Thank you again, Ladies and Gentlemen. Here, I'd like to tell the world how pleasant it is to be visiting North Texas State College. I've heard various schools praised highly by their alumni...But 3 members of my Camel Caravan Crew have been telling me for years that North Texas State is the best, the greatest, the finest school anywhere. And they're especially proud of its outstanding Music Department. And who am I to disagree when the opinion comes from 3 of my Moonmaids...alumnae of the Gollege...June Heit, Tinker Cunningham and Mary Jo Thomas. Take a bow, girls.
