CUE: (COLUMBIA BROADCASTING SYSTEM)

MUSIC: SMOKE RINGS

O'KEEFE: (AFTER EIGHT BARS) Gangway, neighbor...here comes the Camel Caravan brought to you by the makers of Camel Cigarettes and Prince Albert Smoking Tobacco. This is Walter O'Keefe the Broadway Hillbilly speaking and greeting you on behalf of Glen Gray and his orchestra, Annette Hanshaw...

HUSING: And Ted Husing...don't forget about me...

O'KEEFE: Oh, by the way Ted, you know there are only eleven more shopping days until Christmas?...and I went out today to buy you a present...Gee, I got black and blue walking around the five and ten cent store...and by the way Ted, I saw something for you that I almost got...but the five and ten is awfully tough on credit...And you know Ted, I am getting this Christmas spirit...Why, one of these days I'm going out and chop down my own Christmas tree...

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MUSICAL: Better hurry, Walter...only eleven more chopping days
until Christmas...

O'KEEFE: Ladies and gentlemen, there's only one way to stop this...
the Casa Loma band will now play DALLAS BLUES...

MUSIC: DALLAS BLUES (ORCHESTRA)

O'KEEFE: Well, ladies and gentlemen, tonight we carry on with our
prize winning play..."It Must Have Been Something I Et"....
the story of the hillbilly feud between the Hatfields and
the Carstairs Clan...I should explain that the Hatfield
men are a tough and hardy race, - especially Pappy Hatfield.
as a matter of fact when the curtain goes up we see
Pappy Hatfield. He is sitting on a red hot stove, and he's
trying to figure out what's burning. The mother, Mrs. Hat-
field, is out in the barn cleaning herself off -- with a
vacuum cleaner. Now the baby of the family, Zeke...who is
only thirty-five years old, and in the first grade at
school (he skipped the kindergarten)...Well, Zeke is
carrying his books out to the pig sty...He wants the pig to
help him with his home work...Y'see the pig is in the
second grade in the same school...All right, Glen, a little
atmospheric music...

MOUNTAIN".....FORTH AND FADE...



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VON ZELL:

The time, the present...the place, the Hatfield Cabin,
starring Walter O'Keefe in the role of Pappy...

BIZ:

ORCHESTRA UP AND OUT

CAST SINGS "WHEN THE BLOOM IS ON THE SAGE"

SEVEN GUN SHOTS

O'KEEFE:

That's all right, I heard you the first time...

FROST:

Hay, Pappy!....

O'KEEFE:

Spit it out, daughter....

FROST:

Somebody just shot seven bullet holes in that wall over
thar!.....

O'KEEFE:

What wall over whar?...

FROST:

Over thar!.....

O'KEEFE:

Oh...yar!....

FROST:

Yar!....

O'KEEFE:

This could go on for yars and yars....listen daughter that
ain't a wall...that's your mother...Can't ya tell the
difference between a wall and your own maw?....

FROST:

Nope...they're both falling to pieces....

O'KEEFE:

Hey mammy...you're gonna catch your death of cold if you
don't plug up all them bullet holes in your body...Well
bang my britches...you sure got a lot of 'em...

RENWICK:

Yep, Pappy...two more bullet holes in me and I'd look like
a golf course...

FROST:

She's right Pappy...Efn' she don't plug up them holes
she'll look like a piece of cheese...



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O'KEEFE: I did smell something funny around here, but I thought
it was our singing...

BIZ: CHORD ON GUITAR
CAST SING "WHEN THE BLOOM IS ON THE SAGE" TWO BARS
LOUD SNORE OVER MUSIC

VON ZELL: Hey Pappy...

O'KEEFE: Spit it out, Ezry...

VON ZELL: Zeke's been asleep there on the floor since last Friday....

O'KEEFE: Well here...throw this pitcher of water on his face....

BIZ: VERY LOUD SNORE
SLOSH OF WATER
SNORE GROWS LOUDER

FROST: That didn't work Pappy...he's still asleep...

O'KEEFE: Well, bang my britches, slap my saddle and toot my flute...
throw a pitcher of gin in his face...if that doesn't work
just throw the pitcher...

VON ZELL: O.K. Pappy...

BIZ: SPLASH
SNORE
CRASH OF GLASS

O'KEEFE: Looks like I'll have to pat him on the head with this
crow bar...

BIZ: SOUND OF CHINESE GONG

FROST: He's wakin' up Pappy...hit him again...Hanh?

