LUKE:

Now wait a amite. I dont git this. Ye want ME to tell ye all about why they call Thanksgivin' Thanksgivin' when ye already know all about it. Shucks, that'd jest be a waste o' time.

Pokelhontas and-

LUKE:

That's the one. O' course this here was MUCH later. Pokey...
that's what grandpop called her. Pokey...pOkey was a widder
then..like the Widder Wheedledecl..only she didnt talk so much
bein' from a different tribel O8 Injuns. AHEM. Well sir, one
day grandpop was adddin' a wing onto his log cabin...

No none. A WING. That' means a kind of extension, fer more room and jest then, who should walk by with a basket o' fish, but Pokey. you know. Pokeyhontas.
