The always reliable team of Rodgers and Hammerstein gave us that one. It's from their current Broadway hit, "The King and I". And Ron Curtis of Station WFBL in Syracuse, New York, tells "Variety" his listeners have put it in the number one spot on his record show ... Calling on the good citizens of Youngstown with us is one of favorite guest stars -- Betty Clooney. Patty's going to take care of one of the biggest of the disc jockey requests. It's a tune that's been riding high for quite a while, and this week the platter brigade is calling for it in Cmaha, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Washington, Johnstown, Pa., and Worcester, Massachusetts. It's the ballad, "Too Young", and here's Betty Clooney to sing it for you.
