Things to Make Things to Learn Things to Do

STAMP MAPS

There are many things you can do with a lot of foreign stamps in addition to keeping them in your stamp album. Here are some ideas for you. The first one is to use a lot of cheap stamps to make a stamp map. Let us say you want to make a map of France. You can make

it as large or small as you want.

If you have a large printed map of France you can use this. If you want to keep it you can to cill use it! Take a large sheet of white paper. Place a sheet of carbon over it. Then place the map on top of it. Trace the outline of France over the map. You need not use a pencil. A stylus will do the trick. The result will be that you now have an outline of France. You can use thick oaktag if you so desire instead of white paper.

Take your French stamps. You can use all of one color though they may have different denominations on them and also be of different issues. Paste them all over the map. You can cut some of them so that they will fit the outline perfectly. Or you can use a trick that one of the boys did. He pasted them anyway he wanted. Even if they went outside the outline. Then he reversed the sheet. With a pair of scissors he carefully trimmed the excess off the stamps.

How will you label the word "France" on this map? You use stamps of a contrasting color and in block letters print with them the word, "France." You can use this technique for different countries of the world. You can also make maps of the different continents, such as North America, South America, or of Asia. You can make a map of an entire continent and show the different countries with different stamps.

Let us say you want to show the different countries of South America. You can use a regular large map of South America or make the carbon outline. For Brazil you will use Brazilian stamps. For Chile you will use Chilean stamps. Use different colors so that they will show the different countries.

One of the boys I know made a very clever map. Instead of using paper or oaktag he used a large sheet of plastic. He had Spain on this sheet of plastic. And he hung it up in his room. At an angle he had a color bulb that reflected light upon the map. These maps can be used either for school work or kept in your den or bedroom.

One of the girls had an idea for an outline

map that she thought was entirely different from anything else ever made with stamps. Her father gave her a large old square mirror in a frame. On the back she traced Italy but did it in reverse. This was so that if you looked at the front of the mirror, it would come out o.k. Then she carefully scraped away all the "silvering" with a razor blade. Now she had the outline of Italy. She pasted Italian stamps with the faces outwards.

When this was hung up you had a map of Italy, made from Italian stamps and surrounded by a sea — of mirror. You can of course do this with any other country or continent. This certainly would be a beautiful gift to give to

any person.

IDENTIFICATIONS

Elaine had a birthday party. Her mother invited not only her friends but also some of the parents. You know how parents are! They hate to sit back and do nothing. They want to participate in some of the games. Elaine had a game which was very interesting. The boys and girls as well as their parents enjoyed it very much. She told me that her aunt had informed her about this game and then helped her to prepare it.

The parents and the children were all seated on chairs. Then a large sheet of paper was hung on the wall. It contained a list of names. Elaine

then addressed the boys and girls.

"Our parents as well as our teachers often tell us that we should read certain books. They are the great classics of literature. You will notice the names on this large sheet of paper. I am certain you will recognize most of these names. Charles Dickens is there as William Shakespeare: Altogether there are thirty names of famous writers.

I have on the table a pack of large cards. These I made myself by cutting them from heavy scardboard. On each one of these large cards there is a selection from a famous writer. We will have somebody with a good voice read a selection. You will have to identify the writer. We will go around as though you were all seated in a circle.

If you correctly identify the writer you get one point. If you make a mistake you lose one point. When you make a mistake, the person seated next to you must answer. However if that person does not answer correctly, a point is also lost. But from then on, you raise your hand. First hand up means that person has the first extra chance to gain a point. If that person answers correctly, the one point is lost. Hands up until we get the correct answer. But if nobody answers it correctly this is called "a skip." We won't tell you the correct answer until the game is over.

On the large sheet of paper there are twentyfive names. But we have seventy-five cards. It means that some of the selections are from the same author. First person to get seven points will win a prize. However if we exhaust all the cards and hobody has reached the total of seven points, then the person with the highest score wins.

The first selection she read was as follows:

"You have made me offer of Sicily, Sardinia; and I must Rid all the sea of pirates; then, to send Measures of wheat to Rome; this greed upon, to part with unhacked edges, and bear back Our targets undinted."

It was Shakespeare! It wasn't necessary to tell exactly the name of the story or play.

The second selection the read was as follows:

A RIDING WE WILL GO

This past week-end I went out riding twice. On Saturday I went by myself. Dressed in a western outfit I rode THUNDER. But on Sunday afternoon I went with my son to another riding stable where only English saddle horses may be obtained.

So this time I was dressed entirely different.

I rode a Palamino called BLONDIE and my son rode a buckskin called MASTERLY. The western rider dosen't like the English saddle. As a cowboy once remarked," What, me ride a postage stamp?" Take your choice. But this time we calk about English saddle riding.

We used double reins and you should learn how to handle them. Sometimes you are told, "You aren't ready for it." However you will never be ready until and unless you try it. If necessary, have the instructor ride with you in

the ring

You can drive a car without exactly knowing all the technical details and operation of the motor. But you still should know essentially what you are doing while you drive a car, what can happen to the car, and what to do in an emergency. For it is sound to say that what you do in driving a car does depend upon what a car can do-and what a car can foo.

The same does apply to a horse. You should know the parts of a horse. Pasterns, fethocks, canons, tendons, chestnuts, gaskins, hocks, point of rump, croup, throttle, or withers should not sound like foreign language to you. And when you look at a horse you should know what makes good conformation as well as bad con-

formation.

Your aim is to obtain good horsemanship. Whenever you keep on riding the same horse you want to understand the individual temperament of that particular horse. For horses, like cars, do differ-and greatly! You have to know what makes a horse "tick" and in view of that just what you should do-and why you do it! As one great horse authority pointed out: "A horse's actions are based on two fundamental motives. The first is what we call animal instincts. The most important one in that group is fear.It makes not much difference whether the fear is natural or acquired. We must reckon with it. The second is what we call memory and what some call intelligence. A horse can learn by the past what and how to act in the

So bear that in mind the next time you go riding and you will find you understand the horse just a little better.
