
"AND NOW..."

Happily, Ed Frost, who was unable to portray his part of Lum in last year's festivities, was able to reunite with his longtime partner Kurt Jensen (Abner) to perform as the "grand finale" float in the Big Lakes Country Festival Parade on October 7th. Although Lulu claimed no knowledge of Lum and Abner, serious fans of Hee Haw know the living link between Grandpa Jones and Lum and Abner; plus in 1968, country music singer Ferlin Husky did some Lum and Abner routines on the show.



During a casual moment, "Lum" Frost was happy to find himself being asked by a group of seven to eight young teens about his "rocketship", which is the current L&A series being run on WGGH (where new schoolteacher Professor Sloane convinces L&A to help build and man a rocket flight to Mars!). Both Ed and Kurt were encouraged to see another generation of Lum and Abner fans on the way up! And so are we...maybe they'll be the NLAS members of the future!
