Here are some of the ways you can find your way in strange country:

If you've lost your way completely and can't do anything else, follow a river downstream. Usually, it will lead to a settlement somewhere along its banks or take you to the seacoast where there is a better chance of meeting someone. Never follow a river upstream in such a case as it usually leads back to high ground or mountains where there are few settlers.

The sun rises in the east and sets in the west. This is the best guide to directions. Remember that if you're facing a setting sun, north is on your right and south on your left.

When using a compass, lay it on the ground and stand a few feet away. If you must hold it in your hand, lay aside your knife and gun or other pieces of heavy metal. Large masses of metal may become magnetized and affect your compass.

If you're lost and you've run out of water, watch the animals. Birds, especially doves and waterfowl, fly toward water every evening.

Regular trails through brushy country can be made by bands of deer and other animals that travel regular routes. Don't mistake a "game trail" for one made by men. Often it will lead you into wilder and wilder country. Look for a footprint or burned out campfires before you decide that other human beings have used the trail.


When using a map, always locate north with your compass or by the sun and hold the top of the map in that direction. Otherwise, you may read the map wrong.

When you start out on a new trail, look over your shoulder very often. This familiarizes you with the country as it will look when you return and you'll be less likely to lose your way through a sense of never having seen certain landmarks before.