BIZ: CHINESE GONG THREE TIMES

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JACK:

What time is it Pappy, Hanh?....

O'KEEFE:

It's time for Annette Hanshaw to sing "Santa Claus Is Comin' To Town"...

MUSIC:

SANTA CLAUS IS COMING TO TOWN (ANNETTE HANSHAW)

VON ZELL:

BIZ: CAST REPRISSES "I WOKE UP TOO SOON" FOR 8 BARS

JACK: Hey Pappy, ain't that young Carstairs a ridin' that horse?

O'KEEFE: Which one is Carstairs....

JACK: The one on top...

O'KEEFE: I may as well take a shot at him...this program is gittin'
too quiet...

BIZ: SHOT

O'KEEFE: Too bad he had to die so young....

BIZ: CAST SINGS "I WOKE UP TOO SOON" - 8 BARS

JACK: Hey Pappy, kin I go out in the yard and play with the pig?

RENWICK: Zeke, you bring the pig in here and we'll all play with him
(LAUGHS)... 'Cha doin' Pappy?...

O'KEEFE: I'm writing a letter to Santy Claus...

JACK: 'Cha doin' that for...the last time Santy Claus came here
you took out your shootin' iron and plugged him...(IDIOT
LAUGH)

O'KEEFE: I had to plug him...he was tryin' to bring a bar of soap
in my house...No Sir, there ain't no bar of soap gonna soil
my nut brown body...(YELL)

BIZ: HOOF BEATS

VON ZELL: Hey Pappy, here comes Elviry on horseback...

BIZ: HOOF BEATS CLOSER AND STOP

TERRIFIC KNOCK ON DOOR

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JACK: There's Elviry knockin'...

O'KEEFE: It's sounds more like the horse...Come in...

BIZ: HOOF BEATS ENTER THE ROOM

O'KEEFE: Slap my saddle...it IS the horse...or is it?...

FROST: (CRAZY LAUGH)...it's me Pappy...

O'KEEFE: Ya had me guessing daughter...Every time you come in the door it looks like the horse comin' in backwards.

FROST: Say Pappy...down the road a piece...just now...I met an ornery stranger...when I come along he pulled his head out of the haystack...chased me around the barn...and kissed me as the moon came over the mountain...

O'KEEFE: Well, what did you say to him?...

FROST: You know me Pappy...I ain't the kind to talk to strangers...

O'KEEFE: Hummm...sounds to me like a right nice feller...tell me more

FROST: That ain't all...it's been goin' on every day for seven year

VON ZELL: (INDIGNANTLY) Well, stuff my turkey...they ain't no stranger can do that to my sister...where can we find him?..

FROST: He stuck his head back in the haystack...

O'KEEFE: Oh, Ezry you can't find him now...it's just like lookin' for a noodle in a haystack...

BIZ: SOUND EFFECT OF FORD MOTOR
KNOCK ON DOOR

O'KEEFE: Who's thar?...

SONIN: Colonel McGillicuddy Carstairs...Can I come in?...

O'KEEFE: Sure, come right in...

BIZ: NOISE COMES UP - TERRIFIC SPLINTERING OF WOOD

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SORIN:

Could I parking the car in here?...

O'KEEFE:

Not in the living room, Carstairs...drive it into the kitchen...

BIZ:

MORN SPLINTERING - CRASH OF POTS AND PANS

O'KEEFE:

(HEBE DIALECT) What's new with you my frand?...

SORIN:

I'm looking for my little boy Julius C...Julius Caesar Carstairs...he sent him over here on horse back...the horse came back...but he won't talk...

O'KEEFE:

Well, Julius won't talk either...

SORIN:

Quit that stalling Pappy Hatfield...I got an itching finger here on my fowling piece...Julius not talking...the horse not talking...but you'll talking...you, you, you snake in the haystack...Where's Julius?...

O'KEEFE:

I shot him....

SORIN:

You what?...

O'KEEFE:

I shot him...

SORIN:

Well, that's all right...I just wanted to know if he was coming home to supper...

BIZ:

MOTOR STARTS - AD LIB GOOD BYES

ORCHESTRA PLAYS "COMIN ROUND THE MOUNTAIN"

O'KEEFE:

Well, ladies and gentlemen, we come to the end of another thrilling installment in the prize winning play "It Must Have Been Something I Et"...It will be continued in the near future...Meanwhile, Annette Hanshaw will sing "I've Got An Invitation To A Dance".....while I go out and play hopscotch with the cop on the corner...

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HUSING: TO BE INSERTED
