IT WAS OUR THOUGHT THAT YOU WERE TO SUBMIT TO ME IMMEDIATELY A LIST OF ALL PARTS AND TUBES WHICH YOU NOW OR LATER WISH TO: (1) SELL; (2) TRADE; OR (3) LOAN. WE FIGURED THAT SUCH A COMPULATION MIGHT BE OF GREAT ASSISTANCE TO OTHER MEMBERS WHO ARE CAUGHT SHORTHANDED.

IF YOU COULD FURNISH ME WITH 30 COPIES OF THE LIST, IT WILL GREATLY FACILITATE HANDLING THE PROBLEM. IF NOT, SEND THE SINGLE LIST ALONG.

AGAIN MAY I MENTION THAT IT WAS DECIDED TO KEEP THIS STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL AMONG THE NAEB MEMBER STATIONS.
