Cairo:

Communists propose ending fighting before agreement on armistice terms. Allies not even considering it. Another conference coming up.

Battlefront:

Wages of Chinese, in night attack, overrun allied positions, take three hills on sector near truce talk site. Rain grounds allied planes.

Washington:

Attorney Ernest Wilkinson worked years to get multi-million dollar payment for land taken from Ute Indians. Now, court of claims awards him almost three million dollars...one of largest legal fees ever.

Closedown.

Privately-cwned barber shops in communist Hungary ordered shut...to stop barbers' subversive talking.
