CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS

1992

The Friends of Old-time Radio held its 17th Annual Convention from October 22nd – 24th, 1992 at the Holiday Inn – North, Newark, New Jersey. Celebrities present who received awards were: Dick Beals, Vanessa Brown, Fred Collins, Peter Cranford, Win Elliot, Herb Ellis, Don Hastings, Corinne Orr, Eleanor Phelps, Clive Rice, Anne Sargent, Hal (Harlen) Stone, Peggy Webber Other celebrities present were Arthur Anderson, George Ansbro, Harry Bartell, Warren Bryan, Fran Carlon, Lon Clark, Nancy Coleman, Bob Dryden, Ray Erlenborn, Earl George, Bob Hastings, Ed Herlihy, Raymond Edward Johnson, Ruth Last, Abby Lewis, Peg Lynch, Bill Murtough, Dick Osgood, Bill Owen, Ken Roberts, Adele Ronson, Terry Ross, Sidney Slon, Margot Stevenson, Ezra Stone, Arthur Tracy, Whit Vernon, Florence Williams, and Betty Wragge. The guests socialized with fans, participated in panels and workshops and re-created 6 radio shows.

The convention began Wednesday evening with compliment wine and cheese for the overnight guests. About 35 people attended. Thursday, many dealers opened at 9 am. There were 2 afternoon workshops: BBC Radio with Brad Ashton, Penny Fabb and Tom Monroe; Antique Radio Restoration with Durell Roth; then cocktails and dinner. Sixty-seven fans attended during the day. One hundred ninety fans and guests attended in the evening. Chris Costello, Bud Abbott, Jr. and Paddy Costello Humphreys with the help of friends including Ann Corio reminisced about

Bud Abbott and Lou Costello. Then a group of special guests reminisced informally.

Friday began at 9:00 with the opening of the dealers room. Sixty-one dealer tables were active during the convention. Two hundred fifty people attended dinner with another 98 in the afternoon. Workshops and panels included the following. Clive Rice with Jack French talked about Bobby Benson and westerns. Dave Zwengler ran a quiz show. Danny Goodwin, John Rayburn and Dick Beals looked at the world of commercials. X - 1 "Chain of Command" was re-created with Don Ramlow directing. Dick Hayes and Raymond Wood talked about Kate Smith. Jeff Muller and Jay Wild talked with several of our female guests about the role of the supporting actress. After dinner Bob Hastings and Hal Stone re-created their roles of Archie Andrews and Jughead. Then Ray Erlenborn took us into the re-creation of Dragnet with Herb Ellis, Harry Bartell and Peggy Webber. Gary Yoggy directed this episode. Then Dick Beals, Tom DeLong, Peter Cranford and Herbert G. Goldman talked about their books.

Saturday the panels and workshops included the following: Gary Yoggy with the Dragnet cast talked about Jack Webb and Dragnet. Raymond Edward Johnson presented "The Pied Piper of Hamelin." Street and Smith Detective Story Hour was re-created with Adele Ronson, Elmer Cornell (Dick Osgood), Ken Roberts and The Shadow, who later turned out to be Lon Clark. There was a contest, run by the director, Anthony Tollin, to guess the identity of The Shadow. About half the entries guessed him correctly and many winners won prizes. The Dave Warren Players presented "It Pays to Be Ignorant." Bill Murtough, engineer, reminisced. Then Tom DeLong hosted a game

and quiz show panel with Vanessa Brown, Peter Cranford and Win Elliot.

Saturday's events culminated with cocktails and buffet dinner for 317 people with another 161 coming for the day. After dinner Peg Lynch and Bob Dryden presented an episode of Ethel and Albert. Inner Sanctum was then re-created with Raymond Edward Johnson performing his original role as host. Ron Lackmann directed. Arthur Tracy sang, John Rayburn did a spoonerism,

and Awards were presented.

Besides the ones mentioned earlier, they included 2 Allen Rockford Awards presented to Max Schmid and Gary Yoggy for their outstanding efforts in keeping radio alive. Special awards were given to Ken Roberts and Peg Lynch. Both have attended our convention for several years and have always been willing to help. Also one was given to WRVO in Oswego, New York for giving us radio drama and comedy for over 20 years. Donations were given to the Veteran's Bedside Network and The Stephanie Joyce Kahn Foundation.

I again want to thank all the guests who were very gracious in granting interviews and giving of

their time to be with us.
