opera, "Prince Igor," a string quartet, assorted songs, piano and orchestral pieces they ferreted fragments of music and pieced them together for a score. The verse for "Stranger in Paradise," (a Hit Parade best-seller by the time "Kismet" opened in New York) is from a song, "From My Tears Spring Flowers." The rest is from the "Polovtsian Dances." So are "Not Since Nineveh" and "He's In Love." Borodin's Symphony No. 2 was the source of "Fate" and a piano composition titled "Serenade" provided "Night of My Nights." From the last act of "Prince Igor" came the melody for "Rhymes Have It," and from his Love Duet Messrs. Wright and Forrest adapted "The Olive Tree." The D Major Quartet yielded "Was I Wazier" and "And This is My Beloved." "On The Steppes of Central Asia" will be recognized in "Sands of Time."

After the opening night huzzas for the brilliant new version of "Kismet" had quieted down somewhat, someone jokingly asked producer Charles Lederer if he thought that Borodin was just a one-hit-show composer. Had anyone queried Wright and Forrest they would probably have said "Yes! There isn't enough Borodin music left after "Kismet" for another show."

Fifteen unforgettable songs direct from the Warner Brothers sound-track of "The Eddie Cantor Story" are available exclusively in a Capitol album this month. One of the world's most popular and beloved showmen, Eddie Cantor sings "If You Knew Susie," "Margie," "Makin' Whoopee," "One Hour With You," "Ida," "Bye, Bye Blackbird" and "Now's the Time to Fall in Love."

Early next month the film portrayal of Cantor's fabulous career will be released throughout the country.

Cantor grew up on the east side of New York City. Both his mother and father died before he was two years old. He began his career singing and mimicking on street corners and on his first amateur show at Miner's Bowery Theatre he walked off with first prize—five dollars. This convinced the big-eyed youngster that he was meant for show business.

He took a job as singing waiter in a Coney Island cafe where Jimmy Durante was pianist and from there graduated into a big-time juggling act. In Atlantic City he got his big break, at a stag party for a yacht club, with a troupe that included George Jessel and Walter Winchell. Later he obtained a small part in a musical comedy, "Canary Cottage," and then in 1919 Florenz Ziegfeld featured him in his famous "Follies." The next ten years were golden ones for Cantor; he starred in Ziegfeld's "Kid Boots," "Whoopee" and many others.

However, in 1929 Cantor found himself broke with no plans for the future. Then he made an appearance on the NBC Rudy Vallee variety show, and a few months later he was heading his own Sunday program. He is generally credited with revolutionizing radio presentation technique with an innovation now taken for granted. He insisted on a live audience.

In the past year Eddie Cantor has invaded television and proved to be, as in radio, a national favorite.

Possibly his is one of the nation's best-known marriages. His romance with his wife, Ida, began when he was 13 years old and carried her books home from school. They were married in 1914, and with their five daughters, recently celebrated Cantor's 60th birthday and his 42nd year in show business.


