Ray had access to various files and listings at CBS, NBC and New York's Libraries and used this information for his projects and others. Not only did he help me, but he also was doing much research for John Dunning's revision of Tune in Yesterday. His book about American entertainers and all the radio programs they were in was almost completed. Hopefully, all his logs will eventually be available through Hello Again.

A PERSONAL NOTE: Many thanks for all the holiday wishes. Greg Jackson sent his annual personality card, this time with captions from Steve Allen and Cesar Romero. This year his Christmas seal was dated 1934, my birth year. Steve Hiss sent me a CD of the Broadway production of Crazy For You. Many thanks. HELLO AGAIN: Now in its 22nd year, Hello Again is the oldest independent newsletter dedicated to the traders and collectors of old-time radio shows. Much of the information it contains is contributed by collectors including: problems and techniques in dubbing, tape quality, what different collectors are doing and what they are looking for, updated info about new radio shows being circulated and logs related to old-time radio, deaths of radio personalities and much more. It also keeps you up to date on the annual Friends of Old-time Radio Convention. The next convention is Oct. 21 – 23, 1993 at the Holiday Inn-North, Newark, NJ.


