

Beginning on the next page, you'll find a discussion of the reasons why THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY is no longer broadcast on WCNY-FM, no longer done live, and no longer produced as a volunteer effort. THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY is still heard - at least through May* - Friday at 8:05 to 10:05 pm (approximate times). Except for a few listeners in the extreme southern and eastern parts of the coverage area of our former Syracuse affiliate, all of our previous listeners should still be able to hear our broadcasts. WRVO's frequency (89.9 mhz) is half-way between WCNY-FM and WAER on most FM radios (around the "90" marking). They generally put a very good signal into most of the area where THE SOUNDS OF YESTERDAY listeners are concentrated, and beyond. If you do not find WRVO on your FM radio, or reception is poor or variable, check the back of your FM radio for two screws marked "FM Ant." (or equivalent). If you find these screws with nothing (or only a piece of metal wrapped around the power cord) attached there, you may have to attach a simple "rabbit ears" antenna of / the type often used with TV sets. The cost of such an antenna should be about \$1 to \$4. If you use an outdoor TV antenna, it may be

CABLE TV (CATV) system also providing an FM radio service, but which does not include WRVO's signal, contact them and ask that it be added. Sale of tapes You cannot sell these tapes if the programs were produced in our studios (no matter where and how the tapes were made), nor if the tapes were recorded off the air (no matter when, where, or how the shows were produced). We, not you, own these programs. Only we, not you, can sell tapes of them, or syndicate them to other stations - and we choose not to do so at this time.

We reluctantly But for our efforts, and the material derived from our collections, these programs would not have been produced, and but for our efforts, there would be no tapes in existence of our programs. We created them and they are ours to do with as we please. All shows of less than 2 hours were produced on our own equipment and supplied to you, ready for broadcast. Air-checks were used as a convenience, and, for the most part, are indistinguishable from those recorded in some other way.

Mention of NOSTALGIA RADIO NEWS on the show constitutes a commercial and is not allowable.

The publication is not a station publication, we do not receive 100% of the proceeds (or even 100% after deducting postage), nor any of the advertising revenue. DOUBLE-R-RADIO &/or NOSTALGIA RADIO NETWORK are not nonprofit entities (at least not by design and under the law).

We reluctantly WCNY-FM (or WRVO) receives \$1.50 for every one-year subscription from a listener (or someone in the coverage area who is a possible listener). Most of the balance goes for postage. DOUBLE-R-RADIO has not yet made a profit from NOSTALGIA RADIO NEWS, and does not expect to for some time to come - if ever. In fact, most years DOUBLE-R-RADIO does not make a profit from its entire operation.



GERRY ORLANDO, HOST

William Bendix stars in THE LIFE OF RILEY from NBC on April 26, 1947. Chester Riley has objected to his daughter Babs dating Simon Vanderhopper...until Simon catches Riley in a compromising situation! ** It's a happy mixture of comedy and music on THE BING CROSBY SHOW from CBS Radio on May 3, 1950. Bing Crosby welcomes guests Ella Fitzgerald and Al Jolson, and the show contains several hilarious bloopers and ad-libs by members of the cast. ** The sport of baseball is saluted on THE RED SKELTON SHOW from AFRS/NBC in 1943. In addition to Red we'll hear from regulars Ozzie Nelson and Harriet Hilliard. ** The comedy of Lily Tomlin will be spotlighted tonight.

MAY 8: THE BIRD'S EYE OPEN HOUSE finds Dinah Shore, Harry Von Zell and Groucho Marx being visited by the Spirit of Spring, as well as perfoming their version of "Henry Aldrich." The broadcast is from NBC in 1945. ** It's off to the railroad station on THE LUCKY STRIKE PROGRAM STARRING JACK BENNY from NBC on May 13, 1945. Jack and the cast are leaving for San Francisco, but not without the customary problems. ** Ann Rutheford and Arthur Lake star as Blondie and Dagwood Bumstead in BLONDIE from ABC/AFRS in 1950. Dagwood wins the Grand Prize on a lucky punchboard. but the prize brings our hero nothing but trouble. ** Young comedian Albert Brooks will be heard in a routine from 1975. ** May be partially or totally pre-empted for baseball double-header.

MAY 15: Tonight an hour-long version of THE FRED ALLEN SHOW will be presented. This broadcast from NBC on March 27, 1940 features The Mighty Allen Art Players in "Who Killed Mack Borden?" with fred as Inspector Bungle of the Homicide Squad. ** THE MEL BLANC SHOW from CBS on May 27, 1947 tells us of the time Mel and his friend Zookie were hired to paint the supermarket of Mel's future father-in-law... and weren't very successful. ** The husband and wife team of Jerry Stiller and Ann Meara will enact a sketch from 1972.

This evening's episode of THE LUCKY STRIKE PROGRAM STARRING JACK BENNY is from CBS Radio on April 19, 1953. Jack is auditioning acts to appear with him on his summer personal appearance tour, and he is confronted with some very strange characters all hoping to make their first "big break." ** THE JIMMY DURANTE SHOW features a sketch in which Jimmy, Peggy Lee and guest Victor Moore search for an inexpensive spot to go for a vacation. This show is from NBC Radio on 3/24/48 ** It's also vacation time on THE FIBRER McGEE & MOLLY SHOW from NBC/AFRS on June 20, 1944. The McGees are making plans to travel to a dude ranch, but they won't be leaving until Molly teaches Fibber not to stretch the truth. ** We'll also be listening to a short routine with George Burns and Gracie Allen from the 1950's.

MAY 29: THE BOB HOPE SHOW from NBC/AFRS in 1953 presents a story in which Bob and guest fred MacMurray travel via train to New York City to attend a friar's Roast... and what a train trip! ** The sound of wedding bells ring out on THE EDGAR BERGEN SHOW from CBS Radio in 1952. It seems that little Charlie McCarthy is getting married...to guest Marilyn Monroe! ** THE PHIL HARRIS AND ALICE FAYE SHOW gives us an example of thrifty shopping. Phil is planning a steak dinner for his buddies. but Alice insists that they must economize the food budget. The solution: Send Frankie Remley out to get a "deal" on the meat. This "deal" has to be heard to be believed. The show is from NBC Radio on October 24, 1948. ** Woody Allen delivers a monologue from the 1960's.




