

CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS: The Friends of Old-time Radio had its biggest convention to date on Oct. 20th. Many personalities were present, often with their husbands or wives, including Lee Allman, Ira Ashley, Ralph Bell, Jackson Beck, Court Benson, Ward Byron, Bob Dixon, Bill Griffis, Art Hanna, Clare Hazel, Jack House, Raymond E. Johnson, Evie Juster, Mandel Kramer, Peg Lynch, Don MacLaughlin, Ted Mallie, Ian Martin, Ted Malone, Grace Matthews, Ham O'Hara, Bob Prescott Sr. and his 2 sons, Bob, Jr. and Peter, Rosa Rio, Arnold Stang, Sybil Trent and Vicki Vola. They were all present throughout the afternoon and evening. They socialized with the people, presented 3 radio shows and 12 received awards.

The convention really started on Friday, Oct 19th when 49 people attended a buffet supper. On Saturday the convention started at 9:00 with 34 dealer tables including some manned by Joe Webb (Collectors Corner), Roselle Scaduto (Big Bandwagon) Chuck Seeley and Bob Davis (Buffalo Club) and Don Richardson. Pat McGee and Ted Theodore (SPERD-VAC), Ken Piletic (ORCATS) and dealers Gary Dudash, John Furman, Stu Weiss, Ron Barnett were also present as well as collectors from such states as Cal., Fla., Mich., Ohio, Missouri, Penn., Ill., and Vt. British Columbia and Ontario were also represented.

The movies shown were Here We Go Again, Pot of Gold, Duffy's Tavern, Thanks a Million, It Pays to be Ignorant and others. From 10:30 to 2:45 the workshops were successfully run including sound effects with the Bob Prescotts; acting with Bob Prescott; Shadow slide show with Anthony Tollin; Trivia Quiz with Dick Curland (Prizes were won by Gary Yoggy, David Reznick and Dom Patrissi); Script writing with Brad and Don from Seton College; equipment with Joe Webb; video tape with John Smothers; newsletter with Chuck Seeley. Raymond E Johnson then kept over 200 people glued to their chairs with a scary reading. Raymond was then presented with a special award. JOYCE JORDAN was then performed at 3:30 by 5 of the guests followed by an hour of autograph and picture taking and much informal conversation. During the day a special 1½ hour video tape, sent by Frank Bresee and prepared for the convention, was shown. Cocktail time from 5:00 to 7:00 and then dinner followed the afternoon events.

There were 228 guests for dinner with another 79 coming just for the day. This is a total of 307, 60 more than last year. Joe Webb led the evening activities. Many special guests participated in our 2 radio shows; MARK TRAIL, announced by Jackson Beck) and YOURS TRULY JOHNNY DOLLAR which starred Mandel Kramer with Don MacLoughlin as Harry. By coincidence one of the characters in YTJD was a Mr. Harding. Rosa Rio, who also received a special award, performed as well as always on the piano and Peter and Bob Prescott Jr handled the sound effects.

10 awards were then given out to the special guests. The recipient of the first Allen Rockford Memorial Award was Ken Piletic.

The guests were very gracious in granting interviews and mingling with the people. I want to thank them again for giving of their time to be with us.

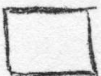
