

The mountain lion or cougar is much more common in the American southwest, than his cousin, the spotted jaguar. Most people think of the cougar as a dangerous animal but for ferocity and strength, he doesn't compare with the larger, more powerful jaguar.

When it was decided to clear the Grand Canyon area of mountain lions, many hunters caught the animals alive and sold them to zoos. They found that it was quite easy to run a cougar with a pack of hounds and tree him. Then they draped a noose over the lion and pulled him out of the tree and tied him up. Few people would try this with a jaguar. A cougar seldom weighs more than 150 pounds and is, most often, very afraid of dogs and men.



But the jaguar will fight almost every time to avoid being cornered or treed. Mexican farmers fear him because he seems to have no great fear of men and dogs. The jaguar prefers to live in dense undergrowth but he is a great traveller when searching for game. He is the only animal in North America who sometimes becomes a habitual man-eater. This usually happens when he is crippled or too old to catch swifter game like deer or antelope.

Jaguars often learn to circle back on their own trails when they are pursued. They lie in wait and kill the pursuing dogs and sometimes even the hunter. For this reason, it's important to be able to tell the difference between mountain lion and jaguar tracks. Otherwise, a hunter may believe he is safely tracking a comparatively timid cougar only to be attacked by a jaguar.

It is very easy to mistake a cougar's tracks for those of a jaguar. They look alike except that the toes of the mountain lion are usually a little longer and more curved than a jaguar's. Jaguar toes are round. Usually, the jaguar leaves deeper, clearer prints because he is so much heavier.
