## INDIANA TATE TEACHERS COLLEGE REPORT

Dr. Clarence M. Morgan, Director of Radio Education at Indiana State Teachers College, Terre Haute, has issued his annual report on the sixth consecutive year of broadcasting by his institution over WBOW. The report actually covers a 14-months period in order to bring it into conformity with the academic year at Teachers College.

During the fourteen months covered by this review, Indiana State Teachers College presented a total of 588 broadcasts over WBOW. These broadcasts consumed 8,710 minutes of radio time and, if charge had been made by WBOW, would 'ave cost Indiana State Teachers College over @12,000. The entire time, however, was donated by WBOW to the college.
