SKIN SLEUTH

You've heard of the art detective, who authenticates canvasses of famous masters; the jewel specialist who examines precious stones. Now, meet the fur detective, newest exponent to combat racketeering. His clients generally are insurance companies and furriers, who seek his services to support their claims against wily fur-bearing patrons.

Most prominent of this division of unique detection services is a fellow called Max Bachrach, whose mid-Manhattan office and laboratory is a clearing house for fine-fur information. Bachrach is a pioneer in this science, which began to interest him as a lifework after he had submitted a treatise on hair while a student at Columbia University. The FBI now uses a Bachrach-authored book as its authority on hairs obtained at the scenes of crime.

How does Bachrach operate? For instance, an insurance company recently requested his aid when a client demanded payment for a silver fox jacket she had stored for the Summer, and which had been returned to her reeking of a skunk odor. The storage company was firm in its refusal to pay, claiming that it was impossible to reduce fox to skunk.

Bachrach's lab tests brought quick results. Not only were the foul odors genuine, but he determined to discover their source. Investigation at the storage plant revealed that a certain type of gas was being used as a refrigerant. A slight leak in the pipes permitted the room to be permeated by the gas, which, when mixed with a chemical ordinarily used to clean garments, had an odorous affect on the furs. Q.E. D.

Another case proved much simpler. Called in by a store to refute a customer's demand for repayment when recently-sold Persian lamb coat lost its curl in the back, Bachrach didn't waste time splitting hairs. Subsequent chemical tests revealed paint specks and cleaning fluid. Obviously, his verdict read, the client had sat on a freshly painted park bench and had tried to remove the stains with a cleaning fluid, which had affected the fur.

Pets are often at fault in the damage of fur apparel. There was the time Bachrach was puzzled by the appearance of strange bald areas on an expensive mink coat. The coat had been returned to the store after the buyer had accused the furrier of having sold her inferior merchandise. Bypassing his scientific apparatus, Bachrach visited the apartment of the irate customer, and after a friendly visit, turned in his decision.

Not the furrier but the complainant's pet fox terrier was at fault. Weary of toying with his playthings and bones, the dog had made occasional attacks on the garment which the customer had carelessly dropped on a chair.

FILLS FOR PRISONERS

Prison authorities are showing increasing interest in the use of medication on their inmates to correct their faults and to transform them ino useful citizens.

Typical is the case of a young prisoner in a mid-western jail, whose irritability and bursts of uncontrollable temper were the bane of the warden's existence. Friendless, thin, intense, the youthful inmate was examined by staff doctors, who recommended that he be given cal-

cium glucose to make up for the blood calcium he lacked.

Every three days thereafter, he was given calcium gluconate pills. After six months, definite progress was noticeable. He was friendly, he had gained weight, his disposition had become placid. Soon, prisoners with similar symptoms were treated, with excellent results.

In view of these successful treatments, penologists are weighing the possibility of initiating a system whereby all prisoners would be examined for their blood calcium content. If calcium gluconate can remove one of the causes for crime, a giant stride forward will be made.

POLICE NIP NIPS

Business was good in Tokyo. A man called Harumi Hirata decided to share in the profits—illegitimately. Using his junkyard as a base of operations, he formed a company of six men, each a specialist.

One was an expert with locks, another a racing car driver; a third, a mastermind at casing an apartment, bank, or business; a fourth, a nimble ex-acrobat who could scale formidable walls and get into tight places. Number Five was a sharpshooter, and Number Six, a judo expert who could eliminate any opposition.

Hirata and henchmen did a flourishing business. As the entrepreneur of his enterprise, Hirata took to wearing striped trousers and morning coat. Nipponese police regarded him as Public Enemy Number One but failed to pin any specific rap on him.

Then, as it must to all criminals, the law caught up with Hirata & Co. Police circulated the story about a shipment of Japanese silk to the United States, suspecting that it might lure the mob. While Hirata and his hooligans slipped into the dock warehouse, police closed in.

Public Enemy Number One soon was given a new number in the city jail.

"The King of France once sent a young ambassador to the King of England to discuss a trading pact. The King of England was appalled by the age of the diplomat, and said scornfully:

"Does France lack men? To negotiate its business, must its King send a beardless boy?"

Darrow now eyed the other lawyer balefully. "The youth refused to be humiliated," he went on. "He stared directly at the King and replied:

"'If the King of France assumed for a moment that you attached so much importance to a beard, good sire, it strikes me that he would have sent a goat!"
