



Dear Old Time Radio Collector,

It's been quite a long time since most of you heard from us. Yes, we still are in business, but on a somewhat slowed pace due to illness and other factors that are mentioned below. This flyer is basically to let you know we are still around and have a few important messages to tell you. Hopefully within two months after this mini-flyer, we'll have one of our regular flyers with articles, programs (especially some Bob & Ray that doesn't seem to be in general circulation—more than 4 hours worth to start with), plus many other goodies. First, let's start with this....

CASSETTES

BASF

As many of you may remember as of our last flyer (#7) we discontinued cassettes because brand X types jammed and just caused too much trouble for you and us. Well, here's good news... we are now starting up with cassettes, using only the best...top of the line BASF cassettes. Obviously this means that there is an increase in price (after all the best costs more—and the best usually lasts the longest). The cost is \$5.00 for the first hour and \$4.00 per hour after the first; a minimum of two hours must be ordered. See the BASF display ad and order form for more details.

For our reel to reel friends, we are also making the switch to BASF tape. This will take effect August 15. (The cassette changeover is immediate). One of our major goals in the preservation of old radio shows has been for quality. We use top quality professional products (such as Sony decks, an SAE equalizer to name a few) to give you the best sound possible—and yet one important item has been missing. That is, the tape we use to record your programs. Lately, there has been a growing interest in using better tape than good old "brand X", so we are switching exclusively to BASF (except in a few cases for those people we trade with who do not want to step up to a quality tape). All of our programs (our master reels) have been preserved on BASF and we feel this is just about the best tape around. (Again, see the display ad & order form for details). Here, too, there must be a price increase, but it's much less than you might think. The first hour is \$4.00 and every hour there after is \$3.00 with a minimum of two hours ordered. We hope you'll try at least one order on BASF tape. Once you do, you most likely won't want any other kind of tape. Thus with this addition of BASF tape, we feel we can now offer you the finest product around — from transcription disc at our end to a good sounding tape at your end.

FLYER 7A

As mentioned above, we have not have a flyer out for some time (almost a year). The last one was number 7...we are calling this mini-flyer 7A. If all goes well flyer number 8 should be out within two months. There are many reasons why there has been no flyer(s) for such a long time. The main ones have been illness (a few stays in the hospital) plus not enough hours in the day to get everything done. If you've been wondering about our MASTER LIST, please read on...

MASTER LIST

You may remember back in August, 1972, we promised a new MASTER LIST; unfortunately, it is still not ready and at the moment we have no idea when it will be. The reasons for the delay were listed in the previous item. All we can say now is that if you're still on our mailing list when it is ready, you'll automatically receive a copy of it. At the moment there are now over 5,000 programs to catalog. If there's a particular show you're interested in, drop us a card and we'll let you know if we have the show and which episodes of it.

RECORDSI

Something new has been added at Double-R-Radio. We now have acquired a limited number of 12" high quality LP records of actual broadcasts of THE LONE RANGER, THE GREEN HORNET, and FIBBER McGEE AND MOLLY. See the display ad for more details. Each LONE RANGER and GREEN HORNET album contains two episodes. THE LONE RANGER has "Gunpowder, The Army Mule" and "Banker Barton's Son". THE GREEN HORNET LP has "Hit & Run" and "A Matter Of Evidence" (these two stories are from 1948). THE LONE RANGER and GREEN HORNET LP's do not have commercials. Each of these albums cost only \$4.50 plus New York State tax.

As for FIBBER McGEE AND MOLLY...there are four separate albums; each album is complete with commercials and features one episode per record. The cost for each album is \$3.00. The stories are as follows: "Christmas" - broadcast 12/23/47 (ALBUM FM-1); "Doghouse" - broadcast 1/2/40 (ALBUM FM-2); "Picnic" - broadcast 5/16/50 (ALBUM FM-3); "Uncle" - broadcast on 11/19/40 (ALBUM FM-4). Because we have a very limited supply of these we must place a limit of one of each episode per person. Again the cost is \$3.00 plus New York State tax. (There is no limit to the number of LONE RANGER or GREEN HORNET albums you may order).

