It is needless to state that it will be very difficult to get Senate action on confirming appointments at the present time.

Officials of the Association urge your immediate action in behalf of Professor Jensen. Kindly wire your Senators, even though they have already endorsed Professor Jensen, to confirm his appointment. Due to limited time and change in the Administration in the course of the next few days it is necessary that this action be followed immediately.

Officers of the Association desire that all members of our group have wires on the Senators'deske not later than Monday, February 13. It is imperative that we act now. The hard part of the battle has been won, but there is still much to do. Act today in the interest of educational broadcasting!
