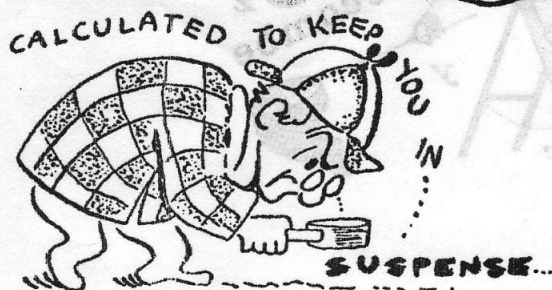

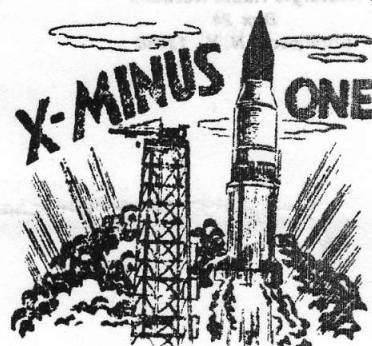

## MORE DRAMA ON THE CBS RADIO NETWORK

**GENERAL MILLS RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE**, a new weekend dramatic series to be sponsored by General Mills, Inc. and designed mainly for young people, but broad enough in scope and subject matter to entertain the entire family will begin on the CBS RADIO DRAMA NETWORK, Saturday, February 5, 1977. The announcement of the new series was made jointly by Sam Cook Digges, President, CBS Radio Division, and Fletch Waller, Jr., Vice President and Director of Marketing Services, General Mills, who described it as 'an exciting attempt to bring the theatre of the mind to youngsters.'

**THE RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE** will be produced and directed by Himan Brown, whose Peabody-Award winning CBS RADIO MYSTERY THEATRE started its fourth year this month.

**THE RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE** will be broadcast from 6:07 to 7:00 PM, ET, on both Saturdays & Sundays. (Check with your local station for the exact broadcast time). There will be 52 new programs each year and 52 repeats. (Negotiations for the show's host have not as yet been completed as this is being typed).

'We are most pleased that General Mills is demonstrating its support for quality programming,' Mr. Digges said. 'We have learned, thru the presentation of MYSTERY THEATRE, that Americans want to listen to radio drama and that stations across the country want to broadcast it. MYSTERY THEATRE proved to be the most talked about development in radio in 1974. RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE, with the backing of General Mills, will be a milestone in radio broadcasting for the whole family.'

'Radio drama is the theatre of the mind, requiring use of the imagination,' Mr. Waller said. 'The RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE will offer children a unique experience unlike any other form of theatre -- movies and television included.'

**THE RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE**, according to Brown, will present 'tales of adventure, derring-do, exploration, courage, bravery and sacrifice drawn from classic works of literature, history and life as it is lived today.'

Producer-director Brown promises the same high quality of production that MYSTERY THEATRE has shown. 'The series is sure to attract the best stars and the best writers with radio drama know-how,' he said. 'Although we hope that young people will be drawn to the series, we see it also as adult entertainment for all members of the family. We trust it will be of interest to teachers, parent-teacher associations, libraries. We will make scripts available for young people to perform themselves.'

There will be adaptations of such classics as Jules Verne's MYSTERIOUS ISLAND, H. Rider Haggard's KING SOLOMON'S MINES, Robert Louis Stevenson's KIDNAPPED, Alexander Dumas' THE MAN IN THE IRON MASK, Herman Melville's MOBY DICK, Rudyard Kipling's CAPTAINS COURAGEOUS and the legendary KING ARTHUR.

Writers who have already started work on scripts for the RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE include Brown's MYSTERY THEATRE authors -- Sam Dann, Ian Martin, Elspeth Eric, et. al. -- as well as Paul Tripp, whose 'Mr. I. Magination' television series won Peabody and Ohio State University Awards and whose 'Tubby The Tuba' record has achieved sales of over 8 million, and Emmy Award-winning Allan Sloane. (An aside...MYSTERY THEATRE is carried on 220 radio stations... let's hope as many will carry RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE).

SENIOR CITIZENS, FULL-TIME STUDENTS, and the HANDICAPPED/DISABLED may qualify for a 5¢ per month credit from the above rates if they also live within the coverage area of WCNY-FM or WRVO-FM and regularly listen to THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY &/or COMEDY'S GOLDEN MOMENTS. To take advantage of the special credit, they need only complete a few simple questions on the RENEWAL form which will be sent when it's time to renew - or on the enclosed ORDER form if this is a sample copy. We are offering FIRST CLASS service to those willing to pay the extra cost (10¢ per month) because third class mail is often delayed and sometimes lost. If it is important to you that NOSTALGIA RADIO NEWS arrive on time, we suggest FIRST CLASS. We will convert any existing third class subscription - just forward 10¢ per month for the number of months remaining in your current subscription (i.e.: 4 months would be 40¢, etc.).

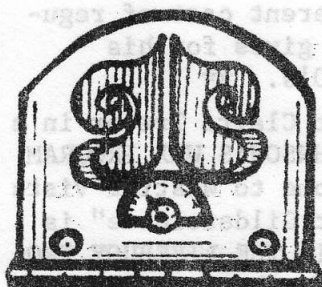

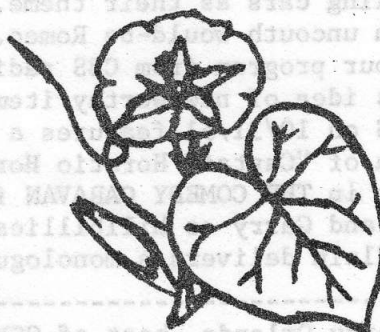

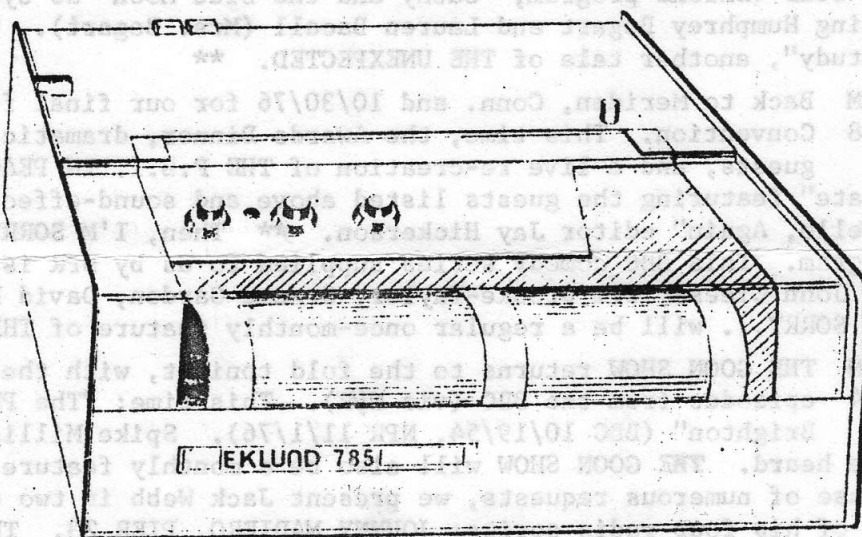
