WNYC, New York City's Own Station, will revive the DRAMAS PRESENTED AND WRITTEN BY THE "FREE COMPANY" LAST YEAR, IT HAS BEEN ANNOUNCED BY M. S. NOVIK, DIRECTOR OF THE STATION. THE PROGRAMS WILL BE BROADCAST ON FRIDAY AFTERNOONS, BEGINNING JANUARY 23RD AT 5:00 TO 5:30 P.M.

WRITTEN BY SOME OF THE OUTSTANDING NAMES IN AMERICAN LITERATURE, THE PROGRAM WAS DEVOTED TO DRAMATIZING THE BENEFITS OF DEMOCRACY. SHORTLY AFTER ITS INCEPTION OVER THE COLUMBIA BROADCASTING SYSTEM, THE PROGRAM CAME UNDER FIRE FROM THE AMERICAN LEGION. THE PROTESTS WERE WITHDRAWN, HOWEVER, WHEN IT WAS LEARNED THAT THE BROADCASTS WERE PRODUCED WITH THE SANCTION OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT.

AMONG THE WORKS TO BE PRESENTED IN THE SERIES ARE "THE STATES TALKING" BY ARCHIBALD MACLEISH, "THE MOLE ON LINCOLN'S CHEEK" BY MARC CONNELLY, "FREEDOM'S A HARD-BOUGHT THING" BY STEPHEN VINCENT BENET, AND "PEOPLE WITH LIGHT COMING OUT OF THEM" BY WILLIAM SAROYAN. ACTORS FOR THE SHOW WILL COME FROM THE LEADING BROADWAY PLAYS AND THE PROGRAMS WILL BE DIRECTED AND PRODUCED BY MITCHELL GRAYSON.

ALSO, PLANS ARE NOW UNDER WAY FOR THE THIRD WNYC AMERICAN MUSIC FESTIVAL, IT WAS ANNOUNCED. PRESENTED EACH YEAR FROM LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY, FEBRUARY 12 TO WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY, FEBRUARY 22ND, THE FESTIVAL IS A COMPREHENSIVE SURVEY OF EVERY BRANCH OF AMERICAN MUSIC FROM SWING AND FOLK SONGS TO THE WORLD PREMIERES OF NEW ORCHESTRAL WORKS BY AMERICAN COMPOSERS.
