
























BEWARE OF PICKPOCKETS!

Pickpockets are enjoying prosperous days, thanks to the increased cost of living which makes it necessary for one to carry more money in his pockets. This is on the authority of a police captain of an eastern pickpocket squad. Constant vigilance by departments of various cities discouraged the practice for a time, but pickpockets now have resumed operations in quest of easy money.

To protect the unwary against lightfingered folk, police officials are flashing warnings to all citizens by familiarizing them with their sly methods.

Of the five types of pickpockets, the most cunning is the trouser-thief. A neat dresser, he joins throngs on subway platforms in department stores, ball parks, and at rallies, where he lifts wallets from pants pockets.

Sleep-rollers are the second type, generally operating in groups in deserted streets, rail-road trains and subways. To remove the snoozing victim's wallet swiftly before detected, they often use sharp knives or razor blades to cut the pockets if the money is jammed tight.

The handkerchief-hoodlum comprises the third. He scouts around town looking for a crowd in which to mingle—a street accident, window-shoppers, theatergoers. Choosing a quarry, he approaches, draws out his handkerchief as if to blow his nose, but suddenly

drops it so that it covers his hand, and slips fleet fingers into the victim's pocket.

Then, there is the purse-snatcher, who cuts the straps of women's handbags and makes off with his prize; also, the culprit whose hand wanders into women's coat pockets while they are absorbed in shopping.

Some dips don't even use their hands while operating. Such items as a protruding wallet or a valuable stickpin are annexed by the simple expedient of a newspaper—"accidentally" brushed past the victim—to lift it loose. The booty slides down the length of the newspaper into the snatcher's hands.

Pickpocket gangs work with all the precision and speed required by teamwork. A shill (stall or setup) idly stands in front of the victim (sucker or mark) while a wire (hook) is slipped under his jacket from behind. Under cover of an opened newspaper, his hand darts in. If the wallet (oakus or poke) is not upright, he manipulates it rightside up until two fingers can deftly remove it from the hip pocket. As soon as the wallet is dropped into the newspaper, another member of the team brushes by, claims the newspaper and hurries away, as does the shill. If the victim cries that he's been robbed, nobody present can be accused because of the lack of evidence.

Despite police recommendations that wallets be carried inside jacket pockets rather than hip pockets, thugs have managed even to overcome that difficulty.

The sole advice that the police can offer is to exercise extreme caution when among crowds.

FINGERPRINT FORGERY

One of the most unique cases on Secret Service records was disclosed in the annual report of Chief James J. Maloney when he revealed that pension checks had been endorsed with a corpse's fingerprint!

The account concerned a Cheyenne Indian, widow of a U. S. scout, who, because of her inability to sign her name, was permitted to endorse her monthly pension checks by thumbprint. Through devious channels, the Treasury Department learned of the woman's death and subsequently was greatly surprised to learn that a check had been cashed since her demise.

Assigned to the case, Secret Service agents learned that soon after her death, a relative had claimed the pension check, took it to the undertaker's, inked her thumb, and pressed the check against it!

WARNING! THUGS STAY OUT!

Heavy policing and traffic congestion today make New York City's financial district a challenge to criminals. But some years ago, all suspicious characters were arrested on sight below "the deadline." An imaginary line separating the financial region from the rest of the city, "the deadline" was drawn by Inspector Thomas F. Byrnes, who threatened suspicious characters lurking in this area with immediate imprisonment.

A STICKY STORY

Prison wardens still chuckle over the ingenuity of a lifer in executing his escape. In the dead of night, the convict picked the lock of his cell with a key fashioned from a shoe nail, crept cautiously along the corridor, carpeting the floor with flypaper. When guards gave pursuit, the flypaper clung to their shoes. The convict made good his escape through a tunnel dug under the prison wall. Years later, he was picked up by mid-western police and returned to jail.

LIGHTS OUT FOR CRIME!

In an effort to secure evidence of criminals in the act of committing a crime in the dark, police agencies are employing an Army method which proved quite successful during the war. At that time, Army Intelligence perfected infra-red photograph equipment to take pictures at night while on reconnaissance missions over enemy territory. Here at home, police utilized a similar device for catching crooks red-handed—in blackouts.




