The pupers in italics are compositions which may not be performed in any case, due to be fact the is a question involved as to copyright ownership.

"In making use of restricted humbers, however, we would ask the stations to cooperate with us in not performing these numbers a point where the value of the number becomes impaired, and we would further ask that the numbers be not used as these or allnature songs.

"With these exceptions, you are permitted to perform all numbers on the restricted list until further notice, without any special permission."
