

OLD WHITEY,

WAR HORSE IN THREE ARMIES

In 1846, during the war between Mexico and the U. S., General Zachary Taylor captured a big milk-white horse from a Mexican officer. Renamed Old Whitey, the magnificent animal was General Taylor's mount in all the battles in Texas and Mexico.

Old Whitey was almost as brave as his master. The Mexican soldiers used the big white horse as a target in trying to kill the famous American general who later became president. Old Whitey and his master never tried to hide. They always sat in full view of the enemy and seemed to have charmed lives for they were never hit though they fought in many savage battles.



After his second year came to an end, the famous horse finally was retired permanently. He lived his last days peacefully. When he died, he was given a funeral with military honors. He had served honorably in three armies and had carried a future American president into battle.



After the Mexican War, Old Whitey was retired to his master's farm. But twenty years later, the Civil War began and the old war horse was pressed into service in the Union Army. In one battle, a colonel was shot out of Whitey's saddle and he was ridden through the rest of the battle by a captain who took command of the regiment. Old Whitey's side won the battle.






