(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC:

"GOLDEN ROCKET"... HANK SNOW

(APPLAUSE)

HANK:

Thank you,, thanks just a whole lot., and welcome to the Grand Ote Opry. Grant Turner., how about leadin' off with the list of tonight's entertainers?

GRANT:

Be happy to, Hank. Cousin Minnie Pearl is on hand...along with the Jordanaires...

HANK:

... Chester Atkins...

GRANT:

... Yes... and Grandpa Jones... Tommy Jackson and all the Opry Square Dancers...

HANK:

... and of course our very special guest... JIMMY NEWMAN!!

(APPLAUSE)

(HANK OVER)

HANK:

We'll hear from Jimmy in just a little bit but right now here are the Jordanaires with a great song that's mighty popular.

Here they are...with..."TOM DOOLEY!"

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC:

"TOM DOOLEY"...JORDANAIRES

(APPLAUSE)

HANK:

The Jordanaires with a great song...Tom Dobley. Thanks a lot boys...that was great. Now...now it's time we heard from our guest...that smiling boy from down Louisiana way...Jimmy Newman!!

(APPLAUSE)

HANK:

Jimmy..., it's real great to have you here with us at the Grand Ole Opry tonight.

JIMMY:

I'm sure you know how happy I am to be here, Hank

HANK:

Aren't we all. But what's all this they tell me about you havin' a great new song that's selling like wildfire.

GRANT:

For your information, Hank...Jimmy's song is moving up in all the charts. Like somebody else I could mention right now...

It looks like Jimmy's record is a winner.

(MANK OVER)

Well, let's hope so, Jimmy...let's hope so. But right now I think the best thing for you to do is sing, it, James...so here he is...neighbors....Jimmy Newman and one of his big MGM Records..."You're Makin' a Fool Out Of Me."

(A PPLAUSE)

MUS IC:

"YOU'RE MAKIN' A FOOL OUT OF ME"... JIMMY NEWMAN

(APPLAUSE)

NEWMAN:

Hank, do you mind if I take a minute to say something?

HANK:

Speak right up, Jimmy, speak right up, Som

NEWMAN:

Well, neighbors, like all of you, I've heard different ones here on the Grand Ole Opry talk about Prince Albert Smokin' Tobacco and tell how good it was. I listened, but it didn't make much impression because I'd never really TRIED P.A. Then one clay I bought a tin of Prince Albert... loaded up my pipe and took a puff. Right then and there I knew Prince Albert and me were made for each other.

Thank you, Tommy Jackson...thank you so much. That was real country fiddlin' and square dancin'. Yes indeed.

GRANT:

Say, Hank... some of the boys were tellin' me you went squirrel huntin' the other day? Did you have any luck?

HANK:

Not with the squirrers, Grant...but that doesn't matter. While I was out wanderin' around in the woods...all by myself... I came into a little clearing alonside an old country road. And there beneath the big trees...stood a little one room country church.

MUSIC CUE:

SNEAK IN UNDERSCORE SOFTLY AS HANK GOES ON....
(HANK OVER)

The corner stone said it had been built over a hundred years ago., but there it stood, as sound and solid as if it had been built only yesterday. In a way, that little old country church is as solid and sound as the faith it represents. and I couldn't help but wonder why. Then I knew that there are many things we aren't supposed to know and understand now. They just have to be taken on faith. Later on, maybe. we'll be given the power to see and understand. Maybe it's like it says in this grand ole country hymn... so join in with me... everybody... as we sing... "Farther Along."

MUSIC:

"FARTHER ALONG"... HANK SNOW

(APPLAUSE)

HANK:

Thank you friends and neighbors...thanks just a whole lot.

Now... I want you to join me while we make welcome one of the Grand Ole Cpry's best known featured entertainers. His name is Chester Atkins...and he's gonna play...'Tiger Rag."

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC:

"TIGER RAG"... CHET ATKINS

(APPLAUSE)

(HANK OVER)

Tiger Rag by Chet Atkins...and I could just hear those tigers creepin' up on me. Thanks Chester, good buddy. Thanks a lot. Now.., it's time to welcome another of our Opry favorites... the gabby gal from Grinder's Switch...COUS IN...MINNIE...

PEARL!!

(APPLAUSE & PLAY ON)

MINNIE

(APPLAUSE & PLAY OFF)

MINNIE:

Hey, Mister Snow, did you notice my new twenty carat diamond ring? (SHOWS HIM HER FINGER)

HANK:

(LOOKING AT IT) Is it real, Minnie?

MINNIE:

If it ain't I been cheated outs two dollars and ninety eight cents. The ad in the magazine claimed it was genuine.

HANK:

Well, Minnie. I don't know about your diamond but I do know that Prince Albert Smokin' tobacco's the real McCoy! P.A.'s crimp cut...and it's always fresh. JIMMY:

It's always a pleasure to be here with you, Hank.

HANK:

Let's have another big hand for Jimmy....

(APPLAUSE)

(HANK OVER)

Now it's time we heard from another of our Grand Ole Opry regulars,, an old codger who gets mighty mad when they start tinkerin' with his clock. Here he is... Grandpa Jones... with "Daylight Savings Time!"

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC:

"DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME" ... GRAND PA JONES

(APPLAUSE)

HANK:

Thank you, Grandpa...thanks just a whole lot.

GRANT:

Say, Hank...

HANK:

What's on your mind, Grant?

GRANT:

I understand that you been makin' a new long play album for the RCA Victor people...that is really somethin! I wonder if you'd like to tell the folks about it?

HANK:

(AD LIBS BRIEFLY ABOUT HIS NEW JIMMY RODGERS ALBUM)

GRANT:

We'll be waitin' for it when it goes on sale, Hank. Now neighbors,,, here's Hank with one of the great numbers from that great album,, "Never No Mo' Blues,"

(APPLAUSE)

MUSIC:

"NEVER NO MO' BLUES"... HANK SNOW

(APPLAUSE)

(MUSIC OVER)

MUS IC:

"SUGAR IN THE GOURD"...T. JACKSON. FADE UNDER AS BG FOR:

HANK:

That means we have to go, neighbors...but it sure was nice havin' you with us here at the Grand Ole Opry. Next week.. all the country and western disc jockeys will be here in Nashville for the big WSM Disc Jockey Convention...and we'll have a whole host of stars on the show. Be listenin' then, won't you? Now...this is Hank Snow sayin' "Thanks"...and we'll see you next week at the GRAND...OLE...OPRY!!
