MR. HOLMES' TRIUMPH

This year, the nation salutes another crime-fighter named Holmes—Edwin, not Sherlock—on the 100th anniversary of his enterprise, which all but routed burglars into seeking honest jobs. Back in 1857, Holmes, who ran a store in Boston, evinced great interest in a burglar alarm devised by a fellow called Augustus R. Pope. This was comprised of a series of wires running from windows and doors to a magneto, which set off an alarm if any of the windows or doors were opened.

With a sharp eye for business and a strong distilke for crime, Holmes acquired the rights and began to peddle the system a year later. So successful was his trade that he abandoned his Boston shop to set up a central organization in New York, where all alarms were received. The moment a bell shrilled, Holmes' private guards rushed to the scene, which was

identified by a code of rings.

From these humble beginnings the Holmes Electric Protective Company grew into a giant guardian, which today keeps watch over some 20,000 banks, fur, jewelry and other shops which offer valuable merchandise.

TRAFFIC TICKET TROUBLE

In Oklahoma City, not long ago, a motorist parked his car in a spot where there was no parking meter. When he returned, he was chagrined to find a ticket on his windshield—plus a parking meter. Every inch of the museum will be under 24-hour surveillance, an innovation which may be followed by other museums around the country, which have been seeking some method of making themselves theftproof.