WCNY-FM/91.3

For our Central New York friends, we have some good news. WCNY-FM's program of old radio and nostalgia (via old 78 rpm records) has taken a summer vacation. For the summer months of July, August and September, I shall be hosting a program devoted exclusively to old time radio called THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY. The format generally will be as follows — a big band remote, comedy excerpts, a complete half hour radio show, plus the new episodes of "Ethel & Albert" produced by National Public Radio (this is a revival of the old series written by and starring Peg Lynch and deals with contemporary problems, in a humorous way, faced by Ethel & Albert. Albert is played by Karl Schmidt.) I extend this invitation for you to be listening and hope you enjoy the show. Comments (pro and con) to me and especially WCNY-FM would be greatly appreciated. A show of support is what determines which programs stay on the air (in radio & TV). By the way, if you'd like a free copy of the shows to be programmed each month, send me (at Double-R-Radio) a stamped-self-addressed envelope and the list will be mailed out promptly. In order to receive the list each month, you must send a stamped-self-addressed envelope. (A way to save postage...send me 2 or 3 envelopes at one time and the lists will be mailed out as soon as they are ready.)


In case you're wondering what happened to the old radio shows on WSEN-FM, read on.....

WSEN-FM

Back in September, 1972, we started a new series of old radio shows on WSEN-FM which we said all depended on two things...listener support and sponsor support. We had the former and not the latter. In order for a venture like this to succeed, both ingredients were needed. We could not get even one person interested in sponsorship. Thus, early in November, 1972, the series died, leaving only what is now on WCNY-FM (for however long they want to carry the program).

The original commercials have been omitted; otherwise the shows are complete. THE LONE RANGER adventures are "Banker Barton's Son" and "Gunpowder, the Mule". THE GREEN HORNET episodes (both from 1948) are "A Matter of Evidence" and "Hit and Run". Each album is only \$4.50. At present, there is no limit per customer or per order on these.

Each features a single complete (with original commercials) program from the excellent long-running NBC comedy-variety series. Each album plays 30 minutes (total). NBC has revived the old-time radio science-fiction series X MINUS ONE for once-a-month presentation on MONITOR on the fourth Sunday of each month. Broadcast in the 7:30 PM EDT segment, the show returned on June 24 after an absence of nearly 152 years. The first new broadcast was "There Will Come Soft Rains & Zero Hour", the famous Ray Bradbury duo, originally presented on 6/17/50 (on DIMENSION X, the forerunner of the later X MINUS ONE). and last presented as a special in 1963 on NBC EXPER-IMENT IN DRAMA (NBC's last unsuccessful attempt to bring back old-time radio). The next show to be presented is "How-2" which will be heard on July 22. In this comedy, a do-it-yourselfer builds a robot, leading to other amusing developments. The story was written by Clifford

Simak, and stars Alan Bunce, Anne Seymour, Les Damon, Joseph Bell, Jane Bunce, and Santos Ortega. Also heard is Ben Grauer. This story was first heard on 4/3/56.

NBC is to be congratulated for this attempt to bring back old-time radio drama, and we urge that you listen - and write. Write to NBC to express your apreciation, to tell them that you're out there listening, and that you'd like to hear more- more of the same, and other programs. Also write to your local NBC station, and thank them for carrying the show, and make the same comments to them as to NBC. If your local NBC station does not carry the program, write and express interest. Maybe you can get them to carry it.

BRIEF HISTORY OF X MINUS ONE Born 4/8/50 as DIMENSION X, it presented 26 new shows in its first season, which ended 9/29/50. The show returned 10/28/50 with a rerun, presented 5 more new shows and 2 more reruns before ending its second short season on 1/14/51.

The third short season began 6/3/51 and ended 9/29/51. In that final season it presented 16 shows of which 14 were new and 2 were reruns. DIMENSION X never returned. Less than 4 years later, NBC premiered X MINUS ONE which was DIMENSION X reincarnated. It ran virtually continuously until 1/9/58 when it broadcast its last program. During that long run, it presented 126 shows, of which 32 were repeats from DIMENSION X, and an additional 12 were reruns from within the X MINUS ONE series itself. Thus, without repeating even one story, NBC can choose from over 120 shows - enough for 10 years if broadcast at the rate of one per month. Science fiction writers most often featured on the show were Bradbury, Robert Sheckley, Simak, Murray Leinster, Robert Heinlein, Isaac Asimov, James E. Gunn, and Frederick Pohl. Most of the stories were published in Astounding Science Fiction &/or Galaxy magazines. Now, as then, your announcer is Fred Collins; and this is still N-B-C!
