

America's top female wocalist, Joni Janes, offers another beautiful M-G-M album for her millions of faithful fans. Joni's in a wistfully winsome mood here—just like the "Little Girl Blue" of the title. Along with that memorable melody, you'll find a brace of seven fine songs of lasting quality. Joni never sounded better—and she receives excellent accompaniments from an orchestra under David Terry.

Here's a superb M-G-M waxing by "The Great Mr. B.", Billy Eckstine. First, aided and abetted by an orchestra under Lou Bring, the masterful Billy turns in a masterful job on a lovely, mellow ballad called "What More Is There To Say." A sure-fire Eckstine hit, unless our ears betray us! Next, the master, with a bit of change of pace, comments on what it's like to be "The Life Of The Party." Billy gets a handsome assist here from an orchestra under Lionel Newman.

Delightful Ginny Gibson—"she's so-o-o talented!"—offers two entertainingly-contrasted sides on the M-G-M label in this new release. First, there's a winsome, wistful, charmingly-nostalgic ballad called "Once There Was A' Little Girl." Ginny's pretty as can be here. The flip has a gay, abandoned Calypso novelty: "Like Ma-a-d." There's strong support from an orchestra and chorus under Joe Lipman's direction.

They said in the beginning that he was just a flash in the pan and that sure, he could sing but so could a lot of other guys. Then they said. yeah, he'll be all right in the movies as long as they don't let him do anything but sing, and then they said he was okay for supporting roles, but you couldn't hand him a lead. And here we all are relatively safe and sound, more than a decade later, and there are two Academy Awards sitting on Frank Sinatra's shelf, together with some prime records.

It was on records that Frank Sinatra scored his first and perhaps most lasting successes. Columbia's new album, "Frankie," offers a cross-section of his finest singing, reflecting many styles and moods with unvarying brilliance. An expert with ballads, Frankie is also a handy man with rhythm numbers. In this collection he moves from the autumnal grace of "Hello, Young Lovers" through the bopinfluenced exuberance of "It All Depends On You," to the charming romance of "Time After Time" and the unabashed sentiment of "Nancy."

Axel Stordahl and his orchestra provide accompaniments for all except "You'll

Columbia's new "Mitch Miller" collection concentrates on the bearded genius and hit record-producer extraordinary as a conductor and oboe-English horn virtuoso. In that department he is also notable for several innovations. Mitch, in recent years, has brought the French horn and harpsichord into popular music in a big way. The French horn has played a long and honorable role in classical music, but in popular songs pre-Miller, its role was limited to occasional short solos in lush accompaniments. In the "Mitch Miller" album, the French horn is an important part of each setting, contributing an unusually mellow sound to the ballads and a festive note to the novelties.

The horns and harpsichord are blended deftly by Miller with a chorus, while his own superb solos on Englsh horn and oboe provide fresh and imaginative settings for

a dozen current favorites.

Bobby Hackett

Behind the smooth, listenable music of Jackie Gleason is a trumpet. And blowing this mellow instrument is Bobby Hackett. His deft, easy phrasing and improvisation give the albums their gentle melancholia and lonely sounds.

Hackett started playing trumpet at fourteen. In Boston he orignated a band of his own, but his real debut was at Nick's in New York City's Greenwich Village on lower Seventh Avenue. The listeners at Nick's—where most of the jazz greats have appeared at one time or another were startled with his accurate imitations of Bix Beidetbecke

A year with Horace Heidt followed after which Bobby joined Glenn Miller, then Glen Gray and later acted as staff-conductor, for Paul Whiteman at ABC.

On Commodore Records, a label beloved by serious jazz collectors, Bobby Hackett's imaginative music dominates his disks even when he is surrounded by other immortal jazz artists.

In Barry Ulanov's book, "A History of Jazz," in which Mr. Ulanov doesn't spare the feelings of Dixieland musicians when he draws the line between the greats and the cornballs, he speaks of Hackett's trumpet saying that Bobby could "achieve the poignancy and the searing pathos of first-rate Dixieland ballad or blues."

Hackett has appeared on many recent records including his own Capitol album, "Soft Lights and Bobby Hackett."






























