

Registration

All meal reservations MUST be paid in advance. If you are coming for the day only, avoid the hassle of paying at the registration desk and save \$5. Preregistration for the day only is \$15 if mailed in advance and \$20 if paid at the door for both Friday or Saturday. Remember, if you register at the door, you have to fill out a registration card. If you can't attend the dinner but wish to stay for the activities afterwards, the cost is \$15 for each night.

The cocktail hour is for dinner guests only. If you come for the day only, but wish to

stay for the cocktail hour and hors d'oeuvres, add \$10 to the cost.

PACKAGE PRICES: If you come for all 4 meals (Thursday through Sunday, cost is \$146 instead of \$159 (\$140 for seniors). If you come for Thursday through Saturday, cost is \$130 instead of \$141 (\$124 for seniors). If you come for Friday through Sunday, cost is \$112 instead of \$122 (\$106 for seniors). Make reservations, pay early and avoid lines at the registration table. Tickets are not sent when you register. They are held at the door. If you want confirmation that money has been received, please send a SASE or e-mail address. It would be easier to send me your email address anyway. I can send you updated information easier.

Rooms

Rooms must be reserved through the Holiday Inn-North phone number (1-973-589-1000. Ask to speak with Alicia and tell her you are with FOTR. You must call during business hours. Cost of the rooms is \$99.99 a day, regardless of the number of days or number of people in the room. A deposit might be required (by credit card). If you must cancel, you must do it by 6 pm of the day you are arriving. Rooms should be reserved by September 25th. If you reserve them after that, you will be taking a chance on availability. The Holiday Inn has now been totally renovated with a new wing. There is now a \$10 parking charge per car, per night for overnight guests.

Sit where you wish on Thursday and Sunday. On Friday and Saturday, tables will be numbered and will be assigned in advance. Tables sit 10 people. If you wish to reserve a full or partial table, please let me know in advance with whom you would like to sit. Make sure the people with whom you wish to sit are coming. A few people gave me a long list of people to choose from. I can't do this. All those who register at the door or who have no preference will sit where there is

room. Table reservations must be made in advance. We expect a larger attendance than usual.
