And a dandy it is, Jim. Got more tallent around here tonight than you can shake a stick at. Our regular...Rod Brasfield...

REEVES:

... along with Cousin Minnie Pearl... Chester Atkins...

GRANT:

..and Del Wood... formy Jackson... The Opry Square dancers

REEVDS:

...and our very special guest.....JIMMY SKINNER!

(A PPLAUSE)

(REEVES OVER)

Well...since next week is St. Valentines day...right now I want to introduce that comic Valentine from Hahenwald

ROD BRADFIELD !!

(APPLAUSE: & PLAYON)

(ROD)

(APPLAUSE & PLAYOFF)

REEVES:

Red certainly does have a time. Well...now it's about time we brought on our guest. He certainly is no stranger to the Opry, even if he does half from up around Ohio way. He's a disc jeckey...makes records for Mercury...and has lots of other talents. Let's make him welcome...your friend and mine...

MUSIC: CHET ATKINS... "THE PORTUGUESE WASHERW OWAN"

(A PPLAUSE)

REEVES: The very best! Chester Atkins. Well, now...it's time we heard from another Valentine...the girl who doesn't just think about marriage...she just plain W ORR IES about it...COUS IN MINNIE PEARL!!

(APPLAUSE & PLAYON)

(MINNIE)

(APPLAUSE & PLAYOFF)

REEVES: Cousin Minnie...you talk so much about so many things, I swear I don't see how you remember 'em all.

MINNIE: It is just that I got talent I guess. But there is one thing I almost forgot!

REEVES: What is it, Minnie?
