#### RECIPE FOR DEATH

It happened a few years ago in a prison just outside the city of Lyon in the south of France. The warden had initiated a merit system whereby deserving prisoners were promoted to respectable jobs within the institution's confines, when shortly thereafter, he became the target of a barrage of criticism that ranged from the august Chamber of Deputies to relatives of the convicts themselves.

Of all the protests, the loudest concerned the food. "What can be wrong with the meals?" Warden Lumier stormed. "The food is the same we have always served!"

Whereupon, he appealed to the chaplain and some of the more talkative and trust-worthy trusties to uproot the trouble, but their efforts availed nothing. Finally, when the entire prison announced that it was beginning a hunger strike, the representatives of the Chamber of Deputies demanded that the Board of Governors investigate the strange situation.

What underlined the significance of this was that the Board of Governors does not meddle in trifling affairs. Only events of world-shaking importance fall into its domain. The first thing the Board did was to summon a delegation of prisoners to Paris to lodge a formal complaint. The situation was getting desperate, for all the prisoners were in their fourth day of fast.

The presiding officer of the Board leaned across the desk on the dais and snapped down at the cringing committee of criminals facing him. "Now, you will tell us what the trouble

is, Messieurs. You would not tell Warden Lumier, but certainly, you will inform us, or you will be held in contempt and your jail sentences will be extended. Now, one of you—speak up, man!"

One of them squared his shoulders and stepped forward. "It is the promotions, Monsieur le Inspector. We disagree heartily with the warden's merit system—"

"One moment!" cried the official. "Since when does a common prisoner have the right to criticize a system whereby a warden appoints trusties?"

"Oh, we do not quarrel with that, Monsieur! We do not argue when Warden Lumier makes an embezzler our librarian, or an arsonist an orderly in the hospital. But, Monsieur, there are some things that even a common thief confined to jail cannot accept!"

"And what is that?"

"That, Monsieur, is the rascal the warden appointed chief cook in our mess!"

"Why? What is wrong with him?"

"Do you know why he is in jail, Monsieur? He poisoned eleven people!"

#### TV AND THE THIEF

Television has turned detective and given the police an eyewitness account of crooks at work.

In a television service branch of Radio Corporation of America in Hollywood, equipment was being stolen from a stockroom. With all the facilities for learning the robbers' identities at their disposal, engineers soon put up a TV receiving unit in the manager's office, while a camera was hidden in the rafters of the ceiling of the stock room itself

Police joined the manager one evening shortly thereafter, and thanks to the TV "eye" were capable of watching the men at their routine work in the stockroom itself. To protect manufacturers from prison competition, state law forbids their sale on the open market, restricting it to public institutions. Orders for hosiery, brushes, brooms, underwear, wastepaper baskets, and other jail products are fulfilled in reasonable time at Sing Sing, but the demand for shoes has almost overwhelmed the men.

MILWAUKEE: Arrested for having printed tickets to a football game, a forger took one quick look at his warrant and announced with pride: "I printed this, too!"


