

Deadline nears to declare BOD candidacy

Jan. 14 is the final day SPERDVAC members may declare their candidacy in the March Board of Directors election. The election results will be tallied at the March 11 meeting.

SPERDVAC's Board consists of seven directors. Each year, the BOD elects a president and vice president.

Election Chair, Catherine Passarelli, asks that all members wishing to become candidates send their declarations and candidate's statement (limited to 200 words) to her at 10615 Butterfield Road, Los Angeles, CA 90064. Please mark envelopes "Attention: Election Chair." All candidates' statements must be received by the Jan. 14 deadline.

Candidates are encouraged to tell a little about themselves in their statements so that members outside the Los Angeles area might be better acquainted with their activities.

BOD elec tion rules

The Election Chair will be appointed by the President, subject to approval by the Board. The Chair will see that a notice of the election is in the January issue of the SPERDVAC Radiogram. A copy of the election rules will also appear in the same issue.

Members wishing to run in the election for the Board of Directors must declare their candidacy to the Election Chair by Jan. 14, 1995.

Candidates' statements will be mailed with the ballots. The statements shall be limited to 200 words, and may be accompanied by a black and white picture not to exceed 1-1/2" x 2". Any words in excess of 200 will be cut from the statements. Statements must be submitted to the Election Chair by Jan. 14, 1995.

The Election Chair is responsible for mailing candidates' statements with the ballots. Statements will be printed in reverse alphabetical order. A candidate's name will be eliminated from the ballot if his/her membership dues are not current.

Ballots will be stamped with the SPERDVAC logo and mailed first class no later than the second Saturday in February. If the official ballot is lost or destroyed, no other ballot will be issued.

All absent voter ballots must be received by the Election Chair no later than the Friday before election day. Absentee ballots must be mailed in an envelope with the word "Ballot" clearly marked on the front. Ballots delivered in person must be taken to the location

of the annual membership meeting held in March. No ballots will be accepted after 12:15 p.m. on that day. Absentee ballots will be placed in the possession of the Election Chair and remain unopened until all ballots are to be counted. No ballots will be counted prior to the official count.

A three-person team, all noncandidates, will count the ballots. One of the team must be the Election Chair. The results, which will include the exact count of the votes for each candidate, will be announced prior to the end of the March meeting and will be published in the April newsletter.

If a tie should occur, a run-off election between or among those tied will take place at the March meeting if a quorum is present (10% of the membership whose dues are current and are eligible to vote). If a quorum is not present, the Election Chair will mail new ballots with the April newsletter. They shall be counted at the May meeting.

Ballots shall be kept in the possession of the Election Chair for a period of six months following the election, then they will be destroyed.

Any candidate wishing to campaign in any way not covered in these rules must apply to the Board of Directors prior to the second Saturday in February. Any candidate doing anything not covered by the election rules or approved by the Board of Directors may be disqualified as a candidate.









Let George do it!

These are highlights of votes and actions taken at recent SPERDVAC Board of Directors meetings:

September 17, 1994

Treasurer Chester Allen reported SPERDVAC has \$184,502 in its checking and savings accounts combined.

Approved \$350.00 for purchase of network radio broadcast transcriptions. (5-2 vote)

Selected Esther Geddes McVey as recipient of the Byron Kane Award.

Membership chair Carrolyn Rawski reported SPERDVAC now has over 1600 paid members.

Approved a \$1500 bid for a large collection of scripts.

October 8, 1994

The BOD was informed General Library reel 1501-2000 has been shipped to new librarian Richard Novak.

Video librarian Jerry Williams will prepare an order blank members may use when ordering video tapes.

Membership chair Carrolyn Rawski reported SPERDVAC gained about 30 new members following publicity by Chuck Shaden via his radio shows in Chicago.

The roof of SPERDVAC's storage facility was inspected in September and appears in good shape. Interior doors with locks have been installed.

Elections chair Catherine Passarelli reviewed election plans. Ballots will be mailed with the February 1995 *Radiogram*.

The BOD voted to donate \$1000.00 from the "Barbara Luddy Fund" to the Society of Singers. The Luddy fund was established to contribute a percentage of SPERDVAC library revenues, earmarked for use by radio veterans, to eligible organizations.
