And there we've served up "My Truly, Truly Fair"...
the tune that tops all the other requests this

For our next tune, we're off to Massachusetts.

And to add enother geographical note...our guestthis evening, Shaye Cogan, has just returned
from Hollywood, with another picture to her
credit.

MONROE: ...This boy's become unbearable since he bought that encyclopedia. All right, Conover, what's the big request on records up there this week?

HUGH: Just a second...I'll check....

MONROE: No, not the encyclopedia, Hugh...you've got to consult "Variety". That's where you'll find the report from platter-spinner Ed Kenny, at WTAO. The tune his fans have been asking for is this ballad... "Because Of You".
